We have audited the financial statements of Mencap Limited for the year ended 31 March 2008 which comprise the Income and Expenditure Account, the Balance Sheet and the related notes 1 to 12. These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out therein.

This report is made solely to the company's members, as a body, in accordance with section 235 of the Companies Act 1985. # NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2008

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards and the Companies Act 1985. The particular accounting policies adopted are described below:

## **Accounting convention**

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention.

#### **Turnover**

Turnover arises from promotional activities carried out in England, Wales and Northern Ireland.

#### Stocks

Stocks, which comprise stationery and goods for resale, are stated at lower of cost or net realisable value.

#### **Deferred tax**

Deferred tax is provided in full on timing differences that result in an obligation at the balance sheet date to pay more tax, or a right to pay less tax, at a future date, at rates expected to apply when they crystallise based on current tax rates and law. Timing differences arise from the inclusion of items of income and expenditure in taxation computations in periods different from those in which they are included in the financial statements.

Deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is regarded as more likely than not that they will be recovered. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are not discounted.
