The Company is limited by guarantee and has no share capital. The principal activities of the Company consist of (1) the holding of investments and the application of income therefrom for the benefit of the General Assembly of Unitarian and Free Christian Churches and (2) acting as trustee of funds for religious purposes. The total incoming resources of the Company for the year, particulars of which are shown in the Statement of Financial Activities, amounted to £86,295, (£83,295 investment income and interest and £3,000 capital introduced to designated funds). After satisfaction of the amounts due to the subsidiary funds charging expenses, the net balance payable to the General Assembly of Unitarian and Free Christian Churches was £12,053. The realised gains on the sale of investments was £75,243 and the unrealised gains were £11,399.

#### 1. Annual Meeting

The 89th Ordinary Meeting of the Association was held on 5 February 2003 at Essex Hall, London. The annual report and accounts were adopted and the Officers and Executive Committee members were elected.

#### 2. Register of Members

The Register of Members declined by three, to become 44 names, due to the resignations of Dr Sheila Crosskey and Alexander Ellis and the death of Trevor Watkins. No new members were elected.

#### 3. Executive Committee

The honorary officers and committee members were re-elected.

#### 4. Finance

There were no legacies during the year. Incoming resources fell by 4.5% mostly due to the transfers of capital from designated funds back to managing trustees. £11,802 capital was transferred back to the Managing Trustees of the Crediton Fund and the Hen Dy Cwrdd Chapel Trust, thus completing the transfer project started three years ago.

The cost of portfolio management further reduced from £10,221 to £7,329 due to the decreased value of the funds invested and a decision to make fundamental changes to the investment portfolio. Following extensive meetings with Newton Investment Management, it was decided to sell the forty-one individual equity holdings, increase the proportion of fixed interest investments from 28% to 46% and use the remaining 54% to purchase three large equity investments in unit trusts. This action was phased over several months and resulted in the considerable realised gain of £75,243.

Our Fund Managers are under instruction to pursue an ethical policy avoiding investments in companies with significant involvement in armaments, alcohol, tobacco and gambling.

The Reserves Policy was updated and now reads: The Association needs reserves to ensure the continuity of the long-term functioning of the Charity. The Association does not have any current source of income other than the occasional legacy. The Association relies upon the income generated by its unexpended reserves to undertake its service of custodian trusteeship to Unitarian and Free Christian Churches and to administer various small trusts for the benefit of the Unitarian movement within the United Kingdom and at certain overseas locations. The Association donates its annual surplus to the General Assembly of Unitarian and Free Christian Churches, a course permitted by its Memorandum and Articles of Association.

The range of reserves needed to maintain the continuity of function of the Charity at present levels of activity is capital sufficient to generate income equivalent to between one and two years expenditure. The present level of reserves is deemed to be sufficient. The Managing Trustees plan to conserve the present level of reserves by ensuring that the investments are well managed and the expenditures are carefully controlled.

The level of reserves and the policy itself will be reviewed at succeeding Ordinary General Meetings held annually in February.

#### 5. Auditors

Messrs Edmund Gibbs of Oxford were re-appointed the Association's auditors during the year and a resolution for their re-appointment for the forthcoming year will be proposed at the ordinary general meeting in February 2004.

#### 6. Business Transacted

The Secretary and Deputy Secretary have continued to deal with trusteeship, finance and legal issues.

#### 7. Designated Funds

Grants were made from the Lawrence House Fund in respect of the General Assembly of Unitarian and Free Christian Churches and its Religious Education and Youth Department, and to young people attending the General Assembly's Annual Meetings and the International Religious Fellowship.

Benevolent grants were made to selected ministers from the Bicentenary Fund and the Bickerton Fund. No grants were made from the Wood Trust due to an overspend last year. One educational grant was made from the Wood Enfield Dowson and the Harwood Fund.

Other income was disbursed appropriately in accordance with the relevant schemes or on the authority of the Executive Committee.

