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THE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2008

The director has pleasure in presenting his report and the financial statements of the group for the year ended 31 December 2008.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES AND BUSINESS REVIEW

The principal activity of the group during the year was that of design, manufacturer and distribution of professional cleaning equipment.

Numatic International manufacture an exceptionally wide range of professional cleaning equipment amongst which there are also the iconic Henry and Hetty professional vacuum cleaners which also sell extensively into our rapidly growing retail sector. 40% of our production is exported.

Our total worldwide manufacturing facility is based in Chard where we employ 700 people with a further 100 in overseas sales operations. Employee relationships remain strong with good communications both at Work's Council and GMB levels. For the trading year of 2009 we will maintain our wage strategy at the same level as the previous seven years with increases part paid in wages and part in increased pension contributions. This policy has shown to substantially improve employee loyalty with minimal staff turnover.

Our performance for the year showed a good level of profit in line with our expectations even though we only had a stable trading environment during the first nine months of the year with the last three months turning into near chaos worldwide. The £ Sterling depreciated by 25% against both the US Dollar and the Euro and the media projections for 2009 sapped virtually every ounce of confidence out of the global economy. We will continue our long established policy of selling and buying in three currencies, £ Sterling, US Dollars and Euros, providing a partial hedge against these exchange movements.

As a UK based manufacturer we are, unfortunately, finding that less and less of our raw materials and components can be sourced locally with the majority now imported from Euro or US Dollar based suppliers, making us, as a Company, very sensitive to the fluctuations of the foreign exchange market. The majority of our suppliers have remained constant and long term but, unfortunately, one or two have ceased operation during these difficult times and have needed to be replaced.

The only item of negative news for the group related solely to our French subsidiary, which provides 8% of our turnover, where we uncovered serious misdoings at the most senior level which necessitated a major change of top management and the commencement of criminal proceedings to recover funds discovered to have been misappropriated during both 2007 and 2008. We have found it prudent to make full provision for the misappropriated monies but, in addition, we have depreciated stock levels to reflect substantial unauthorized purchases of material of no Numatic value. Although a Euro adjustment, the Sterling equivalent amounts to a total of £3,828,000 but, by virtue of the fact that these adjustments relate to an overseas subsidiary, they are not offsetable against the normal UK tax liability.

We are, however, quite happy that, now discovered and dealt with, this unfortunate episode will have no impact on 2009 sales and profit performance.

On the more positive side, our new 5,000 sq m increased warehouse facility is on target for completion by mid year ready to provide improved distribution facilities for 2010.

THE DIRECTOR'S REPORT (continued)

Our new product introductions for 2009 are now available but may not necessarily be fast moving in the current environment. In one respect this will be advantageous especially with the new Vario rideon scrubber dryer as it will allow us to concentrate on maximising product quality and field reliability for this important new addition during the introduction of this product to the world market.

Good products, good suppliers, good staff and good facilities are, and always have been, the backbone of Numatic but to this we will need to add a liberal supply of additional effort in order to balance the market instability that has been a direct result of the high level of irresponsibility being uncovered within the international financial sector which is set to affect us all in one way or another during 2009.

RESULTS AND DIVIDENDS

The loss for the year, after taxation, amounted to £640,000. The director has not recommended a dividend.

FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

The company does not use any financial instruments to hedge its risks associated with price, credit, liquidity or cash flow.

DIRECTOR'S RESPONSIBILITIES

The director is responsible for preparing the Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

Company law requires the director to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law the director has elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law). The financial statements are required by law to give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and the group and of the profit or loss of the group for that year. In preparing those financial statements, the director is required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable UK Accounting Standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the group will continue in business.

The director is responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the group and enable him to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. He is also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the group and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

In so far as the director is aware:

- there is no relevant audit information of which the group's auditor is unaware; and
- the director has taken all steps that he ought to have taken to make himself aware of any relevant audit information and to establish that the auditor is aware of that information.

DISABLED EMPLOYEES

It is the group's policy to consider applications for employment from disabled people on the same basis as other potential employees. Ability and aptitude are the determining factors in the selection, training, career development and promotion of all employees. If an employee becomes disabled during the period of employment the group will, if necessary and to the extent possible, retrain the employee for duties suited to that employee's abilities following disablement.

EMPLOYEE INVOLVEMENT

The group involves employees in the business in various ways. Regular meetings are held between managers and the Union Representatives of staff to discuss any issues arising and the Health and Safety Committee liases with staff. Furthermore, wages are based on a productivity scheme, which involves disclosure to staff of sales performance.

YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2008

We have audited the group and parent company financial statements ("the financial statements") of NUMATIC INTERNATIONAL LIMITED for the year ended 31 December 2008, which have been prepared on the basis of the accounting policies set out on pages 11 to 14.

