Report of the trustees

for the year ended 30 September 2007

The trustees present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 30 September 2007. The trustees, who are also directors for the purposes of company law and who served during the year and up to the date of this report are set out on page 1.

Structure, governance and management

The Memorandum and Articles of Association of The Abbeyfield Tewkesbury Society Limited were incorporated on the 30th October 1967. These documents define the constitution of the company and set out the management procedures and can be obtained by application to the Secretary.

Briefly, an Executive Committee, also referred to as Directors, manages the Society Members of this committee are elected at an Annual General Meeting and comprise a Chairman, Treasurer and committee members The quorum for meetings is a minimum of three

Objectives and activities

The principal activity of the Society is the provision of accommodation, care and companionship for lonely or frail elderly people in accordance with the aims and principles of the Abbeyfield Society Limited The objects of the Society are more fully explained in the Memorandum of Association, paragraph 3

Achievements and performance

The year has once again proved to be difficult, this time due to the flooding which affected the house and the surrounding area. The residents and many members of the committee were severely affected by the catastrophe but responded in true Dunkirk fashion. The Executive committee meetings have been well attended, and the ladies of the House committee have continued to perform sterling work in support of the residents.

Financial review

The financial results for the year ended 30th September 2007 are as set out in the Statement of Financial Activities The position at the end of the year is shown in the Balance Sheet Further copies of the approved accounts are available from the Administrator The Executive Committee considers that the financial position of the Society is satisfactory

Meetings

The 2007 AGM was held on 27 March 2007 together with an executive meeting. Executive Committee meetings were also held on 19 June, 1 August, 9 October, 4 December and 12 February. The Chairman and Administrator both attended the Wessex region annual conference at Salisbury on 26 November. The Chairman and Administrator also attended several meetings of ANGGOS at Gloucester.

Personnel

Our Administrator, Mr Tony Aldridge submitted his resignation during the year and a recruitment campaign began to find his replacement. The recruitment panel was approved by ANGGOS and consisted of Mr J Gilder, Chairman of Tewkesbury Society, Mr P Purcell, Chairman of Nailsworth society and Mr A Aldridge, ANGGOS Administrator. Mrs Heather Boulton was selected as the new administrator and commenced work on 11 December 2007. Mrs Flo Laker, a long serving relief housekeeper retired in June, and a small party was given for her, which was well attended

We were pleased to welcome two new members of the Executive committee at the December meeting, Mrs D Warren and Mr J Eacott They both have excellent experience and expertise, which should prove to be of great value

Residents

Mrs Irene Davis was displaced from her house due to the floods, and we were able to accomodate her in room 1 Mrs Lucy Paine left in October to move to another Abbeyfield Society in North Wales, which was nearer to her relatives We were pleased to welcome Mr Harry Bailey in February who moved here to be closer to his family. We have been lucky to have almost full occupancy for most of the year. The majority of residents are active and receive close support from their families, but one elderly resident is frail and managing with paid support.

Report of the trustees for the year ended 30 September 2007

Flooding

The whole of the town was affected by the severe flooding of 20 July As the Chairman was marooned, he phoned 999 to ask the emergency services to visit the house, and Mrs Chatham was able to assist them with the evacuation of the residents. The residents were evacuated by the boat to the Council Offices initially. Mrs Chatham accomodated three of the residents overnight and the others were accomodated by their relatives. Frank Jarvis was later accomodated at Cheltenham Abbeyfield, and Phylis Adams and Lucy Paine went to Circncester Abbeyfield. It was fortunate that none of our residents suffered injury during the evacuation.

We are indebted to Mr Richard Chatham for pumping out the cellar on several occasions, and liasing with the electrical engineer. The clearing of the cellar and freezers was an unpleasant task, and again we are indebted to Mr & Mrs Chatham for their hard work and kindness. Unfortunately most members of the committee were occupied with their own problems caused by the flooding.

