NOTES TO THE ABBREVIATED ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2009

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1 1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The full financial statements, from which these abbreviated accounts have been extracted, have been prepared under the historical cost convention as modified by the revaluation of investment properties and freehold ground rents and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008)

1.2 Turnover

Turnover consists of the sale of development stock held by the company, exclusive of Value Added Tax

13 Intangible fixed assets and amortisation

Intangible fixed assets consist of freehold ground rents and are stated at cost

1 4 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost or valuation less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost or valuation of fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following bases.

Plant & Machinery

20% straight line

Motor Vehicles

- 25% reducing balance

1.5 Investments

Subsidiary undertakings

Investments in subsidiaries are valued at cost less provision for impairment

Other investments

Other investments are amortised at a rate of 20% straight line per annum at cost less any estimated residual value

In accordance with accounting standards, investment properties are not subject to periodic charges for depreciation (except for properties held on lease, which are depreciated over the period when the unexpired term is 20 years or less) but are included in the balance sheet at their estimated open market value at the balance sheet date

Changes in the market value of investment properties are dealt with as a movement on the revaluation reserve unless a deficit (or its reversal) on an individual investment property is expected to be permanent, in which case it is charged (or credited) in the profit and loss account of the period. This departure from the Companies Act 2006's requirement for all fixed assets with a limited useful economic life to be depreciated is necessary in order to give a true and fair view. Depreciation is only one of many factors reflected in the annual valuation and the amounts of depreciation which might otherwise have been charged cannot be separately identified or quantified.

1.6 Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value after making due allowance for obsolete and slow-moving stocks. Costs represent purchase price

1.7 Deferred taxation

Full provision is made for deferred tax assets and liabilities arising from all timing differences between the recognition of gains and losses in the financial statements and recognition in the tax computation. Deferred tax is not provided on timing differences arising from the revaluation of fixed assets in the financial statements. A net deferred tax asset is recognised only if it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are calculated at the current tax rate.

1.8 Pensions

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme and the pension charge represents the amounts payable by the company to the fund in respect of the year
