Articles of Association

OF THE

LIVERPOOL COLLEGE OLD BOYS' UNION.

PRELIMINARY.

- 1. In the Memorandum of Association and in these articles, unless there be something in the subject or context inconsistent therewith,
 - "The Union" means The Liverpool College Old Boys' Union.
 - "The Committee" means the Committee of Management of The Liverpool College Old Boys' Union for the time being.
 - "General Meeting" means a General Meeting of the Union, whether annual or special.
 - "Month" means Calendar Month.
 - "In writing" means written or printed or partly written and partly printed.
 - The "Honorary Secretary" means the Honorary Secretary or Honorary Secretaries for the time being of The Union.
- 2. These articles shall be construed with reference to the provisions of the Companies Act 1862, and the Companies Act 1867, and terms used in these articles shall be taken as having the same respective meanings as they have when used in those Acts.
- 3. For the purpose of Registration the Union is declared to consist of 500 members.
- 4. The Committee may increase the number of members beyond the said number of 500, and notice of every such increase shall thereupon forthwith be given to the Registrar of Joint Stock Companies.

5. The Union shall be a body corporate established by the name and for the purposes contained in the Memorandum of Association, capable forthwith of exercising all the functions of an Incorporated Company, having perpetual succession and a common seal.

QUALIFICATION OF MEMBERS.

6. The Union shall consist of former Pupils, Governors, and past and present Masters of, and others holding an official position in connection with, the Liverpool College, or the Liverpool Collegiate Institution.

ADMISSION OF MEMBERS.

- 7. All members shall be elected in the following manner:—A candidate for election shall apply to the Honorary Secretary on a printed form to be provided for the purpose, such form to bear the signature of the candidate, and to contain such declaration on the part of the candidate as shall from time to time be prescribed by the Committee. The members of the Committee shall vote on each candidate by ballot. One Black Ball in three shall exclude. Any candidate not elected shall not be again proposed during the current year except by special permission of the Committee.
- 8. On the election of a New Member his name and such ther particulars as may be required, shall immediately be entered the Register of Members, and within seven days of his election notice thereof shall be sent to him by the Honorary Secretary, together with a copy of the Memorandum and Articles of Association, and such other Rules and Regulations of the Union as the Committee may fix a time to time direct. Until his subscription be paid he shall not be entitled to participate in the advantages of the Union. For the purpose of Article 10, the Subscription from New Members for the year in which they are elected shall be taken to become due on the day of their election.

SUBSCRIPTIONS.

9. The Annual Subscription to the Union shall be Five Shillings. Any member may compound all future subscriptions by a payment of Two Guineas.

Any member having failed to pay his subscription within one month of its becoming due, shall be reminded of his omission by the Honorary Treasurer, and, in case it is still unpaid at the expiration of three months from the date of its having become due, the Hon. Treasurer shall report the fact to the Committee, who shall take such steps as they may think fit. The omission to send any notice shall not affect the power of the Union to sue for subscriptions in arrear. No member whose subscription is unpaid on the 31st March in any year shall be entitled to vote at general meetings, or to exercise any of the usual privileges of members until his subscription and any other monies due from him to the Union have been paid; but his liability shall continue as provided in and by the Memorandum of Association.

WITHDRAWAL OF MEMBERS.

signify his intention to do so in writing to the Honorary Secretary on or before the 1st November, after which date no notice of withdrawal shall exempt a member from payment of his subscription for the ensuing year.

DISQUALIFICATION.

or summarily of any crime, and sentenced to imprisonment with hard labour without the option of a fine, or to any greater punishment and has not received a free pardon, or whose name shall be officially published as that of a bankrupt, or who shall make any composition or arrangement with his creditors, or who shall take advantage in any similar manner of the bankruptcy laws for the time being in force, shall tipso facto cease to be a member of the Union, but it shall be in the power of the Committee, after investigation, to reinstate him as a member of the Union without payment of any additional subscription for the current year.

EXPULSION.

13. If a complaint made in writing and signed by six members of the Union be lodged with the Honorary Secretary regarding the

conduct or behaviour of any member, a special meeting of the Com mittee shall be called to consider the same, and at that meeting, should the evidence be considered sufficiently serious by the majority then present, the Committee shall instruct the Honorary Secretary to send a notice to the member complained of to appear in his defence before the Committee at a meeting to be held not less than seven days later. After he has been heard and has withdrawn, or if he has refused or neglected to attend, the Committee shall decide the matter by ballot in his absence, and if in the opinion of three-fourths of those present the complaint is well-founded, and is of a serious nature, such member shall at once be expelled. Any member expelled from the Union under this Article shall be at liberty to appeal to a Special General Meeting of the Union, convened in accordance with Article 25, and the decision of such meeting shall be final. The liability of any member so expelled shall continue as provided in and by the Memorandum of Association.

