1. COMPANY INFORMATION

Trusec Limited is a limited company domiciled and incorporated in England and Wales. The registered office is 2 Lambs Passage, London, EC1Y 8BB.

2. BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with Section 1A of FRS 102, "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" ("FRS 102").

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functions currency of the company. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest pound.

These financial statements for the year ended 30 April 2016 are the first financial statements of Trusec Limited prepared in accordance with Section 1A of FRS 102. The date of transition to FRS 102 was 1 May 2014. The reported financial position of the company has not been affected by the transition to FRS 102.
