Fixed Assets

Information relating to the changes in fixed assets is given in note 3c to the accounts.

In the opinion of the Directors a comparison between market value and book value of Freehold and Long leasehold Land and Buildings is of no real significance in the context of the Company's operations.

In view of the specialized nature of the Stands and Furniture, the Directors are unable to say whether the market value of these Fixed Assets as a whole is materially different from the book value.

Souvenirs exported by the Company from the United Kingdom during the year amounted to £962.

For the eighth time in the last nine years our Central League side won the Championship, and our thanks go to Roy Evans and his team for yet another highly successful season.

Teams of the calibre of Liverpool could not function at the high standards which we set for ourselves without the dedication and understanding of such men as Tom Saunders, our Youth Development Officer, Joe Fagan, Ronnie Moran, John Benninson, Reuben Bennett and Chief Scout, Geoff Twentyman, and to all of them I extend my sincere congratulations for their great efforts during last season.

Peter Robinson was made our General Secretary during the year and I am greatly indebted to him for his magnificent contribution to the overall running of our Club.

We are very sorry that Kevin Keegan has left the Club and I should like to take this opportunity of thanking him for his services to us, and to wish him every success in the future.

I am pleased to report that in compliance with the Sasety of Sports Grounds Act, work will be completed by the start of next season and this should result in our obtaining a certificate from the Merseyside County Council fairly soon.

Our Directors have once again given me a great deal of support during the year, and I should like to thank them for their assistance.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

1. Statement of Accounting Policies

Turnover represents the income from Gate Receipts and Away Matches (including television coverage fees received), Catering sales, Programme sales, Programme advertising, Hire Charges, Royalties and Souvenir sales, net of Value Added Tax.

3. E

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Stock is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Depreciation

No depreciation is provided on Freehold and Long Leasehold Land. The Freehold Dwelling has been fully depreciated. Motor Vehicles are depreciated annually at 20% of cost.

A fixed amount of £10,000 per annum is written off the cost of Stands, Fixtures and Furniture.

Credit is taken in the accounts only for amounts actually received during the Financial Year. (Note 3(f))

Clathing Stores

Expenditure on clothing and equipment is written off in the year in which it is incurred.

Close Season Expenditure

Provision is made in the accounts for work to be carried out in the close season after the end of the Financial Year, which, in the opinion of the Directors, is attributable to wear and tear during the playing season. (Note (2a))

The annual accounts are made up to the Friday immediately preceding the first Saturday in May and, this year, results in an account of 53 weeks.

The Minutes of the 83rd Annual General Meeting, baving been circulated with the accounts, were taken as read, and were approved and signed.

Report of the Auditors

The report of the Auditors on the Balance Sheet and Accounts for the year ended 30th April, 1976, was read by Mr. S. Dallow, F.C.A.

Report of the Directors and Balance Sheet and Accounts

It was agreed that the report of the Directors and the Balance Sheet and Accounts for the year ended 30th April, 1976, together with the Chairman's statement as printed and issued to Shareholders be taken as read,

The Chairman invited Mr. E. A. F. Sawyer, Chairman of the Finance Committee, to present the Accounts. Mr. Sawyer said that during the year the first team had played 57 games compared with 52 in the previous year. 28 games had been played at Anfield, including 7 cup games, and 29 had been away games. Total attendances at the home games were 1,114,724, giving an average of 39,813 compared with 42,363 in the previous year, but receipts at £1,123,245 were an all time record. Payments to visiting clubs were approximately £32,000 more, at £157,177, and after allowing for these, the balance of income was £1,017,261. Expenses had increased and were equal to 94½% of income. The increase in wages was a direct result of the successful season as payments under contracts were based on success on the field, and the increase in travelling expenses was mainly due to travelling abroad. Provision had also been made for necessary remedial work to the Kop and work required to comply with the Safety of Sports Grounds Act. After providing for all expenses, the excess of income over expenditure was £58,267 compared with £47,435 in the previous year.

In the Profit and Loss Account, bank deposit interest amounted to £57,409, and after providing for depreciation the balance of profit before taxation was £105,132.

Corporation tax on the current profits, £75,400, and the proposed dividend, £600, were deducted from this profit leaving £29,132 to be added to retained profits brought forward making a total of £364,270 now carried forward. In the Balance Sheet net assets had increased by £64,132 and the substantial bank balance showed the financial strength of the Company.

The Chairman thanked Mr. Sawyer for his explanation of the Accounts and formally moved the adoption of the Directors' Report and the Accounts for the year ended 30th April, 1976, and it was resolved:

"THAT the Report of the Directors and the Balance Sheet and Accounts of the Company as Audited for the year ended 30th April, 1976, be and they are hereby received, approved and adopted, and that a dividend of 5% as recommended by the Directors be declared and paid on the issued Capital of the Company forthwith."

Auditors

Messrs. Simon Jude & West having intimated their willingness to continue in office, it was resolved: "THAT the remuneration of the Auditors, Messrs. Simon Jude & West, for the current year, be fixed by the Directors."

Election of Directors

The retiring Directors offering themselves for re-election were Mr. S. C. Reakes and Mr. J. W. Smith. Nominations had also been received for Mr. K. A. Broome, Mr. P. R. Dutton, Mr. S. Isenwater, Mr. W B. Liddell, J.P., Mr. S. T. Moss, J.P., Mr. G. H. Roberts, Mr. T. D. Smith and Mr. J. G. Walker, who all intimated that they did not wish to oppose the Directors retiring by rotation and withdrew their nominations. It was resolved:

"THAT the two retiring Directors, Mr.S. C. Reakes and Mr. J. W. Smith be re elected and that their re-appointment be made the subject of a single resolution."

Manager

Mr. Paisley was invited to address the meeting by the Chairman. Mr. Paisley reminded members that at the previous Annual General Meeting he had expressed his disappointment at not being able to bring a major trophy to them. This year, apart from a major injury to Peter Cormack, the team had not been handicapped by injury problems and had succeeded in winning the Football League Championship for the ninth time, and the U.E.F.A. Cup for the second time. It was an outstanding achievement and great credit was due to the players for their consistent efforts.

Mr. Paisley thanked the Directors for their wise counsel and encouragement and paid tribute to the non-playing staff, Joe Fagan, Ronnie Moran and Tom Saunders who in the past season had been working seven days a week. He also thanked the Secretary, Mr. Peter Robinson, and Mr. Ken Addison of the Development Association, for their excellent co-operation. The pursuit of International Honours brought many problems, and credit was due to all concerned in achieving success. The Reserve Team had again won the Championship of the Central League and Roy Evans was congratulated on this continued success. The Club's Youth Policy had continued and more than 2,000 players had been vetted by Tom Saunders and his staff in the past season.

Looking to the immediate future, Mr. Paisley said that the target next season would be the European Cup.

Vote of Thanks

A vote of thanks to the Chairman. Directors, Management, Players and Staff was proposed by Mr. Arthur Wolstenholme and carried with acclamation.