14. No person who has resigned in consequence of a recommendation from the Committee, or been expelled from the Union, shall be again admitted to any meeting of the Union on any pretext whatsoever unless re-elected.

LIABILITY.

15. Any person who shall by any means cease to be a member, shall at once forfeit and lose all interest in or claim upon the Union and its property, but shall nevertheless not be freed from his liability under the Memorandum of Association, nor shall the Union be deprived of its power to sue him for any subscription or other monies which at the time of his ceasing to be a member may be due from him to the Union.

OFFICERS.

16. The following shall be the Officers of the Union: -A President, one or more Vice-Presidents, an Hon. Treasurer, an Hon. Secretary or two Hon. Secretaries, and an Officer to be called the Foreign Members' Corresponding Hon. Secretary, who shall all hold office for one year, and be elected at the Annual General Meeting, from among the members of the Union. The Foreign Members' Corresponding Hon. Secretary shall be chosen from among the members resident in Liverpool, and his especial concern shall be the interests of Members not resident in the United Kingdom.

COMMUTTEE.

17. The Committee shall consist of the Officers mentioned in the foregoing Article, fifteen ordinary members, one of the members resident at each of the Universities of Oxford, Cambridge, and Edinburgh, respectively, and not more than two of the pupils of the College for the time being.

ELECTION OF MEMBERS OF COMMITTEE.

Of the lifteen ordinary members of the Committee, five shall retire each year in order of seniority of service, or in case of simultaneous election in strictly alphabetical order, but all shall be eligible for re-election at the Annual General Meeting. Each candidate for election on the Committee shall be proposed and seconded, and every member present at the meeting shall be entitled to give one vote. In the event of an equality of votes for two or more members standing last on the poll, the casting vote of the Chairman shall decide which of them shall serve on the Committee. The Principal of the College shall, immediately after the Annual General Meeting in each year, be asked to nominate not more than two then present pupils of the College to serve on the Committee for the ensuing year, provided that if any such pupil shall leave the College his membership of the Committee shall thereupon cease, and another pupil may be forthwith nominated by the Principal in his place.

CASUAL VACANCY IN COMMITTEE.

President, or resident University member, or nominated member, is absent from four consecutive meetings, the Committee may at their option declare his office vacated, and fill up the vacancy thus caused. Any casual vacancy occuring in the number of the Officers and Committee by resignation or otherwise shall be filled up by the Committee, and the member so elected shall be subject to the same regulations as to retirement as the member whose place he was elected to fill.

POWERS OF COMMITTEE AND ITS MEETINGS.

20. The entire management of the Union shall be vested in the Committee, who, in addition to the powers and authorities by these Articles expressly conferred upon them, may exercise all such powers and do all such acts and things as may be exercised an l done by the Union and are not hereby or by statute required to be exercised or done by the Union in general meeting.

BYE-LAWS.

21. The Committee shall have power from time to time to make such bye-laws or regulations for the management of the Union as it shall think fit, and as shall be consistent with the Memorandum and Articles of Association, and in like manner from time to time to alter any bye-laws or regulations of the Union, and to decide any questions arising out of the same Provided that, in making or altering any bye laws or regulations of the Union, the Committee shall follow and give effect to any resolution in that behalf which may be passed at any general meeting of the Union, and that no bye-law shall be made under this section which shall amount to such an alteration of, or addition to the Articles as can only legally be made by a special resolution.

SUB-COMMITTEES.

22. The Committee may delegate any of their powers to Sub-Committees of two or more members of their body, as they may think The duties of any such Sub-Committee shall be such as are from time to time prescribed in the bye-laws or by the Committee. The Committee may at any time amalgamate or incorporate the duties of any Sub-Committee with those of any other Sub-Committee.

MEETINGS AND QUORUM OF COMMITTEE.

23. The Committee shall meet as often as may be requisite for the transaction of the business of the Union. They may make such regulations as they think fit as to the summoning and holding of their meetings and for the transaction of business thereat, and they may adjourn any meeting. The General Meeting may from time to time fix the quorum necessary for the transaction of business at meetings of the Committee, but until they shall otherwise determine three members of the General Committee shall form a quorum.

