Report of the Board of Management

Activities

A membership organisation, NCB was established as a registered charity in 1963. Members are drawn from local authorities, health trusts and other health organisations, independent and voluntary organisations, nurseries, schools, colleges, universities and individuals. NCB members are from England and Northern Ireland, and those in Scotland and Wales are represented by our sister organisations in those nations, Children in Scotland and Children in Wales.

NCB receives financial support from local authorities, charitable trusts and foundations, the corporate sector, government departments and individuals.

Several Councils and Fora are based at NCB and operate under its charitable status. The respective concerns of the Councils and Fora include children and violence, disabled children, drug education, early childhood education, play, and sex education

Current year

In 1999/2000 a period of growth was implicit in our future planning, and that planned growth is now being realised. Over the last few months strategies have been developed and action taken with regard to additional accommodation needs, staffing, IT and other support services.

Collaboration with a range of stakeholders and partners, together with the key elements of participation, policy and advocacy, evidence based research, cross-agency working, development and dissemination have ensured NCB's continued pride of place in the wider children's field. Our work programme, membership and networks are buoyant, and our relationships with several government departments are as strong as ever.

The 1999/2000 Strategic Plan acknowledged that during the course of the year NCB would need to review the appropriateness of its mission and existing six work themes. In autumn 1999 this review began the process of developing operational objectives and outcomes for NCB, and its five-year plan.

Future outlook

NCB's mission has been revised and the new statement is at the front of this document. A new strapline, better reflecting the ethos of the organisation "Making a difference for children and young people" has been adopted.

Six new work themes have been identified to guide our future work:

- promoting participation and young citizenship: effective and meaningful participation in all aspects of their lives so that children and young people have a voice and are partners in change
- communicating positive attitudes and images: demonstrated respect for and understanding of children and young people and the issues important to them
- ensuring effective care, education and relationships: good parenting in its broadest sense, equality of
 opportunity, and family and community resources which allow children and young people to reach their
 full potential
- enhancing health and well-being: improved well-being and self-esteem and a reduction in child health inequalities
- celebrating diversity, valuing differences: equality of opportunity through the recognition, acceptance and valuing of diversity
- developing safe and positive environments: safe, non-violent yet stimulating environments family,

school, community - and spaces - public, domestic and virtual (eg internet)

Some work within each of the six work themes is already planned or underway, otherwise it will be new. Funding, dissemination and marketing strategies will be developed and implemented alongside to contribute to the fulfilment of NCB's thematic work plan and our other operational objectives.

Financial review for the year

The Statement of Financial Activities shows total incoming resources of £4,477,403 (1999 £3,675,003) and a net increase in funds of £308,803 (1998 £40,045 decrease). At the year end NCB has £1,291,291 of restricted funds (1999 £1,108,970), of which £910,108 represents amounts received in advance for projects and £381,183 the funding of certain fixed assets. Unrestricted funds amount to £1,482,623 (1999 £1,356,141), of which £638,111 is designated as funding fixed assets, £458,600 designated for other purposes and £385,912 held in general funds.

Board of Management's responsibilities for the financial statements

Company and charity law requires the Board of Management, as NCB's directors, to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of NCB and of the results of NCB for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the Board are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are responsible and prudent;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume NCB will continue in business; and
- state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements.

The Board are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of NCB and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of NCB and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Risk and internal control

The Trustees have reviewed the financial risks facing NCB, considered their potential impact and likelihood of occurrence and identified the key financial controls in place. Having considered the position, they are of the view that an appropriate control framework is in place to manage such risks.

NCB has adopted procedures to strengthen internal controls and Trustees are satisfied that the systems of control comply in all material aspects with the guidelines issued by the Charity Commission.

Reserves policy

Over the past year the Trustees have updated NCB's general reserves policy taking into account the Charity Commission's guidelines on the topic. The Trustees have determined that general reserves are required to enable NCB to continue its operations in the unlikely event of a significant short term fluctuation in expenditure and income, and to cover unforeseen events beyond its control.

NCB's policy is therefore to hold a general reserve of up to thirteen weeks costs for central support staff and four weeks for project staff, which would amount to £650,000 based on the 2000/1 budget. The general reserve carried at 31 March 2000 was £385,912. Trustees have reviewed the exposure to risk and are of the view that this amount is currently sufficient to cushion short-term fluctuations. The Trustees intend to build up the level of reserves as circumstances permit and in the light of NCB's overall financial position and overall spending priorities.

Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP)

The financial statements have been prepared in compliance with the Statement of Recommended Practice issued under the auspices of the Charity Commission.

Members and sponsors

We would like to thank all our members for their continued support of NCB both financially and in pursuit of its aims and activities. We would also like to express our grateful thanks to government departments, charitable bodies, companies and individuals for their considerable support in financing NCB's activities.

Subsidiary

National Children's Bureau Enterprises Ltd manages the publications and conference programmes and various fundraising activities for NCB. The results of this subsidiary are consolidated in these financial statements.

Parenting Education and Support Forum

The Parenting Education and Support Forum became an independent registered charity in August 1999.

Fixed assets

In our opinion, the present market value of freehold property is above the book value but, in the absence of a current professional valuation, we are unable to quantify the appropriate amount.

Auditors

In accordance with Section 385 of the Companies Act 1985, a resolution proposing that Binder Hamlyn be reappointed auditors will be put to the Annual General Meeting.

Auditors' Report to the Members of the National Children's Bureau

Respective responsibilities of the Board of Management and Auditors

As described on page 3, NCB's Board of Management is responsible for the preparation of the financial statements in accordance with applicable United Kingdom law and accounting standards. Our responsibilities as independent auditors are established in the United Kingdom by statute, the Auditing Practices Board and by our profession's ethical guidance.

Basis of opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with Auditing Standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the Board of Management in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the circumstances of NCB and of the Group, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error. In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial statements.

Opinion

In our opinion the financial statements give a true and fair view of the state of the affairs of NCB and of the Group as at 31 March 2000, and of the Group's incoming resources and application of resources, including its income and expenditure, and cash flows for the year then ended, and have been properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985.

Notes to the Financial Statements

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, with the exception of listed investments, which are included on a market value basis.

The financial statements have been prepared on a line by line basis in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) for Accounting by Charities, applicable accounting standards and the Companies Act 1985.

Group accounts

Group accounts have been prepared on a line by line basis in respect of NCB and its wholly owned subsidiary, National Children's Bureau Enterprises Limited.

Incoming resources

Incoming resources include donations on a received basis, and all other income on a receivable basis in respect of the period.

Resources expended

Expenditure is classified under NCB's principal categories of activity rather than types of expense in order to provide more useful information to users of the accounts. Expenditure comprises direct expenditure, including staff costs, attributable to the activity. Where costs cannot be directly attributed they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with budgeted use of the resources. Project support represents the allocated input into projects and units from the other categories of activity.

Dissemination and promotion includes library and information services, publications, conferences, public relations and marketing. Support services include accommodation, office and IT services, finance, personnel, and equipment depreciation. Administration includes Board of Management, membership administration, audit and general legal expenses.

Fund accounting

Restricted funds are funds subject to specific conditions imposed by donors. The purpose and use of the restricted funds are set out in note 11. Designated funds comprise funds which have been designated at the discretion of the Board of Management for specific purposes. The purposes and use of the designated funds are set out in note 12. The Capital funds in notes 11 and 12 represent the investment in tangible fixed assets. General funds are available for use in furtherance of the general objectives of NCB.

Tangible fixed assets

Freehold property, shown at cost, is depreciated on a straight line basis at 2% per annum of cost of the buildings. Furniture and equipment, shown at cost, is depreciated on a straight line basis at 20% per annum. Library additions are written off in the year of purchase.

Investments

Investments are stated at market valuation. Gains and losses, both realised and unrealised, are disclosed in the statement of financial activities.

Stocks

Stocks are books for resale valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Tax status

NCB is a registered charity and its income is within the exemptions of the Income & Corporation Taxes Act 1988.

Value Added Tax

NCB is a partially-exempt body for VAT purposes. Expenditure subject to VAT, which is not fully recoverable by NCB, is shown inclusive of VAT in the financial statements.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Pension costs

Payments to the pension scheme, which are made in accordance with periodic calculations by consulting actuaries, are charged in the year in which they become payable. Payments are also made to employees' Personal Pensions, and these are also charged in the year in which they become payable.

2. BOARD OF MANAGEMENT AND STAFF

No remuneration is payable to Board of Management members. Out of pocket expenses totalling £1,372 (1998/9 £265) were reimbursed to four members (1998/9 one) of the Board of Management.

14. CONTINGENT LIABILITY
