Directors' Report

Activities

The principal activities of the Company continue to be those of a Professional Football League Club.

State of Affairs

The state of the Company's affairs is as set out in the accounts on pages 5 to 10. These show a net Loss for the year of £35,565 after tax [1979 £98,136—Profit].

The Directors recommend a dividend of 5%.

Information relating to the changes in fixed assets is given in note 3 to the accounts.

In the opinion of the Directors a comparison between cost and market value of Freehold and Long Leasehold I and and Buildings is of no real significance in the context of the Company's operations.

In view of the specialized nature of the Stands, Fixtures and Furniture, the Directors are unable to say whether the market value of these Fixed Assets as a whole is materially different from the book value.

Souvenirs exported by the Company from the United Kingdom during the year amounted to £7,340 [1979 £8,240].

A charitable donation of £5,000 was made to the Duke of Edinburgh Merseyside Award Scheme.

Statement by the Chairman

The Minutes of the 1979 Annual General Meeting are included on pages 11 and 12. Separate propositions will be made that these and the Chairman's Statement be taken as read.

The accounts will be dealt with as in previous years.

I am very pleased to be able to report another highly successful year, which resulted in our winning the First Division Championship for the twelfth time, and the fourth occasion in the last five years. We also had a lengthy run in the F.A. Challenge Cup Competition, which very nearly culminated in our appearing at Wembley in the final tie.

Our Central League side again won the title for the tenth time in the last twelve years, whilst our "A" and "B" teams were runners-up in their respective competitions.

Once again I must emphasise the enormous importance we place at Anfield on our management team, which has been responsible for our many years of success, and to Mr. Bob Paisley, who again won the Manager of the Year Award from Bell's Whisky, I offer heartiest congratulations for yet another magnificent season. I also wish to pay tribute to the high standards of training and performance set by Tom Saunders, our Youth Development Officer, Joe Fagan, the Assistant to the Manager, Ronnie Moran, the Chief Coach, Roy Evans, John Bennison, Tommy Smith, Reuben Bennett and Chief Scout, Geoff Twentyman – they have all performed their duties in a highly profersional manner, and our success is due in no small measure to their dedication to our cause.

The thanks of not only myself, but also the Board, Shareholders and Supporters are due to our General Secretary, Peter Robinson and his staff, for being so patient and understanding, often under very trying circumstances connected with the highly efficient administrative side of the Club.

Many of our players received honours at full International level, and to Ray Clemence, Avi Cohen, Kenny Dalglish, Steve Heighway, Alan Hansen, David Johnson, Ray Kennedy, Terry McDermott, Phil Neal, Graeme Souness and Phil Thompson. I extend sincere congratulations for their recognition, and a special word of praise to Terry McDermott for winning both the Player of the Year Award from the Football Writers' Association and the Professional Footballers' Association.

The position with regard to our properties in Kemlyn Road and Skerries Road has only changed in the past year in so far as your Board decided to appeal against the decision of the Liverpool City Council to refuse to grant us Planning Permission to extend our ground, and accordingly a Public Hearing was arranged by the Department of the Environment in Liverpool on the 3rd of June 1980, and we anticipate hearing the result during the next few months.

Our involvement with both the Duke of Edinburgh's Award Scheme on Merseyside and the Liverpool Schools' Football Association have progressed very satisfactorily during the past year, and with regard to the latter scheme over 2,000 boys took part from schools on Merseyside.

Finally, to my Board of Directors and to everyone connected with our Club, I wish to thank them for their continuing loyalty.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

1. Statement of Accounting Policies

Turnover

Turnover is stated net of Value Added Tax and comprises the income from Gate Receipts and Away Matches (including television coverage fees), Catering Sales, Programme Sales, Programme Advertising, Hire Charges, Royalties, Souvenir Sales, Sponsorship and Travel Receipts.

Stock

Stock is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Depreciation

No depreciation is provided on Freehold and Long Leasehold Land and Buildings including Freehold Dwellings. In the opinion of the Directors this is not material.

Transfer Fees

Credit is taken in the accounts only for amounts actually received during the financial year (Note 4).

3.

Clothing Stores

Expenditure on clothing and equipment is written off in the year in which it is incurred.

Close Season Expenditure

Provision is made in the accounts for work to be carried out in the close season after the end of the financial year, which, in the opinion of the Directors, is attributable to wear and tear during the playing season (Note 2 (b)).

Financial Year

The accounts are made up to the Friday immediately preceding the first Saturday in May.

The Chairman paid tribute to the work of Mr. E. A. F. Sawyer who died on 21st April, 1979 and asked the Meeting to stand in silence as a mark of respect.

Notice

The notice convening the Meeting was taken as read.

The Minutes of the 86th Annual General Meeting, having been circulated with the accounts, were taken as read, and were approved and signed.

Report of the Auditors

The Report of the Auditors on the Balance Sheet and Accounts dated 15th June, 1979, was read by Mr. J. E. Fischer, F.C.A.

