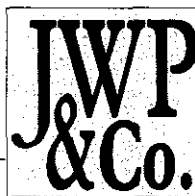

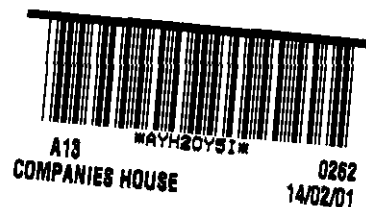

Respective responsibilities of directors and auditors



NOTES TO THE ABBREVIATED ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 JULY 2000

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are set out below and have remained unchanged from the previous year, and also have been consistently applied within the same accounts.

Basis of Preparation of Financial Statements

The full financial statements from which these abbreviated accounts have been extracted, have been prepared in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Small Entities (effective March 2000) under the historical cost convention.

The effect of events in relation to the year ended 31 July 2000 which occurred before the date of approval of the financial statements by the Board of Directors, have been included in the statements to the extent required to show a true and fair view of the state of affairs at 31 July 2000 and of the results for the year ended on that date.

Depreciation

Depreciation has been computed to write off the cost of tangible fixed assets over their expected useful lives using the following rates:

Freehold buildings	- these are maintained so that their value remains unimpaired and therefore no depreciation is provided.
Plant and machinery	- 15% per annum reducing balance
Motor vehicles	- 25% per annum reducing balance

Stocks

Stocks have been valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Deferred Taxation

Deferred taxation is provided on the liability method to take account of timing differences between the treatment of certain items for accounts purposes and their treatment for tax purposes. Tax deferred or accelerated is accounted for in respect of all material timing differences to the extent that it is considered that a net liability may crystallise.

Government grants

Government grants are deducted from the costs of related assets. The effect of this is to defer the grants by reducing the depreciation charges over the expected useful lives of the related assets. This method is in accordance with Statement of Standard Accounting Practice 4 (Revised) but is contrary to paragraphs 17 and 26 Schedule 4 Companies Act 1985 (as amended). However S.227 of that Act also requires the true and fair criteria to override any specific provisions of the Act. The effect of the departure is to understate tangible fixed assets and creditors by £1806 (1999 £2124).

Leasing

Tangible fixed assets acquired under finance leases or hire purchase contracts are capitalised and depreciated in the same manner as other tangible fixed assets. The related obligations, net of future finance charges, are included in creditors. The interest is charged to the profit and loss account over the period of the lease on a straight line basis.

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.
