Statement by the Chairman

Mr. J. W. SMITH, J.P.

The minutes of the 1974 Annual General Meeting are included on pages 10 and 11, and separate propositions will be made that these and the Chairman's Statement be taken as read.

The Accounts will be dealt with as in previous years.

Last season was again a very eventful and successful one, which resulted in our finishing second in the Football League, and as a result qualifying to play in Europe for the twelfth successive year. The Board join me in congratulating Emlyn Hughes and the team on this excellent season and the honour it has brought to us, and we hope that their efforts next season will be crowned with success.

Several of our players gained international honours, and I take this opportunity of congratulating Emlyn Hughes, Ray Clemence, Kevin Keegan, John Toshack, and Steve Heighway most sincerely on their achievements.

The Central League side won the championship for the sixth time in the last seven years, and I extend to Roy Evans our sincere congratulations, not only as he is responsible for the team, but also on his appointment as one of the youngest Trainers in the Football League.

It was, as you all know, with considerable regret that we received the resignation of our Manager, Mr. W. Shankly, and no words of mine can adequately pay tribute to the service which he gave over fifteen years to our Club. The contribution which he made to football in general, and to our Club in particular, will not soon be forgotten and we all trust that he will have a happy and a long retirement.

Following Mr. Shankly's departure, the Board unanimously decided that Mr. Bob Paisley should be appointed as Team Manager and I announced their decision at last year's Annual Meeting. I have no doubt that the stability which has been in evidence for so long at Anfield will be continued by Mr. Paisley, who I believe has a great deal to offer to the Club.

I should like to congratulate our non-playing staff including Tom Saunders, our Youth Development Officer, Joe Fagan, Ronnie Moran, Chief Scout Geoff Twentyman, Reuben Bennett and John Bennison on the work they have put in during the Season.

As your Chairman I should like to pay particular tribute to Peter Robinson, our Secretary, without whose considerable knowledge of all facets of the game and unfailing kindness, my task would be so much more arduous.

The Safety of Sports Grounds Bill, which had its Second Reading last November, has resulted in our obtaining Planning Permission from the Liverpool Corporation to improve considerably the rear of Spion Kop, which when finished will complete the rebuilding of Anfield.

During the season, Mr. H. E. Roberts resigned from the Board and I should like to thank him for his years of service not only as a Director but also as the Chairman for four years. Both he and his father contributed so much to the success of our club that his presence will be greatly missed. In his place we appointed Mr. W. D. Corkish, who is an Accountant by profession and who, in your Board's opinion, will be a great asset in the years to come.

To all my fellow Directors, and especially our President, Mr. T. V. Williams, who has given so much to the Club over the years, I should like to say how greatly indebted I have been for their support during the past year.

Finally, my thanks to all our staff for their contribution throughout the Season.





1. Accountancy Policies

(a) Turnover

The income from Gate receipts, Away matches, Catering, Programmes and Hire Charges is net of Value Added Tax.

The total Value Added Tax on these receipts was £61,849 (1974 £68,098).

(b) Transfer Fees

Credit is taken in the Accounts only for amounts actually received during the financial year.

(c) Clothing Stores

Expenditure on clothing and equipment is written off in the year in which it is incurred.

(d) Close season expenditure

Provision is made in the accounts for work to be carried out in the close season, after the end of the financial year, which, in the opinion of the Directors, is attributable to wear and tear during the playing season.

(e) Depreciation

No depreciation is provided on freehold and long leasehold land.

A fixed amount of £10,000 is written off annually from the cost of Stands, fixtures and furniture.

Freehold dwelling houses have been fully depreciated.

Motor Vehicles are depreciated annually at 20 % of cost.

82nd Annual General Meeting of the Company held at The Adelphi Hotel, Liverpool on Friday, 26th July, 1974.

Present:

Notice of Meeting

The notice convening the meeting was taken as read.

