(the **Companies**)'s CVA, on 15 December 2017. By way of reminder, the CVA provided in the main for industrial disease claims from former employees and any future claims to be handled in the five-year period and, if appropriate, settled by Delta Limited, the parent Company.

- 1.2 The CVA provides for the ongoing support from Marsh Limited, the claims handlers, and Bostock White Accountants.
- 1.3 This report now provides an update on the progress in the CVA in accordance with R2.41 of the Insolvency (England & Wales) Rules 2016. At Appendix A, I have provided an account of my Receipts and Payments for the year from 15 December 2017 to 14 December 2018 (the Period) with a comparison to the Directors' Statement of Affairs values.
- 1.4 Information about the way that we will use, and store personal data on insolvency appointments can be found in the attached Privacy Notice.

2 Progress of the CVA

2.1 The Companies are all subsidiaries of Delta Limited. The seventeen Companies listed in 2.2 were moved from Members Voluntary Liquidation and the following six we placed directly into CVA:

2.2 As previously reported, all the Companies have no or minimal assets. The only contributions in the CVA are the payments made by Delta Limited. I applied to the High Court of Justice Business & Property Court in Birmingham to defer the dissolution of 17 of the Companies formerly in Members Voluntary Liquidation until 15 December 2022:

- 2.3 The above Companies changed their registered office in the period from c/o M1 Insolvency, Cumberland House, 35 Park Row, Nottingham NG1 6EE to 42-50 Hersham Road, Walton on Thames, Surrey KT12 1RZ.
- 2.4 All twenty-three Companies then changed their registered offices to Elder House, St Georges Business Park, 207 Brooklands Road, Weybridge, Surrey KT13 0TS.

2.5 All original directors of the former MVL companies resigned in the period and were replaced by Mr Timothy Perry Francis and Mr Roger Andrew Massey, with the exception of Delta Circuit Protection and Controls Limited whose directors remain Mr John Peter Narcisco and Ms Janet Anne Ford.

Employee Claims

- 2.6 Marsh Limited have continued to handle claims received in the period for all 23 companies.
- 2.7 The following is a summary of the current position:

- 2.8 To date Delta Limited have contributed £143,052 in settlement of claims in the period.
- 2.9 I also enclose as Appendix D a summary of the insurance policies for each company.

3 Creditors

Preferential Creditors

3.1 There are no preferential creditors' claims in this arrangement.

Unsecured Creditors

- 3.2 The only unsecured creditors identified on the statement of affairs related to Delta Limited and Bostock White Accountants.
- 3.3 I am informed by Bostock White that their fees have been settled in full by Delta Limited in the sum of £2,310 plus VAT on 10 January 2018.
- 3.4 Under the terms of the CVA, Delta Limited does not require settlement of the sums due.
- 3.5 At the date of this report Marsh Limited is handling 64 ongoing claims against the 23 companies.

4 Supervisor's Remuneration

4.1 Creditors approved that the basis of the Supervisor's remuneration be agreed as a set amount of £27,500. At the date of this report, I would confirm that £7,500 has been invoiced

in the period in accordance with the arrangement and I am awaiting settlement from Delta Limited

- 4.2 I have also invoiced my nominee's fee of £25,000 in the period, which is also awaiting settlement by Delta Limited.
- 4.3 It was disclosed to the meeting that the Nominee incurred legal fees for advice in respect of employee liability claims from Gateley Plc in the sum of £30,000 plus VAT and disbursements.
- 4.4 An initial payment of £1,773 plus disbursements of £366 was paid by Delta Limited prior to the date of this report.
- The balance of Gateley Plc's fees for assisting with the move to CVA totalling £28,227 plus disbursements of £756 have been paid by Delta Limited in the period of this report.
- 4.6 Attached, as Appendix B is additional information in relation to our policy on staffing, the use of sub-contractors and the expenses and disbursements of the CVA.
- 4.7 A copy of the guide to insolvency practitioners' fees in a Voluntary Arrangement has already been provided. Further copies are available on request.
- 4.8 As the CVA has now entered its second year, a further Supervisor's fee of £5,000 is now due.

5 Supervisor's Expenses and Disbursements

All of the above noted insurers, with the exception of Iron Trades are still believed to be solvent.

Iron Trades

Iron Trades are an insolvent insurer trading as Chester Street Insurance Holdings Limited, and all claims against coverage through this company are handled through the run off agency, Capita Insurance Services Ltd, who, as soon as the company is dissolved, will TPR (Third Party Rights) validate their policies. Once the policies are TPR validated, the FSCS will provide funding as follows:

- 100% of agreed settlement for exposures from 01 January 1972 onwards
- 90% of agreed settlement for exposures prior to 01 January 1972

Where culpable exposure took place either side of 01 January 1972, the FSCS will fund at the above levels on a pro-rata basis.

However, it should be noted that for mesothelioma claims where there is a proportion of culpable exposure from 01 January 1972 onwards, the FSCS will fund 100% of the agreed settlement irrespective of whether a proportion of the exposure is prior to 1972.

Privacy Notice APPENDIX E

Use of personal information

We process personal information to enable us to carry out our work as insolvency practitioners which includes processing data that was held by companies/individuals before our appointment together with data collected during an insolvency procedure or a fixed charge receivership. Our legal obligation to process personal data arises from work we are required to carry out under insolvency and other related legislation.

Insolvency practitioners are Data Controllers of personal data in so far as defined by data protection legislation. M1 Insolvency will act as Data Processor on their instructions about personal data in relation to an insolvency procedure or fixed charge receivership.

Personal data will be kept secure and processed only for matters relating to the insolvency procedure being dealt with.

The data we may process

The personal data insolvency practitioners may process in most cases will be basic details that may identify an individual and will typically be sufficient to allow us to carry out our work as insolvency practitioners, for example, dealing with the claims of individuals who are owed monies by the companies/individuals over whom we have been appointed.

However, insolvency practitioners may be appointed over entities that process personal data that is considered more sensitive, for example health records and this sensitive data will usually have been created before our appointment. Although we will take appropriate steps to safeguard sensitive data (or to destroy it where it is appropriate to do so), subject to limited exceptions, for example, where we identify previous conduct and/or action that requires further investigation, we will not be processing sensitive data.

Sharing information

We may share personal data with third parties where we are under a legal or regulatory duty to do so, or it is necessary for the purposes of undertaking our work as insolvency practitioners. We may also share personal data to lawfully assist the police or other law enforcement agencies with the prevention and detection of crime, where disclosure is necessary to protect the safety or security of any persons and/or otherwise as permitted by the law.

How long will we hold it?

Personal data will be retained for as long as any legislative or regulatory requirement requires us to hold it. Typically, this may be up to 6 years after which it will be destroyed.

What are your rights?

You have the right to receive the information contained in this document about how your personal data may be processed by us.

You also have the right to know that we may be processing your personal data and, in most circumstances, to have information about the personal data of yours that we hold, and you may ask for certain other details such as what purpose we may process your data for and how long we will hold it.

Individuals have the right to request that incorrect or incomplete data is corrected and in certain circumstances, you may request that we erase any personal data on you which may be held or processed as part of our work as insolvency practitioners.