ANNUAL GENERAL MELTING.

24. The first General Meeting shall be held within four months of the date of registration, at which meeting the first Officers and Committee of the Union shall be elected. The Annual General Meeting shall be held at such time and place as may be fixed by the Committee. At such meeting the report of the Committee and statement of accounts for the year ending on the previous 31st December, with the report of the Auditors thereon, shall be submitted, the Officers and Committee for the ensuing year elected, and any other business transacted. At such meeting seven members shall form a quorum, and at least seven days' notice in writing of the date, time, and place of such meeting shall be given to every member in such manner as the Committee shall from time to time prescribe, but the non-receipt of such notice by any member shall not invalidate the proceedings of any General Meeting.

SPECIAL GENERAL MEETING.

Article, or to alter any old one, or to make any other proposition, or transact any business which may appear to require the sanction of a General Meeting, the Committee may call a Special General Meeting on giving seven days' previous notice thereof, specifying in the form of resolutions the subjects intended then to be submitted, and the discussion shall be confined to those subjects only. The Committee shall also call a Special General Meeting at any time on receiving a written request to that effect signed by any fifteen members under restrictions similar to the preceding. At Special General Meetings seven shall form a quourm.

CHAIRMAN.

26. At all General Meetings the Chair shall be occupied by the President, if present, in his absence by one of the Vice-Presidents, and in the absence of the President and Vice-Presidents a Chairman shall be elected from among the members present. The Chairman of a General Meeting shall in case of an equality of votes have a casting vote in addition to his own vote as a member.

EVIDENCE OF PASSING OF RESOLUTION.

27. At any General Meeting a declaration by the Chairman that any resolution has been carried, and an entry to that effect in the book of proceedings of the Union shall be sufficent evidence of the fact without proof of the number or proportion of votes recorded in favour of or against such resolution.

ADJOURNMENT.

28. The Chairman may, with the consent of any General Meeting, adjourn the same from time to time and from place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting at which the adjournment took place.

VOTES.

29. At General Meetings every member shall have one vote, and voting by proxy shall not be permitted.

POLE

30. A poll of the Union shall be taken at the written request of any 20 members upon any questions or resolutions which have been submitted to a General Meeting. Such request must be received by the Honorary Secretary within five days of the date of the General Meeting, at which such questions or resolutions were discussed. The vote of each member shall be asked for in writing on each specific resolution, and a two-thirds majority of the members voting shall be required to rescind any such resolution.

HONORARY TREASURER.

31. It shall be the duty of the Honorary Treasurer to receive subscriptions and other monies payable to the Union and give receipts, to make all payments on behalf of the Union, and to keep proper accounts. The Committee shall make regulations for the guidance of the Hon. Treasurer, and he shall act in accordance therewith. The Hon. Secretary or one of the Hon. Secretaries may also be the Hon. Treasurer.

ACCOUNTS.

32. The Committee shall cause true accounts to be kept of the monies received and expended by the Union and the matters in respect of which such receipt and expenditure take place, and of the assets, credits and liabilities of the Union.

AUDITORS.

33. Two members not being members of the Committee and one of whom shall be a Chartered Accountant, shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting to audit the accounts for the current year. It shall be the duty of the Auditors between the 31st December and the Annual General Meeting to audit the accounts and report thereon. If any casual vacancy occur in the office of Auditor the Committee shall forthwith fill up the same.

NOTICES.

34. A Notice may be served by the Union upon any member either personally, or by sending it through the post in a prepaid letter addressed to such member at his registered address, and shall be deemed to have been served at the time when the letter would have been delivered in the ordinary course of post.

ADDRESS.

35. For the purposes of the register each member shall furnish his address from time to time to the Honorary Secretary, and all notices or letters sent by post to such address shall be deemed to be duly delivered.

MEMBERS RESIDENT ABROAD.

36. In the case of members residing abroad, it shall not be necessary to give notices of general and other meetings as prescribed in these Articles.

That the Articles of Association be altered in manner following:

- (a) The word "Council" shall be substituted for the word "Committee" or the words "General Committee," and the word "Committee" shall be substituted for the words "Sub-Committee" wherever the same respectively appear in the Articles.
 - (b) The following Articles shall be substituted for Articles 17 and 18 respectively, namely:

17.—The Council shall consist of the President, Honorary Treasurer, and Honorary Secretary or Honorary Secretaries, ex-officio, twenty-seven Ordinary Members, not more than three of the pupils of the College for the time being, and not more than three Co-opted Members to be appointed as herein provided.