This report is made solely to the company's shareholders, as a body, in accordance with Section 235 of the Companies Act 1985. Our audit work has been undertaken so that we might state to the company's shareholders those matters we are required to state to them in an auditor's report and for no other purpose. To the fullest extent permitted by law, we do not accept or assume responsibility to anyone other than the company and the company's shareholders as a body, for our audit work, for this report, or for the opinions we have formed.

RESPECTIVE RESPONSIBILITIES OF DIRECTOR AND AUDITOR

The director's responsibilities for preparing the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice) are set out in the Statement of Director's Responsibilities.

Our responsibility is to audit the financial statements in accordance with relevant legal and regulatory requirements and International Standards on Auditing (UK and Ireland).

We report to you our opinion as to whether the financial statements give a true and fair view and are properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985. We also report to you whether in our opinion the information given in the Director's Report is consistent with the financial statements.

In addition we report to you if, in our opinion, the company has not kept proper accounting records, if we have not received all the information and explanations we require for our audit, or if information specified by law regarding director's remuneration and other transactions is not disclosed.

We read the Director's Report and consider the implications for our report if we become aware of any apparent misstatements within it.

BASIS OF AUDIT OPINION

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (UK and Ireland) issued by the Auditing Practices Board, except that the scope of our work was limited as explained below.

An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the director in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the group's and company's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE SHAREHOLDERS OF NUMATIC INTERNATIONAL LIMITED (continued)

However, the evidence available to us was limited, because the auditors of Numatic International SA, a wholly owned subsidiary incorporated in France, have not completed their audit due to ongoing legal proceedings regarding irregular activities by former management of that subsidiary. Accordingly, the amounts included in the accompanying consolidated financial statements in respect of this subsidiary of £3,967,000 loss and £1,773,000 net liabilities are based on unaudited management accounts. There were no other satisfactory procedures that we could adopt to verify these amounts.

In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial statements.

QUALIFIED OPINION ARISING FROM LIMITATION IN AUDIT SCOPE

Except for the financial effects of such adjustments, if any, as might have been determined necessary had we been able to obtain sufficient evidence concerning the management accounts of Numatic International SA, in our opinion:

- the financial statements give a true and fair view, in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice, of the state of the group's and the parent company's affairs as at 31 December 2008 and of the groups profit for the year then ended;
- the financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985; and
- the information given in the director's report is consistent with the financial statements.

In respect solely to the accounts of Numatic International SA, we have not obtained all the information and explanations that we consider necessary for the purpose of our audit.

Emphasis of matter - possible outcome of legal proceedings

In forming our opinion on the financial statements, which is qualified due to a limitation in audit scope, we have considered the adequacy of the disclosures made in note 18 to the financial statements concerning the possible outcome of legal proceedings, alleging the misappropriation of assets owned by Numatic International SA, where the company is the claimant. The ultimate outcome of the matter cannot presently be determined, and full provision has been made for the assets in question in the financial statements.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

Basis of consolidation

The consolidated financial statements incorporate the financial statements of the company and all group undertakings. These are adjusted, where appropriate, to conform to group accounting policies. Acquisitions are accounted for under the acquisition method and goodwill on consolidation is capitalised and written off over five years from the year of acquisition. The results of companies acquired or disposed of are included in the profit and loss account after or up to the date that control passes respectively. As a consolidated profit and loss account is published, a separate profit and loss account for the parent company is omitted from the group financial statements by virtue of section 230 of the Companies Act 1985.

Turnover

The turnover shown in the profit and loss account represents amounts invoiced during the year, exclusive of Value Added Tax.

Research and development

Research and development expenditure is written off in the year in which it is incurred.

Goodwill

Positive purchased goodwill arising on acquisitions is capitalised, classified as an asset on the Balance Sheet and amortised over its estimated useful life up to a maximum of 20 years. This length of time is presumed to be the maximum useful life of purchased goodwill because it is difficult to make projections beyond this period. Goodwill is reviewed for impairment at the end of the first full financial year following each acquisition and subsequently as and when necessary if circumstances emerge that indicate that the carrying value may not be recoverable.

Amortisation

Amortisation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Goodwill

5 or 15 years

Patents

Between 10 and 20 years straight line

Fixed assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Freehold Property

- 2% per annum straight line (France 15 years)

Plant & Machinery

On a straight line monthly basis over the first 6 years to 10% of cost, thereafter its value in use is reassessed on an annual basis and 20% reducing balance (France over 5 and 10 years straight line)

Computer Equipment

On a straight line basis over the first 3 years to 10% of cost, thereafter its value in use is reassessed on an annual basis (France between 3 and 5 years straight line)

Motor Vehicles

- 20%-33% per annum straight line

Tooling

- On a straight line monthly basis over 4 to 10 years

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Work in progress

Work in progress is valued on the basis of direct costs plus attributable overheads based on normal level of activity. Provision is made for any foreseeable losses where appropriate. No element of profit is included in the valuation of work in progress.

Operating lease agreements

Rentals applicable to operating leases where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership remain with the lessor are charged against profits on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The group operates a defined benefit pension scheme for employees. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the group.

