Notes to the financial statements

at 30 September 2015

1. Accounting policies

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

Accounting convention

Under an Exploitation Agreement effective 1 December 1992 Warner/Chappell Music International Limited, a fellow subsidiary undertaking, accepted the benefit and burden of the company's rights and obligations under its current and future contracts with third parties. Under the Exploitation Agreement the company's directors have the right to set an annual fee chargeable to Warner/Chappell Music International Limited. In the current year this fee was set at £nil. (2014 £nil).

Cash flow statement

The company has taken advantage of the exemption in the Financial Reporting Standard No.1 Revised (FRS1). A cash flow statement has not been prepared because as at the year end, the company was a wholly owned subsidiary undertaking of Warner Music Group Corp., a company incorporated in the United States of America, which prepares a publicly available consolidated cash flow statement.

Related parties

The company has taken advantage of the exemption in FRS 8 not to disclose related party transactions with fellow wholly-owned subsidiary undertakings.

Going concern

Given the fact that the company does not trade and has positive net assets the directors believe that the company has adequate financial resources to continue in operation for the foreseeable future. The accounts have therefore been prepared on the going concern basis.

Audit Fees

Audit Fees of £500 have been borne by another group undertaking.

2. Profit and loss account

The company has not traded during the year and has made neither a profit nor a loss. No profit and loss account has therefore been prepared.

3. Directors' remuneration

The directors' remuneration was £nil (2014 – £nil).

The directors of the company are also directors of a number of subsidiaries of the ultimate parent undertaking.
