PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY AND BUSINESS REVIEW

The principal activity of the company is the publishing of The Western Gazette and local free newspapers.

The company's profit for the year after taxation amounted to £772.209 (1997/98: £531,318). The directors recommend that a dividend of £772,209 (1997/98: £410,368) be paid.

The directors expect to maintain the profitability of the company in the coming year.

AUDITORS

Following the merger of Price Waterhouse and Coopers & Lybrand on 1 July 1998, Price Waterhouse resigned as auditors and Pricewaterhouse Coopers were appointed to fill the casual vacancy by the directors. The company has passed an elective resolution under s386 CA 1985 dispensing with the obligation to re-appoint auditors at an AGM.

STATEMENT OF DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES

The directors are required by UK company law to prepare financial statements for each financial year that give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company as at the end of the financial year and of the profit or loss of the company for that period.

EQUITY SHAREHOLDERS' FUNDS

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 27 MARCH 1999

1. ULTIMATE PARENT COMPANY

The immediate parent is Western Newspapers Ltd. The ultimate parent company and controlling party is Bristol United Press plc, which itself prepares consolidated financial statements.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accounts are drawn up under the historical cost basis of accounting as modified by the revaluation of certain fixed assets and in accordance with applicable accounting standards in the United Kingdom.

Accounting Period

The 'year' refers to a period of 52 weeks ending on Saturday, 27 March 1999 (1997/98: 52 weeks to 28 March 1998).

Turnover

Turnover represents the invoiced value of sales excluding VAT, less discounts and allowances.

Tangible Fixed Assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Cost is their purchase price together with any incidental expenses of acquisition. Depreciation is charged on the straight-line method over the estimated useful economic lives of the assets so as to write off the cost less the estimated residual values as follows:-

Computers and electronic equipment	4 to 6 years
Fixtures, fittings and office equipment	4 to 6 years
Motor vehicles	6 years

Stocks

Stocks are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Deferred Taxation

Deferred taxation is provided on the liability method at current rates of Corporation Tax where there is a reasonable probability that a liability or asset will crystallise in the foreseeable future.

Pension Costs

The pension costs charged against profits in respect of the defined benefit schemes are based on an actuarial method and actuarial assumptions designed to spread the anticipated pension costs over the service lives of the employees in the funds. The contributions are determined on the advice of a qualified actuary on the basis of triennial valuations.
