#### ANNUAL REPORT

1st January to 31st December, 1974

- 1. The Council, as the Governing Body of the Clubs, have much pleasure in submitting their Annual Report and the accompanying Statement of Accounts for the year ending 31st December 1974.
- 2. The Council wish to express their deep sorrow at the death of His Royal Highness The Duke of Gloucester (Patron-in-Chief of the Clubs) which took place on the 10th June 1974. His Royal Highness became Patron-in-Chief in 1952 and always showed unfailing interest in the work of the Clubs. His many visits to the Clubs will be remembered with affection and gratitude.
- 3. The Annual General Meeting was held on the 23rd May 1974. This was followed by a Buffet Luncheon at which the principal guests were Admiral Sir David Williams, K.C.B. (Second Sea Lord) and Air Vice Marchal D. E. Hawkins, C.B.E., D.F.C. (representing the Air Member for Personnel). Their presence afforded great pleasure to those present.
  - 4. The following figures indicate the extent to which the Club has been used during the year (figures for 1973 in brackets):

Numbers accommodated 73,500 (76,245)

Meals provided 138,236 (136,989)

The numbers accommodated in the Club remained at the same level as in 1973 for the first three quarters of the year, the reduction of 2.745 being accounted for in October, November and December. This coincided with increased charges for accommodation and the I.R.A. bombing campaign that particularly affected Service Clubs. Honorary Overseas Membership increased in 1974 by 2,487 as compared with 1973.

- 5. During the period of the re-building the Club continued to operate as an uneconomic unit and the tracing deficit for the year totalled £43,391 compared with £33,351 in 1973. This amount was reduced by receipt of investment interest, other interest and rent, donations and subscriptions to the extent of £28,423 reducing the overall deficit for the year to £14,968 which was ransferred to the Balance Sheet.
- 6. Since the run down of the old Club in August 1971 the trading deficit amounts to £150,220 to date. The loss to the Club, however, over the same period was £954, the balance being made up of interest from investments, donations and subscriptions, and the profit of £76,000 from the sale of Equity Shares in 1972.
- 7. A saving of the order of £10,000 has been made by the advance purchase of carpets, curtains and linen to the amount of £39,119. These items are being held in store until required for the new Club.
- 8. The re-building of the Club in Waterloo Road is now entering the final stage. The structural work on the two tower blocks is almost completed and the building contractors are now concentrating on the Podium which consists of the reception area, administration offices, and the public rooms.
- 9. Apart from the Annual General Meeting the main event of the year was the "Topping Out" Ceremony performed by the President on 12 September. Although primerily for building workers on the site the Ceremony was also attended by members of the Council, Representative Members and Club staff, who appreciated seeing something of the new Club and the fine views of London from the top of the main block.
- 10. The resignation from the Council of Captain A. W. Hemsted, R.N., consequent upon termination of appointment is announced, and grateful acknowledgement is made of his helpful services to the Clubs during his mer suchip. A cordial welcome a extended to Captain B. K. Shattock, R.N. on his election as a member of the Council.
- 11. The members of the Council who retire under the Articles of Association are Major Sir Ralph Anstruther, Br., C.V.O., M.C., Colonel J. A. T. Barstow, D.S.O., T.D., Sir Rex Cohen, K.B.E., Sir Arthur Drew, K.C.B., J.P., Colonel B. M. F. Franks, D.S.O., M.C., T.D., and the Hon, Lady Fitzalan Howard, all of whom being eligible, offer themselves for re-election.
- 12. The Council wish once again to express their thanks to the members of the General Committee for the assistance given them in the administration of the Clubs, and also to the larger body of Representative Members whose liaisen between members and management continues to be as valuable as ever.
  - The following additional information is furnished in accordance with the Companies Act 1748 and 1967:—

     (i) The principal activity, necessarily confined to the Union Jack Club for the present, continues to be the provision of all the facilities of a residential Club in London for the welfare of the Services below commissioned rank.
     (ii) The members of the Council receive no remuneration for their services to the Clubs.
     (iii) The average number of employees of the Clubs during the year was 68, and their gross remuneration amounted to £111,684.
- 14. The auditors, Mesers, Gerrard van de Linde & Son, have expressed their willingness to continue in office for the ensuing

### NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

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Note 1. Depreciation is provided in respect of Furniture and Fittings at 5% on reducing balence. The cost of renewals of Sundry Equipment are charged direct to the Provision for Repairs and Renewals. No Depreciation is provided in respect of Freehold Land and Buildings.

Note 2. Provision for repairs and maintenance of Buildings, Furniture, etc. and the renewal of Sundry Equipment and some Furniture is made by annual transfers from Income and Expenditure Account. The actual expenditure thereon is charged against this provision. The unexpended balance in respect of provision for renewal of Sundry Equipment and Furniture is estimated at approximately £3,000.

Note 3. The Club's premises at Waterloo Road are in the course of redevelopment and there are estimated outstanding capital commitments payable by the Club amounting to £130,000. Under the terms of a Development Lease the Club will grant a further lease of part of the property to Industrial and Commercial Finance Corporation on completion of the development.
