AUDITORS' REPORT Independent Auditors' report to the members of The Cartophilic Society of Great Britain Limited

We have audited the financial statements of The Cartophilic Society of Great Britain Limited for the year ended 31 December 2008, which comprise the income and expenditure account, the balance sheet and the related notes. These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective Jan 2007), under the historical cost convention and the accounting policies set out therein.

This report is made solely to the society's members, as a body, in accordance with Section 235 of the Companies Act. Our audit work has been undertaken so that we might state to the society's members those matters we are required to state to them in an auditors' report and for no other purpose. To the fullest extent permitted by law, we do not accept or assume responsibility to anyone other than the society and the society's members as a body, for our audit work, for this report, or for the opinions we have formed.

Respective responsibilities of council members and auditors

As described in the statement of council members' responsibilities, the society's council members are responsible for the preparation of financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

Our responsibility is to audit the financial statements in accordance with relevant legal and regulatory requirements and International Standards on Auditing (UK and Ireland).

We report to you our opinion as to whether the financial statements give a true and fair view and are properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985. We also report to you if, in our opinion, the Report of the Council is not consistent with the financial statements, if the society has not kept proper accounting records, if we have not received all the information and explanations we require for our audit or if information specified by law regarding council members remuneration and transactions with the society are not disclosed. We read the Report of the Council and consider the implications for our report if we become aware of any apparent misstatements within it.

Basis of opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (UK and Ireland) issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the council members in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the society's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or error or other irregularity. In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial statements.

We have undertaken the audit in accordance with the requirements of APB Ethical Standards including APB Ethical Standard - Provisions Available for Small Entities, in the circumstances set out below:

Principal accounting policies

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards in the United Kingdom, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2007). A summary of the more important accounting policies, which have been applied consistently, is set out below.

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Tangible fixed assets

Office equipment is brought in at a cost reflecting its age and condition. Depreciation is provided so as to write down the assets to residual value after four years.

The library is included at cost.

Stock

Stock is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Taxation

Provision is made in these accounts for corporation tax payable in respect of interest receivable. No tax is payable on the other activities.

Funds

There is no requirement for the funds of the company to be shown separately and accordingly they have been consolidated.

Subscription income

Members are allowed to pay subscriptions in advance and receive reduced rates for doing so. New members paying subscriptions after 1 July are treated as paying next years subscriptions.

Expense allocation

Convention costs are apportioned between the members Annual General Meeting and other Convention Costs based on annual estimates.

7 Liability of members

The company is limited by guarantee. In the event of the company being wound up the liability of existing members and those members ceasing their membership within one year prior to the winding up is limited to $\mathfrak{L}1$.

8 Related parties

Transactions with council members take place on an arms length basis within the normal terms of the society.

9 Card donation

The society was bequeathed a collection of cards from the late Mr J Woolley. This is a nil value gift and therefore the estimated value does not need to be brought into the accounts. Sales during the year are included in income as donations and bequests. The total value of the cards currently held is estimated at £5,000. The society is selling the cards via the club rounds and postal auctions. During this year the income from these sales was £6,152 (2007: £5,785). Total sales to 31 December 2008 amount to £34,495 (2007 £28,343).
