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Directors' report

The Directors present their report together with the audited financial statements of the Company for the year ended 31 December 2008.

Principal activities

The principal activity of the Company is the sale and marketing of tobacco products by its branch in Vietnam.

Review of the year to 31 December 2008

The loss for the year attributable to B.A.T Vietnam Limited shareholders after deduction of all charges and the provision of tax amounted to £22,054,000 (2007: £16,149,000).

Key performance indicators

The Directors of British American Tobacco p.l.c., the ultimate parent company, manage the operations of the British American Tobacco Group (the "Group") on a regional basis. For this reason, and given the nature of the Company's activities, the Company's Directors believe that key performance indicators are not necessary or appropriate for an understanding of the Company's specific development, performance or the position of its business. However, key performance indicators relevant to the Group, and which may be relevant to the Company, are disclosed under the Business Review section in the Annual Report of British American Tobacco p.l.c. and do not form part of this report.

Principal risks and uncertainties

The principal risks and uncertainties of the Company, including financial risk management, are integrated with the principal risks of the Group and are monitored by audit committees to provide a framework for identifying, evaluating and managing risks faced by the Group. Accordingly, the key Group risk factors that may be relevant to the Company are disclosed in the Annual Report of British American Tobacco p.l.c., and do not form part of this report.

Dividends

The Directors do not recommend the payment of a dividend for the year (2007: £nil).

Directors' report

Employees

The Company utilises a range of initiatives to actively encourage employee involvement in the Group's business including individual discussions, team briefings, employee surveys, publications and regular meetings with employee representatives.

Notes to the financial statements - 31 December 2008

1 Accounting policies

A summary of the principal accounting policies is set out below.

(1) Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared on the going concern basis, under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Companies Act 1985 and applicable accounting standards in the United Kingdom.

(2) Cash flow statement

The Company is a wholly-owned subsidiary of British American Tobacco p.l.c.. The cash flows of the Company are included in the consolidated cash flow statement of British American Tobacco p.l.c. which is publicly available. Consequently the Company is exempt under the terms of FRS 1 (Revised) from publishing a cash flow statement.

(3) Foreign currencies

Turnover and profits expressed in currencies other than sterling are translated into sterling at average rates of exchange. Assets and liabilities are translated at closing rates of exchange. The difference between the retained profit of the overseas branch translated at the average and closing rates of exchange is taken to reserves, as are differences on exchange arising on the retranslation to sterling of foreign currency net assets/(liabilities) at the beginning of the year. Other exchange differences, including those on remittances, are reflected in the profit and loss account.

(4) Accounting for income

Income is included in the profit and loss account when all contractual or other applicable conditions for recognition have been met. Provisions are made for bad and doubtful debts where there is an expectation that all or a portion of the amount due will not be recovered.

(5) Taxation

Taxation provided is that chargeable on the profits of the year, together with deferred taxation.

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date, where transactions or events that result in an obligation to pay more tax in the future or a right to pay less tax in the future have occurred at the balance sheet date.

Deferred tax is measured at the average tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which the timing differences are expected to reverse, based on tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax is measured on an undiscounted basis.

(6) Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. The method used in calculating cost, which includes raw materials, direct labour and overheads where appropriate, is average cost.

Notes to the financial statements – 31 December 2008

1 Accounting policies (continued)

(7) Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation is calculated on a straight-line basis to write off the cost of tangible fixed assets over their useful lives. Depreciation is charged pro rata based on the month of acquisition and disposal.

Assets in the course of construction are not depreciated until brought into operational use.

(8) Leased assets

The annual payments under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account over the length of the lease.

(9) Retirement benefits

The Company participates in the British American Tobacco UK Pension Fund, a multi-employer scheme. Under FRS 17, where more than one employer participates in a defined benefit scheme the individual participating employers should account for the scheme as a defined contribution scheme if they are unable to identify their individual shares of the underlying assets and liabilities in the scheme. The Company is unable to identify its share of the underlying assets and liabilities of the multi-employer schemes and therefore, does not recognise any share of any surplus or deficit in respect of these.

The Company also operates a defined contribution scheme. Payments in respect of defined contribution schemes are charged as an expense as they fall due.

15 Pensions

The Company participates in the British American Tobacco UK Pension Fund, a multi employer scheme, in respect of certain employees. Employees are not required to contribute. Details of the latest actuarial valuation for the scheme are contained in the Report and Accounts of British American Tobacco (Holdings) Limited. The last full actuarial valuation of the British American Tobacco UK Pension Fund was carried out as at 31 March 2008 by a qualified independent actuary. This has been updated to 31 December 2008 and a deficit of £334 million (2007: £136 million) was identified.

Under FRS 17, where more than one employer participates in a defined benefit scheme the individual participating employers should account for the scheme as if it were a defined contribution scheme if they are unable to identify their individual shares of the underlying assets and liabilities in the scheme. The Company only participates in multi-employer schemes and the Company is unable to identify its share of the underlying assets and liabilities of the schemes. Therefore, the Company does not recognise any share of any surplus or deficit in respect of the joint pension schemes.

The Company also operates a defined contribution scheme. Payments in respect of defined contribution schemes are charged as an expense as they fall due. The pension cost for the Company was £167,000 (2007: £169,000).

16 Related parties

As a wholly-owned subsidiary, the Company has taken advantage of the exemption under paragraph 3(c) of FRS 8 from disclosing transactions with other subsidiary undertakings of the British American Tobacco p.l.c. Group.

17 Parent support

The Company's immediate parent undertaking has indicated its willingness to continue to provide support to allow the Company to continue at its current level of operations for the foreseeable future.

18 Parent undertakings

The Company's ultimate parent undertaking and ultimate controlling party is British American Tobacco p.l.c. being incorporated in the United Kingdom and registered in England and Wales. The Company's immediate parent undertaking is British American Tobacco (Investments) Limited. Accounts are prepared only at the British American Tobacco p.l.c. level.