The minutes of the 81st Annual General Meeting, having been circulated with the accounts, were taken as read, and were approved and signed.

Reports of the Auditors

The report of the Auditors on the Balance Sheet and Accounts dated 3rd May, 1974, were read by Mr. S. Dallow, F.C.A.

Report of the Directors and Balance Sheet and Accounts

It was agreed that the report of the Directors and the Balance Sheet and Accounts for the year ended 3rd May, 1974, together with the Chairman's statement as printed and issued to Shareholders be taken as read.

Mr. E. A. F. Sawyer, Chairman of the Finance Committee reviewed the accounts. He said that from the start of the 1973/74 season there had been a fall in attendances and this had been made worse by the lighting restricitions. The situation had been improved by the successful run in the Football Association Cup Competition, and the two semi-final games were included in the financial year, but not the Cup Final.

Gate receipts had fallen by £60,952 due to smaller attendances and because there had been four fewer home games. Receipts from away games had increase by £29,836 because of the two Cup semi-final games.

The total expenditure was £617.404 compared with £657,040 in 1972-73, but the latte figure included £156,000 which had been placed to Transfer Fees Reserve so that current expenditure had substantially increased and absorbed 88% of trading income. The excess of income over expenditure was £83,885 and after adding property income and bank and lean interest, and providing for depreciation of stands, equipment and motor cars there remained a net profit of £104,793. This was reduced by a provision of £54,000 for Corporation Tax and £600 for Dividend leaving £50,193 to be added to retained profits brought forward.

The Balance Sheet showed net assets of £785,855, the increase of £50,193 over the figure for the previous year being the amount of the net profit.

The Chairman thanked Mr. Sawyer for his comprehensive review of the Accounts and formally moved the adoption of the Directors' Report and the Accounts for the year ended 3rd May, 1974, and it was resolved:

"THAT the Report of the Directors and the Balance Sheet and Accounts of the Company as Audited for the year ended 3rd May, 1974, be and they are hereby received, approved and adopted, and that a dividend of 5% as recommended by the Directors be declared and paid on the issued Capital of the Company forthwith."

Auditors

Messrs. Simon & Company having intimated their willingness to continue in office, it was resolved:

"THAT the remuneration of the Auditors, Messrs. Simon & Company, for the current year, be fixed by the Directors."

Election of Directors

The retiring Directors offering themselves for re-election were Mr. E. A. F. Sawyer, Mr. J. W. Smith, J.P., and Mr. J. T. Cross.

Nominations had also been received for Mr. W. D. Corkish, Mr. P. R. Dutton, Mr. F. Griffiths, Mr. S. Isenwater, Mr. W. B. Liddell, J.P., Mr. S. T. Moss, Mr. G. H. Roberts, Mr. T. D. Smith and Mr. T. G. Walker, who all intimated that they did not wish to oppose the Directors retiring by rotation and withdrew their nominations. It was resolved:

"THAT the three retiring Directors Mr. E. A. F. Sawyer, Mr. J. W. Smith, J.P., and Mr. J. T. Cross, be re-elected and that their re-appointment be made the subject of a single resolution.

The question of appointing a successor had now been resolved, and this was an opportune moment to inform the shareholders that Mr. Bob Paisley would become Manager on 13th August. He referred to Mr. Paisley's long and distinguished career with the Club and wished him every success as Manager.

Mr Smith then thanked Mr. Shankly for his unique services to Liverpool Football Club and wished him long and happy years of retirement. He also announced that the Football League had agreed that a testimonial match could be held at Anfield for Mr. Shankly.

At the invitation of the Chairman, Mr. Shankly addressed the meeting. He was glad to have had the opportunity of coming to the Liverpool Football Club, and he thanked the Directors, the staff and the people of Liverpool for their support.

Vote of Thanks

A vote of thanks to the Chairman, Directors, Management, Players and Staff was proposed by Mr. Isenwater, seconded by Mr. L. Caplan and carried with acclamation.
