1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008).

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Freehold buildings

- Nil

Plant and machinery

- 10% per annum

Fixtures and fittings

- 10% per annum

Motor vehicles

- 25% per annum

Computer installation

- 20% per annum

Stocks

(i) Chemical and Spectroscopic Reference Materials (RMs) prepared by the company

The stocks are valued by taking the value of stocks at 30 November 2012 less percentage diminution of stocks during the year due to sales, plus prime costs of producing new RMs and renewing RMs during the year. This is consistent with valuations for previous years.

(ii) CTI/BAS Ferrous RMs

The stocks have been valued at cost and this is consistent with valuations in previous years.

(iii) CTI/BAS Non Ferrous RMs

The stocks have been valued at cost and this is consistent with valuations in previous years.

(iv) RMs from outside sources

The stocks have been valued at cost and this is consistent with valuations in previous years.

(v) Bottles, boxes and cartons

The stocks have been valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Deferred taxation

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events have occurred at that date that will result in an obligation to pay more, or a right to pay less or to receive more tax, with the following exceptions:

Provision is made for tax on gains arising from the revaluation (and similar fair value adjustments) of fixed assets, and gains on disposal of fixed assets that have been rolled over into replacement assets, only to the extent that, at the balance sheet date, there is a binding agreement to dispose of the assets concerned. However, no provision is made where, on the basis of all available evidence at the balance sheet date, it is more likely than not that the taxable gain will be rolled over into replacement assets and charged to tax only where the replacement assets are sold.

Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that the directors consider that it is more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted.

Deferred tax is measured on an undiscounted basis at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which timing differences reverse, based on tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date.

Research and development

Research and development expenditure is charged to the profit and loss account as incurred.

Foreign currencies

Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate ruling at the date of the transaction. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated at the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. All differences are taken to the profit and loss account.
