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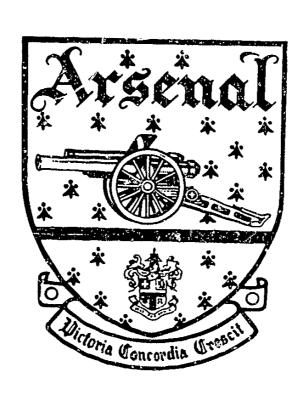

## REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS

The Directors have pleasure in submitting their Annual Report to the Members, together with the audited Accounts for the year ended 31st May 1981.

In March we learned with great sadness of the death of our colleague and great friend, Bob Wall. Bob joined the Club in 1928 and later became Box Office Manager, Assistant Secretary, Secretary, General Manager and finally a Director upon his retirement in 1977. His tremendous service to Arsenal over half a century was immense and he will be sadly missed by all.

You will observe from the Notice of the Meeting that the venue for this year's meeting has been changed. In view of the ever increasing numbers now attending these meetings we are unable to find suitable facilities within the Stadium to accommodate such large numbers and therefore we have decided to take advantage of the larger facilities available at Winchester House.

We are delighted to be competing once more in the UEFA Cup having finished in third position in the League Championship. It was not to be the year for our fourth consecutive visit to Wembley and we were disappointed that we were eliminated in the early rounds of both of the Cup Competitions.

The close Season has seen much activity and we were sad to lose a player of Frank Stapleton's class to Manchester United. Under existing legislation a player is free to move to another Club of his choice at the end of his Contract. In the event that Clubs cannot mutually agree a fee, as was indeed the situation, then the Football League Appeals Committee determine the amount of compensation to be paid. The amount we eventually received was far less than our own valuation but whilst current legislation prevails we are left with little alternative.

During the year Mr Clive Carr and Mr Richard Carr were invited to join the board. They are the grandsons of the late Sir Bracewell Smith, previous Chairman of the Club, and are young men with considerable business experience. We are confident that they will prove to be a great asset to the Club in coming years.

The Companies Act 1980 requires all Companies which according to the Companies Act 1948 are Public Companies to take a decision before March 1982 concerning their future status under that Act. It is the view of the Board that we do not comply with the requirements of a Public Company and accordingly application has been made to the Registrar of Companies that the Company be re-registered as a Private Company. We are advised that the position of existing members will not be affected detrimentally by this action.

Now to the accounts. Gate receipts fell this year by £523,897. However last years figures included very considerable sums from our long run in the FA Cup, culminating in the Final at Wembley, 7 matches in the Football League Cup and of crise our success in reaching the Final of the European Cup Winners Cup in Brussels. Our average League attendance was 32,480 compared with 33,596 in the previous year. The continued overall pattern of decreasing attendances is worrying, but hopefully greater team success will reverse this national trend.

Income from Broadcasting and Television was considerably less than in the previous year almost entirely due to the television fees from the Cup Finals in 1980.

Ground Advertisements and other activities showed a very slight increase. You will be aware that for the first time in the Club's history we have entered into a sponsorship arrangement with JVC (UK) Ltd, the Victor Company of Japan. Our agreement initially covers the next three years and we are delighted to be associated with such an internationally famous Company. It is our intention to utilise some of the money we shall receive from JVC to make into a reality our long-held plans for converting our Indoor Hall into a fully equipped 'Indoor Training Centre' that will be a focus for youth football throughout a large part of North London. This will bring considerable benefit not only to us, but to the community as a whole.

The major increase in expenditure has been an excess of transfer fees paid over those received of £787,203. During the year we acquired Clive Allen, later to move to Crystal Palace, Kenny Sansom, Peter Nicholas and

George Wood. Liam Brady, Pat Rice, Paul Barron, David Price and Steve Walford all joined other Clubs and we would like to place on record our sincere appreciation and of course, our good wishes to them with their new Clubs.

During the close Season the area previously known as the Arsenal West Enclosure was completely refurbished and virtually rebuilt. It is now a fully operational Executive Suite and we are pleased that its popularity has been such that all seats were very quickly sold and we now have a waiting list. Although this involved a substantial capital commitment, the immediate increase in our income has totally justified this decision.

Apart from transfer fees, overall expenditure has slightly decreased mainly because of the virtual completion in 1979-80 of works necessary to comply with the Safety of Sports Grounds Act.

The net result therefore is an Excess of Expenditure over Income of £488,341 and after taxation, the reduction to unappropriated profit amounts to £356,341. Your Directors do not recommend the payment of a dividend.

Under the provisions of Article 94 of the Articles of Association, Mr Richard Carr and Mr Clive Carr retire from the Board and, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election.

In accordance with the provisions of Article 90 of the Articles of Association Mr R. Gibbs, Mr D Hill-Wood and Sir Robert Bellinger retire by rotation and being eligible offer themselves for re-election.

The Auditors Messrs Hope, Agar and Co have expressed their willingness to continue in Office.

Depreciation on all Fixed Assets other than Freehold Properties is calculated to write off cost during their expected normal lives by annual instalments at rates ranging from 10 per cent. to 25 per cent. No Depreciation has been provided in the year under review on Freehold Properties.