#### 8. McQuaker Fund

The Fund's net income was paid to the Scottish Unitarian Association for disposal at its discretion.

### 9. Executive Committee's responsibilities for preparing the Accounts.

The executive committee is obliged under company law to prepare accounts for each financial year.

The accounts of which the form and content is prescribed by the Companies Act 1985 must give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Association at the end of the financial year, and of the surplus for the year. The executive committee is also responsible for the adoption of suitable accounting policies, and their consistent use in the accounts, supported where necessary by reasonable and prudent judgment. The committee has ensured that the accounts have been maintained and presented to the requirements of the Charity Commissioners current Statement of Recommended Practice for accounting by charities (SORP). The committee has taken note of the revised standards contained in SORP 2000. The executive committee confirms that the above requirements have been complied with in the accounts.

In addition, the executive committee is responsible for maintaining adequate accounting records and sufficient internal controls to safeguard the assets of the Association and to prevent and detect fraud or any other irregularities.

### INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT TO THE MEMEBERS OF THE BRITISH AND FOREIGN UNITARIAN ASSOCIATION INCORPORATED

We have audited the financial statements of the British and Foreign Unitarian Association for the year ended 30 September 2003, which comprise the Statement of Financial Activities, Summary Income and Expenditure account, the Balance Sheet and related notes. These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention as modified by the revaluation of certain fixed assets and the accounting policies set out therein.

This report is made solely to the British and Foreign Unitarian Association members, as a body, in accordance with Section 235 of the Companies Act 1985. Our audit has been undertaken so that we might state to the charity's members those matters we are required to state to them in an auditor's report and for no other purpose. To the fullest extent permitted by law, we do not accept or assume responsibility to anyone other than the charity and the charity's members as a body, for our audit work, for this report, or for the opinions we have formed.

#### Respective Responsibilities of Trustees and Auditors

The trustees' (who are also the directors of the British and Foreign Unitarian Association for the purposes of company law), responsibilities for preparing the Trustees' Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards are set out in the Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities.

Our responsibility is to audit the financial statements in accordance with relevant legal and regulatory requirements and United Kingdom Auditing Standards.

We report to you our opinion as to whether the financial statements give a true and fair view and are properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985. We also report to you if, in our opinion, the Trustees' Annual Report is not consistent with the financial statements, if the charity has not kept proper accounting records, if we have not received all the information and explanations we require for our audit, or if information specified by law regarding trustees' remuneration and transactions with the charity is not disclosed.

We read other information contained in the Executive Committee's Annual Report, and consider whether it is consistent with the audited financial statements. We consider the implications for our report if we become aware of any apparent misstatements or material inconsistencies with the financial statements. Our responsibilities do not extend to any other information.

#### Basis of Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with United Kingdom Auditing Standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgments made by the trustees in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the charity's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error. In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of the information in the financial statements.

#### Opinion

In our opinion the financial statements give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity as at 30 September 2003 and of its incoming resources and application of resources, including its income and expenditure, for the year then ended and have been properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985.

#### NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

#### 1. Accounting Policies

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, as modified by the inclusion of investments at market value and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" (SORP 2000) issued in October 2000, applicable accounting standards and the Companies Act 1985. The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are as follows:

#### a. Investment Income

Investment income is accounted for in the period in which the charity is entitled to receipt of the income.

#### b. Fixed Asset Investments

Investments are included at closing mid-market value at the Balance Sheet date. Any gain or loss on revaluation is taken to the Statement of Financial Activities.

#### c. Resources Expended

The General Assembly grant comprises the General Fund proportion of income, including the 5% administration charge, less audit and administration costs.

#### d. Fund Accounting

A summary of Designated Fund activity is shown on page 18.

#### 2. Company Status

The Company is registered as a Charity and is, therefore, exempt from taxation.

#### 3. Properties

The Company holds, as a Trustee, Freehold and Leasehold Properties and Investments.
