Directors' Report

The Directors present their annual report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 30 November 2010

Principal activity

The principal activity of The Anthony Radcliffe Steamship Company, Limited ("the Company") comprises the holding of investments in subsidiary undertakings

Functional currency

The main operating currency of the Company is the United States Dollar and the financial statements have been prepared in that currency. As of November 30, 2010 the fixed exchange rate of the United States Dollar to the Great Britain Pound Sterling was 1.56 1 and the average exchange rate for the year 2010 was 1.60 1.

Result and dividend

During the year, the Company made a profit after taxation of US\$1,979 (2009 – US\$2,170)

The Company's accumulated deficit thus decreased from US\$18,893,070 to US\$18,891,091 The Directors do not recommend the payment of a dividend (2009 – US\$nil)

Financial assets and financial liabilities

Financial assets are recognised at face value less impairment. Financial habilities are recorded initially at net proceeds. Subsequently, any finance costs are charged to the profit and loss account over the term of the hability at a constant rate on the carrying amount.

Notes to the financial statements Year ended 30 November 2010

1. Accounting policies

A summary of the principal accounting policies, all of which have been applied consistently throughout the year and the preceding year, is set out below

(a) Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards. The going concern basis has been used as the Company is supported by its ultimate parent.

(b) Investments in subsidiary undertakings

Investments in subsidiary undertakings are stated at cost less impairment

(c) Consolidated accounts

Under the provisions of section 401 of the Companies Act 2006, the Company is exempt from preparing consolidated accounts as it is a wholly owned subsidiary of Stolt-Nielsen Limited

(d) Taxation

Corporation tax payable is provided on taxable profits at the current rate

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events that result in an obligation to pay more tax in the future have occurred at the balance sheet date. Timing differences are differences between the Company's taxable profits and its results as stated in the financial statements that arise from the inclusion of gains and losses in tax assessments in periods different from those in which they are recognised in the financial statements.

A deferred tax asset is regarded as recoverable and therefore is recognised only when, on the basis of all available evidence, it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted

Deferred tax is measured at the average tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which the timing differences are expected to reverse based on tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax is measured on a non-discounted basis

(e) Foreign currency

Transactions denominated in foreign currencies are recorded in US dollars at the actual exchange rates on the date of transaction. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies at the year end are reported at the rates of exchange prevailing at the year end. Any gain or loss arising from a change in exchange rates subsequent to the date of the transaction is included as an exchange gain or loss in the profit and loss account.

(f) Turnover

Turnover comprises the value of sales (excluding VAT, similar taxes and trade discounts) of goods and services in the normal course of business

(g) Related party transactions

As permitted by FRS No 8, the Company has not disclosed transactions with entities that are part of the Stolt-Nielsen Limited group (see note 14) because it is a wholly owned subsidiary of Stolt-Nielsen Limited

(h) Cash flow statement

The Company is exempt from publishing a cash flow statement in accordance with paragraph 8 of FRS No 1 (Revised 1996) as its ultimate parent company, Stolt-Nielsen Limited, has prepared publicly available consolidated accounts which include the results of the Company for the year
