## **Directors' Report**

The Directors present their annual report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 30 November 2011

#### Principal activity

The principal activity of The Anthony Radcliffe Steamship Company, Limited ("the Company") comprises the holding of investments in subsidiary undertakings

#### **Functional currency**

The main operating currency of the Company is the United States Dollar and the financial statements have been prepared in that currency. As of November 30, 2011 the fixed exchange rate of the United States Dollar to the Great Britain Pound Sterling was 1.54 1 and the average exchange rate for the year 2011 was 1.56 1.

#### Result and dividend

During the year, the Company made a loss after taxation of US\$76 (2010 - US\$1,979)

The Company's accumulated deficit thus increased from US\$18,891,091 to US\$18,891,167 The Directors do not recommend the payment of a dividend (2010 – US\$nil)

#### Financial assets and financial liabilities

Financial assets are recognised at face value less impairment. Financial liabilities are recorded initially at net proceeds. Subsequently, any finance costs are charged to the profit and loss account over the term of the liability at a constant rate on the carrying amount.

#### **Directors' indemnities**

The Company maintains liability insurance for its Directors and officers. Following shareholder approval the Company has also provided an indemnity for its Directors, which is a qualifying third party indemnity provision for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006.

# Notes to the financial statements Year ended 30 November 2011

#### 1. Accounting policies

A summary of the principal accounting policies, all of which have been applied consistently throughout the year and the preceding year, is set out below

#### (a) Basis of accounting

These financial statements are prepared on the going concern basis, under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Companies Act 2006 and applicable accounting standards in the United Kingdom. The principal accounting policies, which have been applied consistently throughout the year, are set out below.

#### (b) Investments in subsidiary undertakings

Investments in subsidiary undertakings are stated at cost less impairment.

#### (c) Consolidated financial statements

Under the provisions of section 401 of the Companies Act 2006, the Company is exempt from preparing consolidated financial statements as it is a wholly owned subsidiary of Stolt-Nielsen Limited

#### (d) Taxation

Corporation tax payable is provided on taxable profits at the current rate

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events that result in an obligation to pay more tax in the future have occurred at the balance sheet date. Timing differences are differences between the Company's taxable profits and its results as stated in the financial statements that arise from the inclusion of gains and losses in tax assessments in periods different from those in which they are recognised in the financial statements.

A deferred tax asset is regarded as recoverable and therefore is recognised only when, on the basis of all available evidence, it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted

Deferred tax is measured at the average tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which the timing differences are expected to reverse based on tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax is measured on a non-discounted basis.

#### (e) Foreign currency

Transactions denominated in foreign currencies are recorded in US dollars at the actual exchange rates on the date of transaction. Monetary assets and habilities denominated in foreign currencies at the year end are reported at the rates of exchange prevailing at the year end. Any gain or loss arising from a change in exchange rates subsequent to the date of the transaction is included as an exchange gain or loss in the profit and loss account.

#### (f) Related party transactions

As permitted by FRS No 8, the Company has not disclosed transactions with entities that are part of the Stolt-Nielsen Limited group (see note 14) because it is a wholly owned subsidiary of Stolt-Nielsen Limited

#### (g) Cash flow statement

The Company is exempt from publishing a cash flow statement in accordance with paragraph 8 of FRS No 1 (Revised 1996) as its ultimate parent company, Stolt-Nielsen Limited, has prepared publicly available consolidated financial statements which include the results of the Company for the year

#### (h) Financial instruments

The Company applies FRS 25 "Financial Instruments Presentation" in respect of its non-equity shares, which are disclosed within Creditors amounts falling due after more than one year

There is a deferred tax asset of US\$558,536 (2010 - US\$649,335), which has not been recognised, as there is insufficient evidence of future suitable taxable profits. The deferred tax asset results from timing differences on accrued interest and capital losses.

The standard rate of corporation tax in the UK changed from 28% to 26% with effect from 1 April 2011. This change was substantively enacted on 29 March 2011. Accordingly, the company's profits for this accounting period are taxed at an effective rate of 26 66%.

Further reductions to the UK corporation tax rate were enacted in the Finance Act 2011, on 19 July 2011, which included legislation reducing the main rate of corporation tax from 26% to 25% from 1 April 2012 Additionally, a number of further changes to the UK Corporation tax system were announced in the March 2012 UK Budget Statement A resolution passed by Parliament on 26 March 2012 reduced the main rate of corporation tax to 24% from 1 April 2012 Legislation to reduce the main rate of corporation tax from 24% to 23% from 1 April 2013 is expected to be included in the Finance Act 2012 A further reduction to the main rate is also proposed to reduce the rate to 22% from 1 April 2014 None of these rate reductions had been substantively enacted at the balance sheet date and, therefore, are not included in these financial statements
