Notes.—(I) A member of the Company who is entitled to attend and vote may appoint a proxy to attend and vote instead of him and a proxy need not be a member of the Company.

(2) Article 126 of the Articles of Association of the Company reads:-

"126. A shareholder may have issued to him a season ticket or tickets subject to a deduction of 5 per cent. from the amount charged to non-shareholders. Tickets so issued must not be sold and the privilege granted under this clause shall be restricted to such holder and in case of transference or death to such member of his family as shall become the registered holder of the shares. The privilege cannot be sold or granted to any other transferee.

#### REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS

The Directors have pleasure in submitting their Sixty-fifth Annual Report to the Members together with the audited Accounts for the year ended 31st May, 1975.

We are happy to report that in January, 1975, Mr. Anthony Wood accepted our invitation to join the Board and we feel certain that his past experience in the Sporting World will be a valuable asset.

Our First team results were disappointing in comparison with earlier seasons and in finithing at the wrong end of the League table, the desire to regain our position at the top has only been strengthened. As we said last year many young players have been introduced into our sides and I am sure you will agree that there are now several fine prospects among our staff awaiting their opportunity to prove their undoubted ability.

The Reserve team playing in the 1st Division of the Football Combination finished in 5th position, having gained 50 points out of 40 games.

The South East Counties League side finished in 3rd position with 39 points from 30 games, the same as Tottenham who overtook us on goal average. Both the Reserve team and the South East Counties League side are composed mainly of youngsters and we are happy to see that our youth policy appears once again to be bearing fruit.

Further details of these records can be found elsewhere in this Report.

Turning to the Accounts, it will be seen that net gate receipts were increased by £21,029 due to an increase in our admission charges since the average attendance showed a decrease on the previous season For the first time we decided to depart from our policy of not advertising within the Stadium and the results of this are reflected in the Profits from Programmes, Handbooks and Ground Advertising which as you can see have increased by £30,615. Considering the severe economic difficulties which companies are experiencing we do feel that this has proved to be an extremely useful contribution to the Club's revenue.

Total expenditure for the year increased by £17,731 and considering the continuance of inflation we are satisfied that our costs have been contained at a reasonable overall level.

The net result of the above is an excess of Income over Expenditure of £1,053, which includes an excess of players' transfer fees received over fees paid of £46,774.

After provision for Corporation Tax the addition to unappropriated profit amounts to £803. Your Board do not recommend the payment of a dividend.

Under the provision of Article 94 of the Articles of Association Mr. A. Wood retires from the Board and, being eligible, offers himself for re-election.

In accordance with the provisions of Article 90 of the Articles of Association Sir Robert Bellinger and Mr. S. C. McIntyre retire by rotation and, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election.

The Auditors, Messrs. Hope Agar & Co., have agreed to continue their appointment for the current year.