The Council shall have power, from time to time, to co-opt from amongst Members resident at any University of the United Kingdom not more than three Members, who may be appointed for such period, or respective periods, and subject to such conditions in all respects as the Council may determine.

18 .- Of the twenty-seven Ordinary Members of the Council, nine shall be representative of each of the three Schools of the College-the Upper, Middle, and Lower, or Commercial Schools respectively-and shall be elected solely by the votes of the Members associated with those Schools respectively. Provided that where a Member shall have been associated with more than one School he shall be deemed to be associated with that School with which he was last connected, unless he shall declare, in writing, his desire to be associated with one of the other Schools. One-third of the vine representatives of each School on the Council shall retire each year in order of teniority of service, or, in case of simultaneous election, in strictly alphabetical order, but all shall be eligible for re-election at the Annual General Meeting. Each candidate for election on the Council shall be proposed and seconded, and every Member present at the meeting shall, subject as aforesaid, be entitled to give one vote. In the event of an equality of votes for two or more Members standing last on the poll, the casting vote of the Chairman shall decide which of them shall serve on the Council. The Principal of the College shall, immediately after the Annual General Meeting in each year, be asked to nominate not more than three then present pupils of the College to serve on the Council for the ensuing year, provided that if any such pupil shall leave the College, his Membership of the Council shall thereupon cease, and another pupil may be forthwith nominated by the Principal in his place.

(c) The following clause shall be added at the end of Article 19:

Provided that in all cases in which the Council are by this Article empowered to fill up a vacancy in the Council, the new Member of the Council shall be selected and appointed solely by those Members of the Council who are representative of the same. School as the Member in whose place the appointment is being made.

That the Articles of Association be altered in manner following:-

- (a) After the last paragraph in Article 1, the following words be added, "Old Lerpoolian means a former pupil of the Upper School of the Liverpool College, formerly called the Upper School of the Liverpool Collegiate Institution."
- (b) In Article 2, the words "Companies Acts 1908 to 1917," shall be substituted for the words, "Companies Acts 1862 and the Companies Act 1867."
- (c) The following Article shall be substituted for Article 6:- "Any Old Lerpoolian and any Governor or Master of or any other person holding an official position in connection with the Liverpool College may, subject to the following regulations, become a Member of the Union."
- (d) In Article 8, the words commencing with "until his subscription be paid," down to the end of the Article, shall be deleted.
- (c) The following Article shall be substituted for Article 9, namely:-"The subscription for Membership of the Union shall be One Guinea, which shall be paid within one month after a Member's election shall have been notified to him in writing, otherwise his election shall be null and void. This shall constitute Membership for life and shall entitle the Member to receive for the fifteen years following the payment of such subscription any publications or notices issued by the Union to Members and shall further entitle the Member, if an Old Lerpoolian, to wear the Old Lerpoolian colours so long as he remains a Member of the Union. Payment of the further sum of One Guinea shall entitle any Member to receive for life any publications or notices issued by the Union to its Members."
- (f) The following Article shall be inserted after Article 9, namely, 9a; "Any person who was a Member on the 1st June, 1921, may compound for all future payments of his Subscription of 5s. per annum by payment of a subscription in accordance with Article 9, except that any person who has been a Member for ten years prior to the 1st June, 1921, may compound for all future payments by the payment of One Guinea."
- (g) In Article 10 the words "subject to Article 8" shall be deleted and after the words "all subscriptions" the words "of all those Members who do not compound under Article 9a" shall be inserted.
- (h) In Article 11, all words after the words "Honorary Secretary" shall be deleted and the following words substituted therefor, "and on receipt by the latter of such notice such Member shall cease to be a Member."
- (i) In Article 17, the word "Liverpool" shall be substituted for "Edinburgh" and the following words shall be added to the Article, namely : -" The representatives of Oxford, Cambridge and Liverpool Universities shall be elected respectively by the Members of the Union in residence at each University. Of the Committee of lifteen Ordinary Members, three shall be Old Lorpoolians who have left the College over 30 years, there who have left 20 years and not more than 30 years, three who have left 10 years and not more than 20 years, and six who have left not more than 10 years."

(i) The following Article shall be substituted for Article 25, namely :-"The above-mentioned Annual Medtings shall be called Ordinary General Meetings. All other Meetings of the Union shall be called Extraordinary General Meetings. The Committee shall call an Extraordinary General Meeting at any time on receiving a written request to that effect signed by any fifteen Members. At Extraordinary General Meetings




