DIRECTORS' REPORT

The directors present their report and the audited consolidated financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2011

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The Group's principal activity continues to be the manufacture and marketing of non-woven textile fabrics

FINANCIAL RESULTS AND DIVIDENDS

The results are set out in the profit and loss account on page 8. During the period the company paid dividends of £4,155,000 (2010 £2,292,000)

BUSINESS REVIEW

The directors are pleased to report continuing improvements in profitability. All the businesses within the Group are now performing profitably and we continue to build on our manufacturing and distribution strengths in Europe and Asia.

KEY PERFORMANCE INDICATORS

The key performance indicators of the business are the universal ones of sales, gross margin, stock days, debtor days and creditor days

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

The Group will continue to focus on its strategy of providing technical non-woven fabrics to new and existing markets, both in the UK and overseas

POST BALANCE SHEET EVENTS

Since the year end the company has paid dividends of \$2,000,000 to its parent company having received dividends of \$2,000,000 from its joint venture.

FINANCIAL RISK MANAGEMENT OBJECTIVES AND POLICIES

The Group's operations expose it to a variety of financial risks that include the effect of credit risk, liquidity risk and interest rate risk. The Group has a risk management programme in place that seeks to limit the adverse effects on the financial performance of the Group by monitoring levels of debt finance and the related finance costs. The Group does not use derivative financial instruments to manage interest rate risks and as such, no hedge accounting is applied.

Given the size of the Group the directors have not yet delegated the responsibility of monitoring financial risk management to a sub-committee of the board. The policies set by the board of directors are implemented by the Group's finance department.

Price risk

The Group is exposed to commodity price risk as a result of its operations. However given the size of the Group's operations, the cost of managing exposure to commodity price risk exceeds any potential benefits. The directors will revisit the appropriateness of this policy should the Group's operations change in size or nature.

Credit risk

The Group has policies that require appropriate credit checks on potential customers before sales are made

Liquidity risk

The Group actively reviews the mixture of its long and short term debt finance that is designed to ensure the Group has sufficient available funds for operations and planned expansions

Interest rate cash flow risk

The Group has interest bearing liabilities. The Group has a policy of maintaining debt at rates fixed to general interest rates to minimise the risk of future interest cash flows. The directors will revisit the appropriateness of this policy should the Group's operations change in size or nature.

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance applicable accounting standards and comply with the Companies Act 2006. These policies have been consistently applied.

Accounting Convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention, modified to include the revaluation of certain freehold land and buildings

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards

Basis of consolidation

The Group financial statements consolidate the accounts of Cosmopolitan Textile Company Limited and its subsidiary undertakings drawn up to 31 December 2011 Goodwill incorporated in the consolidated financial statements, representing the differences between the cost of acquisition of shares in subsidiaries and the fair value of the assets acquired is written off through the profit and loss account over the expected useful life of 20 years

The company has elected to take exemption under section 408 of the Companies Act 2006 to not present the parent company profit and loss account

Turnover

Turnover represents the amounts derived from the provision of goods and services which fall within the Group's ordinary activities, stated net of value added tax. It is recognised when the significant risks and reward of the goods have passed to the buyer and the amount of revenue can be reliably measured. Royalties are accounted for on a received basis where there is uncertainty of their receipt.

Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost or valuation, less depreciation. Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets, other than freehold land, at rates calculated to write off the cost or valuation of each asset on a straight line basis over its expected useful life. Freehold buildings are written off over a period of 25 years. Items of plant and machinery, including motor vehicles and fixtures and fittings, are depreciated at annual rates varying from 10% to 33%.

The carrying values of tangible fixed assets are reviewed for impairment in periods if events or changes in circumstances indicate the carrying value may not be recoverable

The directors are taking advantage of the transitional rules of FRS 15. It is their intention that freehold land and buildings will not be revalued on a regular basis in the future but will be carried at their current book value as reduced by depreciation charges in future years.

The part of the annual depreciation charge on revalued assets which relates to the surplus on revaluation is transferred from the revaluation reserve to the profit and loss account reserve

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES /Continued ...

Accounting for leases

Assets acquired under finance lease and hire purchase contracts are included in tangible fixed assets at their estimated fair value at the date of inception of the lease Obligations under such agreements are included in creditors, net of finance charges allocated to future periods. Finance charges are allocated to the profit and loss account over the period of each lease so as to give an approximately annual rate of charge on the balance of each obligation.

Rental costs under operating leases are written off to the profit and loss account in equal annual instalments over the period of the lease

Joint venture

Investments in joint ventures are initially recognised at cost

The carrying amount of the investment is adjusted each period by the Group's share of any relevant profits, losses, or other gains or distributions

Investments

Fixed asset investments are stated at cost less provision for permanent diminution in value

Stocks and work in progress

Stocks are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value on a first in first out basis in the case of finished goods and work-in-progress, cost is defined as the cost of raw materials plus production overheads based on normal level of activity. Where necessary, provision is made for obsolete, slow moving and defective stocks to write them down to net realisable value. Net realisable value is based on estimated selling price less further costs expected to be incurred to completion and disposal.

Deferred taxation

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events have occurred at that date that will result in an obligation to pay more, or a right to pay less or to receive more, tax, with the following exceptions -

- Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that the directors consider that it is more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted,
- Deferred tax is measured on a discounted basis at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which timing differences reverse, based on tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES /Continued ...

Foreign currency translation

The results of overseas joint ventures are translated to sterling at the exchange rate ruling at the financial period end. Exchange differences on the retranslation of the net investment in overseas subsidiary and joint ventures at the beginning of the period are dealt with as a movement on reserves.

Profit and losses on transactions in foreign currencies are included in results from ordinary activities before taxation

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are retranslated at the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. All differences are taken to the profit and loss account

Pension costs

Pension schemes operated on behalf of the Group in the United Kingdom, are defined contribution schemes which are administered by insurance companies. Pension schemes, where operated by companies overseas, comply with local legislation. The charge to the profit and loss account comprises the total contributions payable to the schemes in respect of the account period.

No other material post-retirement benefits are granted to employees

Financial Instruments

Financial assets and liabilities are recognised on the Group's balance sheet when the Group becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument
