

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Introduction

1. Introduction

1.1 We, I Best, A Lovett and S Allport were appointed Joint Administrative Receivers of Springwood Plc and Springwood Leisure Limited ("Springwood") on 9 February 2004 by Lloyds TSB Bank plc ("Lloyds") under the powers contained in debentures dated 20 July 2001 and on 19 February 2004 by First Leisure Trading Limited ("First Leisure") under the powers contained in debentures dated 12 August 2002. I Best, A Lovett and S Allport were also appointed Administrators of Kingfisher Leisure Limited ("KL") on 19 February 2004 (together "the Companies" or "the Group").

Statutory and Historical Information

Historical Information

- 2.6 The Group parent company, Springwood Plc, is an AIM listed nightclub operator. At the date of appointment there were 31 nightclubs owned by the Group of which 24 were trading.
- 2.7 The Group's head office is located in Anstey and it employed approximately 966 employees at the date of appointment. The Group structure is attached as Appendix 1.
- 2.8 PLC holds the head office freehold property and the Wigan leasehold property. SL holds a number of leasehold properties including the core "Zanzibar" branded units, together with properties acquired from First Leisure Trading Limited in August 2002. KL holds properties acquired from Kingfisher Plc in August 2001 predominantly trading under the McClusky's brand.
- 2.9 I Best, S Allport and A Lovett were appointed Joint Administrators of KL on 9 February 2004. This appointment was followed by a further confirmatory appointment on 24 February 2004.

- 3.2 Nightclub operators have experienced increased competition over the last 18 months and this has severely impacted the Group's profitability. In December 2003 the Group announced a £46 million write-down of its property portfolio.
- 3.3 In August 2002, the parent company acquired seven sites from First Leisure for deferred consideration of £3.5 million. The parent company had paid £400,000 on account and the final payment of £3.1 million was due to be paid on 11 February 2004.
- 3.4 The Group's Directors had been negotiating with both First Leisure and a number of its landlords to reschedule or reduce certain financial commitments as part of a refinancing of the Group.
- 3.5 During January 2003, the Group's short term cash flow forecast indicated that the Group would breach its banking facilities during the second week in February.
- 3.6 A winding up petition was issued against SL on 3 February 2004. The Directors obtained a validation order which allowed trading to continue whilst negotiations with key creditors were concluded.
- 3.7 The Directors' attempts to restructure the business and secure additional funding for the Group were ultimately unsuccessful. Consequently, the Directors concluded that they should take professional advice regarding the future viability of the Companies.
- 3.8 On 9 February 2004, the Directors requested the appointment of I Best, A Lovett and S Allport as Joint Administrative Receivers of PLC and SL. I Best, A Lovett and S Allport were also appointed as Joint Administrators of KL on 9 February 2004.

Conduct of the Receivership

- 4.1 The appointments were accepted by I Best, S Allport and A Lovett at 1.50pm on 9 February 2004. The Receivers' staff attended the head office and all trading premises on 9 February 2004 to take control of the business.
- 4.2 The decision was taken to enable the Company to continue to trade for a limited period in order to retain customer goodwill and to provide an opportunity to seek to sell its business and assets as a going concern.
- 4.3 Immediately following our appointment, we spoke to all major suppliers and received strong support for our decision to trade the business whilst a going concern sale was being sought.
- 4.4 Upon our appointment, a review of the trading activities highlighted that three of the units were uneconomic to trade and as a result on 11 February 2004 the clubs at Plymouth, Bristol and Kidderminster were closed with the loss of 95 jobs.
- 4.5 An advertisement was placed in the Financial Times on 13 February 2004. In response to the advert, 17 parties registered an interest in the business as a whole and 58 parties registered interest in individual units. These interested parties were sent a brief information memorandum following suitable confidentiality undertakings and certain parties are likely to be given supervised access to a data room, so that they can formulate their final offers.
- 4.6 The deadline for indicative offers was 25 February 2004. At the date of writing these offers are still being reviewed.

Section 5

Amounts due to Secured Creditors

5.1 The amounts due to secured creditors are estimated as follows:-

5.2 Lloyds TSB's charge was executed on 20 July 2001 and First Leisure's was executed on 12 August 2002.

Preferential Creditors

6.1 There are no preferential creditors in PLC, however, preferential creditors in SL at the date of appointment are estimated at £70,000 in respect of holiday pay only. We envisage that these creditors will be paid in full.

Section 7

Non-Preferential Creditors

7.1 Given the substantial shortfall to secured creditors, we do not anticipate that there will be sufficient funds available from the realisation of assets to enable any distribution to non-preferential creditors in either of the Companies.

Section 8

Statement of Affairs

8.1 The Directors at the date of writing this report have not submitted their Statement of Affairs. The Directors legally have 21 days to complete these forms. Upon receipt of these forms we will distribute to the Creditors upon request or at the Section 48 meeting if available.

Section 9

Receipts and Payments

9.1 The Joint Administrative Receivers' Consolidated Abstracts of Receipts and Payments Accounts for the period from appointment to 22 February 2004 are attached as Appendix 3.

Section 10

Meeting of Creditors

10.1 A meeting of creditors will be held at the Tower Ballroom, Reservoir Road, Edgbaston, Birmingham at 12 pm on Wednesday 24 March 2004 to receive our report on the conduct of the receiverships. Directions to the Tower Ballroom are attached as Appendix 4. This report will be presented at the meeting and no further information is expected to be available.



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
