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DIRECTORS' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 24 DECEMBER 2013

The Directors present their report and the audited financial statements of Istithmar P&O Estates Limited (the 'Company'), for the year ended 24 December 2013.

Results and dividends

The profit for the financial year amounted to £2,134,487 (2012 - £113).

The Directors do not recommend the payment of a dividend (2012: £NIL)

Principal activities and review of business

The Company's principal activity is acting as a property investment holding company.

The Company has not engaged in any commercial trading activity during the year. During the year there was a reversal of impairment on the movement in net assets of P&O Estates Limited, resulting in a net reversal of an impairment in subsidiaries of £2m.

The Company is a wholly owned subsidiary of P&O Property Holdings Limited.

Principal risks and uncertainties

The financial performance of subsidiary undertakings may affect their carrying value. The carrying value of these investments are monitored regularly for indications of impairment.

In respect of going concern, after making enquiries, the Directors have a reasonable expectation that the Company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Accordingly, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.

This report has been prepared in accordance with the special provisions relating to small companies within Part 15 of the Companies Act 2006.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 24 DECEMBER 2013

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

These financial statements are prepared on the going basis, under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Companies Act 2006 and applicable accounting standards in the United Kingdom. The principal accounting policies are set out below and have been applied consistently throughout the year.

The Company is a wholly owned subsidiary of P&O Property Holdings Limited.

Group financial statements are not prepared because the Company is itself a wholly owned subsidiary undertaking of another company incorporated in England and Wales which, in turn, is a wholly owned subsidiary of a company incorporated in Dubai which prepares consolidated financial statements which are available on request.

1.2 Investments

Investments held as fixed assets are shown at cost less provision for impairment.

Impairment losses are recognised in the Profit and Loss account in the period in which they arise. An impairment loss is reversed if the reversal can be related objectively to an event occurring after the impairment loss was recognised.

1.3 Related party transactions

The Company has taken advantage of the exemption available to it under FRS8 "Related Party Disclosures" not to disclose transactions with other group companies. There were no other related party transactions during the year.

1.4 Taxation

The credit for current taxation for the year is based on the result for the year, adjusted for disallowable items.

Full provision has been made for deferred taxation in respect of timing differences that have originated, but not reversed at the balance sheet date where an event has occurred that results in an obligation to pay more or less tax in the future, except that deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that the Directors consider that it is more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted.

Deferred tax is measured on a non-discounted basis at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which the timing differences reverse, based on the tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date.

1.5 Cash flow

The Company has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No.1 (Revised) "Cash flow Statements" from the requirement to produce a cash flow statement, on the grounds that the Company is wholly owned and its ultimate parent undertaking, Dubai World, prepares a consolidated statement of cash flows.

2. PROFIT/RESULT ON ORDINARY ACTIVITIES BEFORE TAXATION

- (a) The Company's business is organised in the United Kingdom.
- (b) The basis of charging intra-group interest is agreed between the parties from time to time.
- (c) Fees for audit and non-audit services provided by PricewaterhouseCoopers LLP to the Company have been borne by other group undertakings. It is not practicable to ascertain what proportion of such fees relates to the Company.

3. STAFF COSTS

The Company has no employees (2012: none) other than the Directors, who did not receive any remuneration (2012 - £NIL). The Directors are also Directors/employees of, and were paid by, other group undertakings. The Directors do not believe that it is practicable to apportion these emoluments between their services as Directors of the Company and their services as Directors/employees of other group undertakings.
