REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2015

The Executive Committee, who are also Directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act, submit their annual report together with the financial statements of The Abbeyfield Tonbridge Society Limited for the year ended 30 September 2015. The Executive Committee have adopted the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in 2005 in preparing the annual report and financial statements of the charitable company.

Structure, Governance and Management

The Society is a company limited by guarantee, having no share capital and is registered as a charity. It is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association. The Society's members are the members of the Executive Committee.

Members of the Executive Committee are recruited by personal contacts of existing committee members.

Objectives and Activities

The principal activity of the charitable company is to provide accommodation, care and companionship for lonely or frail elderly people in accordance with the aims and principles of The Abbeyfield Society.

The Society operates a home providing accommodation for up to 9 people.

In setting objectives and planning for activities, the trustees have given due consideration to the general guidance published by the Charity Commission relating to public benefit.

Achievements and Performance

Occupancy levels at Bentall House have improved over the year and we have taken the opportunity to totally refurbish the kitchen and to replace the two boilers that provide heating and hot water. This is in line with our stated intention to maintain and increase the facilities for the residents of Bentall House, so that they continue to benefit from a stable and caring environment.

Financial Review

The results for the year are set out in the statement of financial activities on page 5 and the position at the end of the year is shown in the balance sheet on page 6.

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2015

The Society's free reserves are those not held as fixed assets. At 30 September 2015 free reserves amounted to £156,275 (2014: £151,508). The Executive Committee are considering the use of the reserves with particular reference to benefiting both current and future residents.

Executive Committee's Responsibilities Statement

The Executive Committee is responsible for preparing the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice.

Company law requires the Executive Committee to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law the Executive Committee have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with the United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law).

Under company law the Executive Committee must not approve the financial statements unless they are satisfied that they give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of the surplus or deficit of the charitable company for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the Executive Committee are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in business.

The Executive Committee are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the charitable company's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

This Report has been prepared in accordance with the provisions applicable to small companies within Part 15 of the Companies Act 2006.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2015

I report on the accounts of the charitable company for the year ended 30 September 2015, which are set out on pages 5 to 10.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The Executive Committee (who are also the directors of the company for the purposes of company law) are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2015

1. Accounting Policies

Basis of preparation of accounts

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities".

Fund accounting

The general fund is an unrestricted fund which is available for use at the discretion of the Executive Committee in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Restricted funds can only be used for the particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular purposes. The charity does not currently have any restricted funds.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis. Costs of charitable activities are those costs, including support costs, relating to the provision of residential accommodation for the elderly.

Governance costs are those costs incurred in connection with the administration of the charity and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from Corporation Tax on its charitable activities.

Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following bases:

Freehold property - Not depreciated Furniture and fittings - 15% straight line

No depreciation is provided on the freehold property as it is considered to be immaterial due to the long useful economic life and high residual value of the property.

A full year's depreciation is charged in the year of purchase of Furniture and Fittings but no depreciation is charged in the year of disposal.