Report of the Directors and Balance Sheet and Accounts

It was agreed that the Report of the Directors and the Balance Sheet and Accounts for the year ended 4th May, 1979, together with the Chairman's Statement as printed to shareholders be taken as

The Chairman invited Mr. W. D. Corkish, Chairman of the Finance Committee to present the Accounts.

Mr. Corkish said the Gate Receipts after deducting payments to visiting Clubs, the Football League and the Football Association amounted to £1,768,995, a reduction of £67,451 compared with the previous year. Because of bad weather 2 home and 2 away league games still had to be played after the year end, compared with a full programme last year. In Europe we had only played 2 games, compared with 6 games the previous year. The share of proceeds of the 1978 European Cup Final played at Wembley in May, after the end of last year's accounting period, are included in this years figures.

This year's Accounts include the proceeds of 5 F.A. Cup Games compared with last year when we lost in the 3rd Round. In the Football League Cup, we played 1 game compared with 9 the previous season. In total, the Club played 48 games compared with 60 in the previous season. 1,079,195 spectators watched 24 games at Anfield this year, an average of 44,966, compared with 1,273,247 for 29 games last year, an average of 43,905. Despite the increase of approximately 1,000 spectators for each home game this last season and a modest increase in admission prices, the margin between profit and loss was very close amounting to £71,671 or 3.49%. It is clearly imperative to continue to preserve a "tight ship" and aim for continued success on the field but the cost of success is very heavy and it must be recognised that despite the substantial cash resources shown in the Balance Sheet, there is no bottomship" and aim for continued success on the neid but the cost of success is very heavy and it must be recognised that despite the substantial cash resources shown in the Balance Sheet, there is no bottom-less purse and that the Club must follow the pattern of the past and spend every penny wisely and well.

Total Operating Expenses at £1,982,918 (96.51%) are greater this year by £156,115 (8.5%). Last year's accounts included £100,000 placed to Transfer Fees Reserve which stands at £300,000. The net cost of Transfer Fees expended this year shows an increase of £263,822 (116%).

Repairs and renewals of £130,545 compared with £264,828. Last year saw the virtual completion of work relating to the requirements of the Safety of Sports Grounds Legislation

work relating to the requirements of the Safety of Sports Grounds Legislation.

After adding bank interest of £106,034 to the net operating profit, and dealing with other relatively minor items, we finished the year with a total profit of £153,782 compared with £259,101 last year. The net taxation charge of £55,646 is explained in the notes to the accounts, and is arrived at after a credit of £97,354 which is directly related to Safety of Sports Ground Expenditure. The Club made representations to Football Authority and the Revenue as a result of which the law was amended by moving the appointed day for qualifying expenditure to an earlier date to cover expenditures incurred this procuring full tax relief on all costs incurred by us.

Grants totalling £80,000 have been received from the Football Grounds Improvement Trust and

placed to Reserve.

After providing for the dividend a balance of £97,536 is added to Retained Profits which total £467,974. The total resources of the Club now stand at £1,213,415 compared with £1,039,053 a year ago, an increase of £174,362. The Club's long term plans for ground improvements will make heavy demands upon present and future cash resources and the Board are continually looking for new resources of Revenue.

The Chairman thanked Mr. Corkish for his explanation of the accounts, formally moved the adoption of the Directors' Report and Accounts for the year ended 4th May, 1979, and it was resolved:—
"THAT the report of the Directors and the Balance Sheet and Accounts of the Company as audited

for the year ended 4th May, 1979, be and are hereby received, approved and adopted, and that a dividend of 5% as recommended by the Directors be declared and paid on the issued capital of the Company forthwith."

Election of Directors

The retiring Directors were Mr. J. W. Smith and Mr. C. J. Hill who being eligible offered themselves for re-election. Mr. S. T. Moss was co-opted to the Board since the last Annual General Meeting. Nominations had also been received for G. A. Ensor, P. Hamilton-Smith, J.P., S. Isenwater, W. B. Liddle, J.P., L. Moses, J. G. Walker and T. D. Smith, who all intimated that they did not wish to oppose the retiring Directors, and withdrew their nominations.

It was resolved:—
"THAT the three retiring Directors J. W. Smith, C. J. Hill and S. T. Moss be re-elected and that their re-appointment be made the subject of a single resolution."

Messrs. Simon Jude & West having intimated their willingness to continue in office it was resolved:—
"THAT Messrs. Simon Jude & West be re-elected auditors of the Company and that their remuneration for the accounts year be fixed by the Directors".

Mr. Paisley, O.B.E. was invited to address the Meeting by the Chairman. He stated that his part in the proceedings was to look back over the previous season and forward to the next. The quality of football last season particularly in away games was as good as any he had seen. The recovery of playing form after the disappointment of being knocked out of the European Cup, was a great credit to the players. Another problem in the season was to keep fit and in training during the six weeks of bad weather during which no matches were played. A great deal of credit was due to the training and coaching staff for keeping players fit so that the team could come back and win the football league with a record number of points.
