

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1. Introduction

R H Kelly and C G J King were appointed Joint Liquidators of the Company on 21 October 2015 following the end of the Administration. Our appointment was made by the creditors pursuant to Paragraph 83 of Schedule B1 to the Insolvency Act 1986 and Rule 2.117 of the Insolvency Rules 1986, in accordance with the Joint Administrators' Proposals dated 25 June 2014.

This report on the progress of the Liquidation is in accordance with Section 104A of the Insolvency Act 1986 and Rule 18.7 of the Insolvency Rules 2016.

This report covers the period from 21 October 2019 to 20 October 2020 and should be read in conjunction with:

- the Joint Administrators' Proposals dated 25 June 2014;
- the Joint Administrators' previous progress reports dated 28 November 2014, 8 April 2015, 27 October 2015; and
- the Joint Liquidators' previous annual reports dated 13 December 2016, 19 December 2017, 10 December 2018 and 5 December 2019.

In accordance with the provisions of the Insolvency Rules 2016 we are required to provide certain information about the Company and the Liquidators. This information is attached at Appendix D.

2. Progress of the Liquidation

2.1 Realisations during the period of this report

2.1.1 Minority Interest in Phynova

Phynova is a private limited life sciences business based in the UK and on appointment the Company owned c.4% of Phynova's ordinary share capital.

As previously reported, the planned Initial Public Offering ('IPO') of Phynova was deferred for the foreseeable future with the present focus for Phynova management on securing funding by alternative means, primarily equity placements from VCTs, etc.

The above development limited our realisation options and therefore, we approached existing shareholders and VCTs to understand if they would be willing to acquire the shares for an acceptable price.

With the support of Phynova management, we offered the shares to all current shareholders on a pro-rata basis at 2 pence per share. We considered this a reasonable price given reference to Phynova's current rights issue price together with the various delays and challenges in realising this asset.

We are pleased to report that this process concluded successfully in August 2020, resulting in the receipt of funds totalling c.£166k.

The realisation of the Phynova shares allows the liquidation to proceed with a final distribution to unsecured creditors following which the liquidation will conclude.

2.1.2 Bank Interest

Bank interest totalling £416 has been received in the period covered by this report.

3. Receipts and payments

A receipts and payments account for the 12 months to 20 October 2020 and the period from 21 October 2015 to 20 October 2020 is attached at Appendix A. This does not reflect estimated future realisations or costs.

4. Outcome for creditors

4.1 Secured Creditors

4.1.1 Barclays Bank plc

At 21 October 2015, Barclays have received a total distribution of c£0.9m under their fixed charges on the properties leaving a shortfall of c£0.05m. Barclays have claimed as an unsecured creditor for this balance.

4.1.2 Lloyds Banking Group

Lloyds provided a confidential invoice discounting facility prior to our appointment and held fixed charge security over the debts.

As previously reported, the Company's liability to Lloyds has been extinguished.

4.2 Preferential Creditors

As part of the sale of the business, all of the Company's employees and their associated liabilities transferred to the Purchaser under the TUPE regulations.

There are no preferential claims in the Liquidation.

4.3 Non-preferential Creditors

As reported previously, on 13 December 2016 an interim distribution of 3p in the £ was declared and subsequently paid on 10 February 2017. The total amount distributed was £297,987.

Following the realisation of the Phynova shares, the Joint Liquidators are in a position to make a second and final dividend to creditors.

The distribution will be made following receipt of a VAT refund from HMRC. Unfortunately, due to the additional workload caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, processing times at HMRC are significantly longer than usual and therefore the timing of the distribution is uncertain.

The deadline for non-preferential, unsecured creditors to submit claims passed on Friday 30th October. The Joint Liquidators have admitted claims aggregating £9,933,854 to rank for dividend purposes. As such, the quantum of the dividend is expected to be in the region of 3 pence in the £. We had previously anticipated that the VAT refund would have been received by now and as a result we will have to repeat the process for agreeing claims in advance of this distribution.

4.4 The Prescribed Part

No lender has a floating charge over the Company's assets. As a consequence, any uncharged assets after costs of the Liquidation will be available to the unsecured creditors. The Prescribed Part pursuant to section 176A of the Insolvency Act 1986 will therefore not apply.

5. Liquidators' remuneration and disbursements

5.1 Basis of the Joint Liquidators' remuneration

The Joint Liquidators' remuneration was approved by a resolution of the creditors of the Company on 6 April 2016, based on the sum of three separate elements as detailed below.

5.1.1 Time cost fee

The Joint Liquidators' remuneration for statutory work, agreeing creditors' claims and distributing assets to creditors is based on the time properly spent by them and their staff at the rates set out in Appendix C, subject to a 20% discount and a limit of £60,000.

During the period covered by this report, we have incurred time costs (excluding time related to the realisation of the Phynova shares categorised as 'Other assets') of £24,057. A fee of £20,000 has been drawn in the period covered by this report.

Total time costs incurred in the liquidation to 20 October 2020 (excluding time related to the realisation of the Phynova shares) are £111,907. The Joint Liquidators have drawn fees totalling £60,000, in accordance with the above limit.

5.1.2 Realisation fee on Phynova shares

The Joint Liquidators' remuneration for realising the Company's shareholding in Phynova Limited was set at the following percentage of the amount realised:

- 10% of realisations up to £50,000; plus
- 15% of realisations between £50,001 and £100,000; plus
- 20% of realisations between £100,001 and £150,000; plus
- 40% of realisations of £150,001 and above.

As a result of net proceeds of £166,106 for the Phynova shareholding, the Joint Liquidators have drawn fees of £28,943 in accordance with the above.

5.1.3 Realisation fee on Kirkbymoorside Property overage

The Liquidators' remuneration for realising income relating to the overage clause that was agreed by the former administrators when the Company's property at Kirbymoorside was sold to Sylatech Limited be set at the following percentage of the amount realised:

- 10% of realisations up to £50,000; plus
- 15% of realisations between £50,001 and £100,000; plus
- 20% of realisations of £100,001 and above.

No realisation was possible from this asset and therefore no fee has been incurred or drawn.

5.2 Update on Joint Liquidators' remuneration

Our time during the period covered by this report relates principally to the following matters:

- Realising value from the shareholding in Phynova;
- Corporation tax and VAT returns; and
- ▶ Dealing with statutory reporting and compliance obligations.

Total time costs incurred in the liquidation to 20 October 2020 are £151,576.

The Joint Liquidators have drawn fees of £88,943 (inclusive of the Phynova shares realisation fee).

Set out at Appendix B is an analysis of the time spent and charge out rates for each grade of staff for the various areas of work carried out as required by the Statement of Insolvency Practice No.9. A statement of the Joint Liquidators' policy on charging remuneration is included at Appendix C.

5.3 Disbursements

The creditors of the Company also approved the Joint Liquidators drawing of Category 2 disbursements.

To date, Category 1 or 2 disbursements aggregating £1,202 have been incurred of which £Nil has been drawn.

Appendix C provides a statement of the Joint Liquidators' policy for charging Category 1 and 2 disbursements and an analysis of the Category 1 and 2 disbursements incurred and paid to date.

5.4 Payment to other professionals

The Joint Liquidators have engaged the following professional firms to assist them. They were chosen on the basis of their experience in similar assignments.
