Notes to the financial statements

1 Accounting reference date

The accounting reference date of the Company is the Saturday nearest to 15 September Accordingly these financial statements have been prepared for the 52 week period ended 12 September 2015

2 Accounting policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the financial statements

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards (UK GAAP) and the Companies Act 2006

The Company is exempt by virtue of section 400 of the Companies Act 2006 from the requirement to prepare group accounts. These financial statements present information about the Company as an individual undertaking and not about its group.

Under Financial Reporting Standard I (Revised) the Company is exempt from the requirement to prepare a cash flow statement on the grounds that a parent undertaking includes the Company in its own published consolidated financial statements. A group cash flow statement is included in the financial statements of Associated British Foods plc

The Company is controlled by Associated British Foods plc and is exempt from disclosing transactions with it and other group companies under Financial Reporting Standard 8 as it is a wholly owned subsidiary included within consolidated financial statements which are publicly available

Royalty income

Royalty income is recognised on the basis of sales made by fellow subsidiaries of products for which the Company owns the intellectual property rights

Dividends

Dividends unpaid at the balance sheet date are only recognised as a liability at that date to the extent that they are appropriately authorised and are no longer at the discretion of the Company Unpaid dividends that do not meet these criteria are disclosed in the notes to the financial statements

Goodwill and intangible assets

Impairment reviews of goodwill and intangible assets are carried out at the end of the first financial year after acquisition and where there is any indication of impairment

Goodwill is amortised over its estimated useful life of 15 years. Intangible fixed assets are capitalised at their cost Purchased intangible assets are amortised to nil by equal annual instalments over their useful economic lives generally their respective unexpired periods of 10 years.

Income tax

The charge for taxation is based on the profit or loss for the year and takes into account taxation deferred because of timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes

Deferred tax is recognised, without discounting, in respect of all timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes which have arisen but not reversed by the balance sheet date except as otherwise required by Financial Reporting Standard 19

(c) Factors that may affect future tax charges

The UK corporation tax rate was reduced from 21% to 20% with effect from 1 April 2015. The legislation to effect these rate changes had been enacted before the prior year balance sheet date. As deferred tax is measured at the rates that are expected to apply in the periods when the underlying timing differences reverse, opening and closing deferred tax balances have been calculated using a rate of 20%.

Since the balance sheet date legislation has been substantively enacted to reduce the rate further to 19% from 1 April 2017 and 18% from 1 April 2020. The effect of these new rates on deferred tax balances will accordingly be reflected in the accounts for the 2015/16 financial year.
