#### **DIRECTORS' REPORT**

The directors present their annual report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 July 1999.

#### **ACTIVITIES**

The group is involved in farming.

#### REVIEW OF DEVELOPMENTS AND FUTURE PROSPECTS

The company benefited from high potato prices in respect of the 1998 harvest.

It continues to seek diversification away from commodity crops and, during the year, established an organic farm and a crisp manufacturing business and, subsequent to 31 July 1999, purchased a dairy farm.

An attempt to acquire during the year another farm of significant size, meeting our cropping criteria was unsuccessful.

#### **YEAR 2000**

The directors confirm that their computer programmes have been upgraded and are millennium compatible.

#### RESULTS AND DIVIDENDS

The group's trading profit for the year after taxation was £803,000 compared to £523,000 for the year ended 31 July 1999. No dividends were paid in the year (1998 - £Nil paid).

#### **BUILDINGS**

The directors are of the opinion that the market value of the land and buildings is in excess of the net book value, but in the absence of a recent valuation, the amount of the excess is not qualified.

#### DIRECTORS' STATEMENT OF RESPONSIBILITIES

They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the group and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

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#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards. The particular accounting policies adopted are described below.

#### Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention.

#### Basis of consolidation

The consolidated financial statements incorporate the financial statements of Loveden Holdings Limited and its subsidiary company for the year ended 31 July 1999. A separate profit and loss account dealing with the results of the holding company has not been presented in accordance with Section 230 of the Companies Act 1985.

#### Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided on cost in equal annual instalments over the estimated useful lives of the assets. The rates of depreciation are as follows:

Buildings 5% per annum straight line

Motor vehicles (year of acquisition) 36% per annum straight line

Motor vehicles (second and subsequent years) 24% per annum straight line

All other tangible fixed assets 5-25% per annum straight line

#### Investments

Investments held as fixed assets are stated at cost less provision for any permanent diminution in value.

#### Stocks and work in progress

Stocks are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Costs of cultivations include overheads appropriate to the stage of cultivation.

#### Deferred taxation

Deferred taxation is provided on timing differences, arising from the different treatment of items for accounts and taxation purposes, which are expected to reverse in the future, calculated at rates at which it is estimated that tax will arise.

#### Operating leases

Annual rentals are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the lease term.

#### Recognition of area aid income

Area aid income, including set-aside, is recognised in the profit and loss account when the underlying crops are sold. For crops harvested but unsold at the year end date, the relevant area aid and set-aside is treated as deferred income on the balance sheet.

#### 2. TURNOVER

Turnover represents the invoice amount of goods sold and services provided exclusive of value added tax and has been made wholly in respect of the principal activity of the group. The turnover and pre-tax profit, all of which arises in the United Kingdom, is attributable to the company's principal activity.

#### Shares on listed London Stock Exchange

The investment consists of 25.02% (1998 – 20.52%) of the ordinary share capital of Sentry Farming Group plc. The company is incorporated in Great Britain and registered in England and Wales and its principal activities are farming and farm management.

The directors consider the investment to be of long term nature and in 1992 it was written down to a value of £400,000. During the year, the company purchased a further 340,000 shares in Sentry Farming Group plc. The market value at 31 July 1999 was £1,023,393 (1998 - £845,784). At an extraordinary general meeting held on 28 October 1999, the shareholders of Sentry Farming Group plc agreed to the disposal of their farming interests by 30 September 2000. In view of this ongoing transaction, the investment has not been revalued during the year.

Sentry Farming Group plc suffered a loss after tax of £347,000 for the year ended 31 December 1998 and had equity shareholders' funds of £5,286,000. The directors consider that the group's share of the results of Sentry Farming Group plc is not material in relation to the groups' financial statements.

#### Subsidiary undertaking:

The investment consists of 100% (1998 – 100%) of the ordinary share capital of Loveden Estates Limited. The company is incorporated in Great Britain and registered in England and Wales and its principal activity is farming. The subsidiary has been included in the consolidation.

During the year, Loveden Estates Limited also formed a dormant company called Crown Park Foods Limited, with share capital of £2. Loveden Estates Limited holds 100% of the share capital of Crown Park Foods Limited, a company incorporated in Great Britain and registered in England and Wales. The company did not trade during the year.