Luckily we were covered by insurance, and the Insurance Company was very helpful and generous with our claim

Maintenance

Apart from the major damage in the cellar there have continued to be small maintenance tasks throughout the year, which are a drain on our finances. The improvements recommended by the Fire Officer were finally completed in February by the fitment of a special handle to the outside door to the flat occupied by Mrs V Hunt

We are grateful to Andrew Crowther for volunteering to carry out small maintenance tasks around the house. The residents seem to be very pleased with his efforts

Replacements of electrical services in the cellar and repairs to the new boiler caused by flooding were luckily covered by insurance

A visit by an environmental health officer resulted in a number of recommendations for improvements in the kitchen A recommendation for the fitment of fly screens to the kitchen is still outstanding. The windows in the front elevation of the house are in poor condition and several cannot be opened safely. We have received one estimate from Mr Boniface indicating that it will cost £15,000 to replace them. Heather Boulton is persuing several avenues for possible grants towards the cost.

Health & Safety

The Fire Officer's recommendations of January 2007 have largely been incorporated. The only exception is in Mrs Hunt's flat, where it is difficult to relocate items on the landing. The risk assessments were updated, and Mr J Eacott and Mr J Gilder met recently to review them again and change the written format.

There seem to be varying views regarding evacuation of residents in case of fire. We have decided on evacuation as far as possible due to the age of the building. Fire drills have been carried out and recorded, and the fire alarm systems are regularly tested and recorded. All fire equipment is regularly serviced by Cleeve Fire Services.

It is considered that the standard of H & S in the house is good

Security

An attempt was made to break into the conservatory early one morning but the attempt failed. As a result, staff have been warned not to take 'have a go' action, but to call the police immediately

Social

The House committee and Tony Aldridge have been very active in providing several entertainments for the residents Anthea Gray has obtained concessionary tickets for visits to the Roses Theatre on several occasions. Unfortunately some summer events had to be cancelled due to the floods. A christmas lunch was held at Twigworth Lodge on 12 December, and a trip to Deerhurst church on 15 December. Mr & Mrs Chatham entertained us to a delightful tea party at Sherdons. Golf Club on 19 December. Some of the residents visited the Roses to see the pantomime on 1 January. The Rotary Club invited residents to a seniors tea party on 23 February. There was a Roses theatre visit on 11 March. Several invitations have been received for future outings.

Finance

The finances are fully covered in the official accounts and report

The housekeeping allowance was increased to £850 in January to cover increased domestic costs. Staff wages were also reviewed and increased in July 2007. We are extremely grateful for a grant from the Baron Davenport charity, which helped to cover the cost of our new boiler in the cellar. Without the help of charitable donations it would be very difficult for us to continue.

ANGGOS

This year we are no longer strictly ANGGOS (North Gloucestershire Group of Societies) as we have been joined by CHIPPING SODBURY and CIRENCESTER. Tony Aldridge is nearing retirement and it has been proposed and accepted that a new administrator should be appointed to understudy Tony, and eventually take over the wider role Administrative meetings were held in April, July and October. Due to the distances involved, the last meeting was held at Abbeyfield Gloucester, which is an Abbeyfield UK house and centrally situated. As this will definitely be my last year as Chairman at Tewkesbury, I would like another committee member to accompany me to future meetings in order to maintain continuity. The ANGGOS meetings were very useful for information sharing.

General

As usual we congratulate all of the volunteers and staff who give so generously of their time and expertise. Mrs Lesley Chatham in particular has worked very hard in dealing with some very difficult and time consuming matters

A volunteer is required to take over as Chairman in April 2008, and the executive and house committees would both benefit from the addition of new members

Efforts by Nick Coleman (ex-chairman) to find volunteers from Rotary were unfortunately unsuccessful

On a positive note, we look forward to a year with full residency, favourable consideration for one of our charitable requests, and the addition of more volunteers with, hopefully, no outlay on maintenance

Statement of trustees' responsibilities

The trustees are responsible for preparing the annual report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice

1. Accounting policies

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. The accounting policies have been applied consistently throughout the year and the preceding year.

1.1. Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' Statement of Recommended Practice' issued in March 2005 (SORP 2005) and the Companies Act 1985

12. Cashflow

The charity has taken advantage of the exemption in FRS1 from the requirement to produce a cashflow statement because it is a small company

1.3. Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income.

Voluntary income is received by way of grants, donations and gifts and is included in full in the statement of financial activities when receivable. Grants where entitlement is not conditional on the delivery of a specific performance by the charity, are recognised when the charity becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant.

Residential charges ae recognised when the charge is due

Income from investments is included in the year in which it is receivable

1.4 Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability as incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them

1.5. Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost residual value of each asset (excluding freehold land)over its expected useful life, as follows
