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

Report of the Committee

presented to the ONE HUNDRED AND SEVENTY FOURTH ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

of

PLYMOUTH LAW SOCIETY to be held on the 30th November 1989

The Committee present the 174th Report of the proceedings of the Society, MEMBERSHIP

As at the 30th October 1909 there were 323 Members of the Society. The deaths during the year of Mr. J.S. Yeo a former President of the Society, of Mr. E.R. Dennis and at the early age of 42 of Mr. D.A. Bobbin are recorded with great regret.

MEETINGS

The Committee has continued to meet during the year. The most important topic throughout has been the Lord Chancellor's Green Papers and the subsequent White Paper on Legal Services: A Framework for the Future. A special meeting called on the proposals in the Green Papers was well attended and the views of members helped a sub-committee to settle the Society's response which was submitted to the Lord Chancellor's office and to the Law Society.

After years of effort by this Society a link has now been forged with L'Ordre Des Avocats au Barreau de Brest. At the end of September the President, the Vice President and the Secretary visited Brest for a weekend of discussions with members of Le Conseil de L'Ordre when a draft of a Twinning Charter and Agreement for Cooperation between the two groups of lawyers was settled. Following further discussions, during a return visit by members of the Ordre to Plymouth in October the Twinning Charter and Agreement for Cooperation were signed at a ceremony attended by members of the Society and the Ordre which was followed by a dinner given by the Lord Mayor to mark the occasion. The object of the Charter and the Agreement is to lay the groundwork for cooperation between the Society and the Ordre in future with particular reference to the changes resulting from the single European Act following 1992. It is to be hoped that the contacts now made will be strengthened by further visits in the future.

Lectures on various legal topics have continued in conjunction with Plymouth Polytechnic. The Society benefits from a share in the fees. Negotiations are presently under way concerning future payments for these courses.

PUBLIC RELATIONS AND SERVICE

The Accident Claim Scheme continues in operation and is widely and regularly used by members of the public. The advice sensions at the Citizens Advice Bureau have also continued although the venture of the Plymouth Sound Advice Centre which was set up in conjunction with Plymouth Sound has unfortunately not flourished.

SOCIAL

The Annual Dinner in October 1909 was once again the Society's main social event. It was well attended with the Lord Chancellor as the principal speaker although perhaps surprisingly he had nothing controversial to say. The revised method of ticket allocation has been continued successfully.

GENERAL


The profession continues to face fundamental changes as the result of regislation proposed in the White Paper on Legal Services. Members will be well aware of the changes proposed. It seems likely that the profession is going to have to face these changes whether it likes it or not; so it is to be hoped that the representations which have already been made and which continue to be made will ensure that the profession does not lose its professional integrity or independence. It seems likely that rights of audience will be extended but it remains to be seen what type of control is to be imposed on the exercise of those rights. The Law Society's response to, and representations on the proposed changes have, by and large been well received by the media.
