STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The Abbeyfield (Lowestoft) Society Limited is a company limited by guarantee governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association dated 24 October 1966. It is registered with the Charity Commission

The liability of its members is limited, each member agrees to contribute an amount not exceeding £1 in the event of the Company winding up while they are a member, or within one year of the member ceasing to be a member. The maximum number of members is 50.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

The committee of trustees shall consist of not less than three nor more than eighteen. One third of the number shall be appointed at the Annual General Meeting for a period of three years. Retiring committee members shall be eligible for reelection. The trustees may co-opt members onto the committee at any time so long as the maximum number of members is not exceeded. Co-opted members are appointed up to the next Annual General Meeting where they may seek reelection.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Induction and training of new trustees

Upon appointment an informal meeting with the new trustee is arranged to discuss the charity's history and procedures. A tour of the home will be arranged to meet residents and staff. Training of trustees is arranged as and when required

Organisational structure

The trustees administer the charity. The chairman/company secretary maintains the financial records of the charity. The house manager oversees the day to day running of the home and care of the residents and supervises the care staff.

Wider network

The charity is affiliated to The Abbeyfield Society

Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error

The trustees have considered the major risks to which the charity is exposed and are establishing procedures to manage those risks

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The trustees acknowledge that the Financial Statements in previous years have been not been prepared fully in accordance with the appropriate SORP. This matter is being corrected in this year, but will take five years to fully work through the accounts

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The charity was established to relieve aged, impotent and poor people of all classes, for the advancement of religion and education and for other charitable purposes beneficial to the community. The charity meets these objectives by providing accommodation, meals and social activities for its residents.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable Activitiesmeetings

During the year considerable decoration has taken place

For most of the year there have been six residents with another on a temporary basis for six weeks

The staff have been working very hard and Mr Desborough and Mrs Morton have made sure that the standard remains first class and the residents happy

In planning the activities, the trustees kept in mind the Charity Commissioner's guidance on public benefit at their meetings

Fundraising Activities

Monies have been raised from public Bingo Sessions and the recycling of aluminium cans

Reserves

To be prudent the Society must build up some cash reserves to offset any period when the number of let rooms is not sufficient to cover current costs. The Trustees consider £20,000 would be a reasonable amount.

ACCOUNTING POLICY

Basis of Accounting

Reserve account

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis and in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards and the 2005 revision of the Statement of Recommended Practice (Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2005)), and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities and the Companies Act 2006

Tangible fixed assets - Freehold property

Depreciation has not been provided as the trustees consider the property is maintained to such a high standard that the residual value of the property is not less than current book value indeed a revaluation has been carried out and the increase in value has been taken to a Revaluation

Tangible Fixed Assets - Fixtures, fittings and central heating

In previous years provision for depreciation has been made in the revenue accounts at 10% or 15% of the written down value. It has now been recognised that all of these items have been paid for out of donated funds and therefore the values should have been written off in the year they were purchased. The donated funds have wrongly been applied to the revenue accounts in the year of donation. To correct this 20% of the written down value as at 31st May 2009 will be charged to the revenue accounts over the next five years.

In this, and future years, where capital items are fully funded by way of donations, the value of the item will be eliminated in the year of purchase

Capital items are considered to be those items that cost more than £500 to purchase

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities

Incoming Resources

Grants and voluntary income are accounted for when the conditions for receipt have been met Grants received for specific earmarked uses are treated as Restricted Funds and are matched with the expenditure that is being funded, subject to any over-riding SORP requirements

Expenditure

Expenditure is classified in the Statement of Financial Activities on a basis consistent with the requirements of the Charities SORP Expenditure on Charitable activities includes the direct costs of the Trust's charitable activities and any depreciation provided on related assets. Support costs have been allocated directly to categories

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity
Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes
Further explanation of the nature and purposes of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements
