## Directors' report for the year ended 30 September 2012

The directors present their report and the audited financial statements of the company for the year ended 30 September 2012 The Directors' report has been prepared taking advantage of the small companies' exemption under part 15 of the Companies Act 2006

#### Principal activities

The company's principal activity is the arrangement of secured and unsecured instalment credit agreements

#### Review of business and future developments

The profit after taxation for the year was £1,684,000 (2011 £719,000) The directors do not recommend the payment of a dividend (2011 £nil)

The company continues to perform in line with expectations and will continue to expand in line with overall business objectives

#### Qualifying third parties indemnity provision

The company maintains liabilities insurance for its directors and officers. Following shareholder approval in October 2010 the company has also provided an indemnity for its directors and secretary, which is a qualifying third party indemnity provision for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006. This indemnity has been in place throughout the financial year and remains in place at the date of signing these financial statements.

#### Statement of directors' responsibilities

## Statement of accounting policies

#### Basis of preparation

These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, on a going concern basis in accordance with the Companies Act 2006 and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards. A summary of the more important accounting policies which have been applied consistently is set out below.

#### Turnover

Turnover, which is exclusive of value added tax, comprises revenue earned on instalment credit agreements. It is released, either on a 'rule of 78' or straight line basis according to the policies of the managing agents, over the term of the agreement. The level of interest rates and the length of lease is considered sufficiently short that the 'rule of 78' is a reasonable approximation of the profile of interest and capital repayments over the life of the instalment credit agreements.

#### Customers' accounts receivable

Customers' accounts receivable consist of capital amounts outstanding under instalment credit agreements, less appropriate provision for bad and doubtful capital debts based upon the individual assessment of accounts

#### **Taxation**

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date, where transactions or events that result in an obligation to pay more tax in the future or a right to pay less tax in the future have occurred at the balance sheet date

A net deferred tax asset is recognised as recoverable and therefore recognised only when, on the basis of all available evidence, it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits against which to recover carried forward tax losses and from which the future reversal of underlying timing differences can be deducted

Deferred tax is measured at the average tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which the timing differences are expected to reverse based on tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax is measured on an undiscounted basis

#### c) Factors that may affect future tax charge

A change in the UK main corporation tax rate from 26% to 24% was substantively enacted on 29 March 2012, following the conclusion of the budget debates, and was effective from 1 April 2012. As a result, the relevant deferred tax balances have been re-measured

Further reductions in the UK corporation tax rate were announced in the June 2011 budget. These further changes are expected to be enacted separately each year. However these further changes had not been substantively enacted at the balance sheet date and therefore are not recognised in these financial statements.
