The director submits his annual report and the financial statements for the year ended 1st October, 2006.

### **Principal Activity and Business Review**

The company was dormant, within the meaning of Section 250 of the Companies Act 1985, throughout the financial year ended 1st October, 2006.

### **Directors**

The directors of the company who served during the year ended 1st October, 2006, all of whom have been directors for the whole of the year ended on that date, unless otherwise stated, were:

T.J. Kitchen (resigned 28 April 2006)

S. Anderson-Dixon (appointed 28 April 2006)

Under the Articles of Association, Directors are not required to retire either by rotation or at the first Annual General Meeting after appointment.

### **Directors' Interest in Shares and Debentures**

The interests of S. Anderson-Dixon in the shares of the company are disclosed in the accounts of Bristol United Press Limited, a parent company.

### **Statement of Directors' Responsibilities**

United Kingdom company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company as at the end of the financial year and of the profit or loss of the company for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.

The directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for the system of internal control, for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

### **Auditors**

In accordance with section 252 of the Companies Act 1985, the company has taken advantage of the exemption for dormant companies from the obligation to appoint auditors and subject the financial statements to audit.



The company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Bristol United Press Limited, a company incorporated in England and Wales. The directors regard the ultimate holding company as Rothermere Continuation Limited, which is incorporated in Bermuda. The ultimate controlling party is The Viscount Rothermere, Chairman of Daily Mail and General Trust plc.