Current service costs, past service costs and gains and losses on settlements and curtailments are charged to the profit and loss account. Past service costs are recognised over the vesting period or immediately if the benefits have vested. When a settlement (eliminating all obligations for benefits already accrued) or a curtailment (reducing future obligations as a result of a material reduction in the scheme membership or a reduction in future entitlement) occurs, the obligation and related plan assets are re-measured using current actuarial assumptions and the resultant gain or loss is recognised in the profit and loss account during the period in which the settlement or curtailment occurs.

The interest cost and the expected return on assets are shown as a net amount in the profit and loss account as other finance costs or income. Actuarial gains and losses are recognised immediately in the statement of total recognised gains and losses.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Pension scheme assets are valued at fair value at the balance sheet date. Fair value is based on market price information and in the case of quoted securities is the published bid price. Pension scheme liabilities are measured on an actuarial basis using the projected unit method and are discounted to their present value using a rate equivalent to the current rate of return on a high quality corporate bond of equivalent currency and term to the scheme liabilities. Pension scheme deficits are recognised in full on the balance sheet, net of related deferred tax.

The overseas subsidiary undertakings make contributions (where applicable) on behalf of their employees into private funds, contributions to these schemes are charged to the profit and loss account as they are incurred.

The parent undertaking also operates a defined contribution self-administered scheme for directors, contributions to this scheme are charged to the profit and loss account as they are incurred.

Deferred taxation

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events have occurred at that date that will result in an obligation to pay more, or a right to pay less or to receive more tax, with the following exceptions:

Provision is made for tax on gains arising from the revaluation (and similar fair value adjustments) of fixed assets, and gains on disposal of fixed assets that have been rolled over into replacement assets, only to the extent that, at the balance sheet date, there is a binding agreement to dispose of the assets concerned. However, no provision is made where, on the basis of all available evidence at the balance sheet date, it is more likely than not that the taxable gain will be rolled over into replacement assets and charged to tax only where the replacement assets are sold.

Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that the director considers that it is more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted.

Deferred tax is measured on an undiscounted basis at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which timing differences reverse, based on tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date.

Foreign currencies

Assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction. Exchange differences are taken into account in arriving at the operating profit.

Financial instruments

Financial instruments are classified and accounted for, according to the substance of the contractual arrangement, as financial assets, financial liabilities or equity instruments. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the company after deducting all of its liabilities.

Investments

Investments held as fixed assets are stated at cost, provision is made for impairment where there is felt to be a permanent diminution in value of the underlying net assets.

2. **TURNOVER**

The turnover for the year was derived from the group's principal activity. In the opinion of the director all geographical markets are supplied under similar terms conditions and prices, and the products supplied form one class of business. Inter group trading is eliminated on consolidation. The director considers that any further disclosure in terms of turnover analysis would be commercially sensitive and therefore prejudicial to the group.

Since the year end irregular activities by former management have been identified in Numatic International SA, a wholly owned subsidiary incorporated in France, and there are currently legal proceedings in progress alleging the misappropriation of the subsidiary's assets, where the company is the claimant. The value of the assets that the company is trying to recover stands at £2,525,000, for which full provision has been made in the current year. This figure consists of several transactions covering both the current and preceding periods. The anticipated final net effect on the preceding period is not considered of such significance as to affect the true and fair view given by the previously reported figures. The amounts included in these financial statements in respect of this subsidiary are a £3,967,000 loss (2007 - £201,000 loss) and £1,773,000 net liabilities (2007 - £1,778,000 net assets).

The group operates a number of pension schemes for its employees.

Defined benefit pension scheme (company only)

The parent undertaking operates a defined benefit pension scheme, the assets of which are held in a trustee administered fund. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the group in an independently administered fund.

Employees contribute 5% of salary with the balance of required contributions being met by the company (21.3% of pensionable salaries at the balance sheet date). An actuary reviews the assets and liabilities of the scheme on a triennial basis for funding purposes, the last valuation being as at 1st April 2006. Interim valuations will continue to be performed at the end of each accounting year for the purposes of FRS 17 disclosures.

The actuarial assessment considers the assets and liabilities at the date of calculation and forecasts assets and liabilities in the future according to a set of assumptions, the most important of which are the rate of return on the assets and the rate of increase in remuneration and pensions.

At the date of the last full valuation in 2006, the actuarial valuation of the assets was £22,475,000 and of the liabilities £29,825,000, representing a shortfall of £7,350,000 and a funding level of 75%. This underfunding is being reduced by adjusting the employer's contribution to 21.3% of pensionable salaries for the year to 31st December 2007 and thereafter. There is an agreement to increase the employees' contribution to 6% of pensionable salaries from 1st January 2008 and to 7% from 1st January 2010.

The position will be reviewed at the next actuarial valuation, which should have an effective date not more than three years from the date of the latest valuation.
