ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2017

The Trustees (who are also the Directors of the charity, except where otherwise stated) present their report for the year under review.

TITLE

The Society changed its name from The Glossop and District Choral Society to Glossop Choral Society on 7th October 2015.

STATUS

The Society is a registered charity numbered - 260364.

The Society was created a registered company, limited by guarantee, registered number 00972694, on 18th February 1970. The Articles of Association have twice been partially amended and registered since that date, in 1972 and 1975.

This is the Society's governing document.

The Trustees confirm that the financial statements comply with current statutory requirements and with the requirements of the charity's memorandum and articles of association.

ORGANISATION

The Society is managed by a Board of Trustees elected by the Society members at the Annual General Meeting held on the last Wednesday of September each year, and is vested in a Chairman, Vice-chairman, Treasurer and Board of Trustees numbering not less than six and not more than twelve elected trustees. Each trustee is expected to serve on the Board for a period of three years. One third of the Board retires each year, being replaced by others elected at the Annual General Meeting; those having retired being ineligible for re-election for a clear period of one year.

Also elected by the members voting at the Annual General Meeting are the following officers:-Hon. Chairman, Hon. Concerts Secretary, Hon. Treasurer, Hon. Assistant Treasurer, Hon. Librarian, Hon. Publicity Officer, Hon. Stage-Manager, and Hon. Registrar. These officers, if not already directors, are exofficio members of the Board, together with the Society's conductor and musical director (elected each two years) as Vice-Chairman, and the Society's accompanist.

At the first ordinary meeting after the Annual General Meeting, the Board of Trustees appoints a minutes secretary from within their ranks.

ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2017

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

To provide the means and opportunity by which choral music may be studied, practised and performed.

To foster public knowledge and appreciation by the public performance of choral music of a high and acceptable standard.

To encourage musical activity in a wider context by inviting professional soloists, orchestras and instrumentalists to perform with the society.

To pursue policies designed to involve and encourage participation by young people.

Membership of the Society is open to anyone who may apply. This initial application should be made to the Concerts Secretary, stating details of musical ability and experience. Auditions are not required.

Membership subscriptions are the basis of the Society's finance and are decided at the Annual General Meetings. They become payable by all members at the beginning of each new "singing" season (starting in September through to the last concert in May) and certainly before the first concert of that season.

FINANCE

In addition to the members subscriptions, the Society may also receive income from other sources, such as donations (both general and specific, e.g patrons, subscribers etc.), financial grant aid, guarantees against concert losses, sponsorship, programme advertising and fund-raising. All income and assets shall be applied solely in pursuance of the Society's aims and objectives. All funds are unrestricted.

On the "winding-up" of the Society, any remaining assets shall be given to charitable organisations having similar aims and objectives.

REVIEW OF PROGRESS AND ACHIEVEMENTS Chair's report 2016/17

After having moved the AGM from October to January, I would remind members that this report covers the period January to December 2017. In general it has been a pleasure to continue in the post of Chair, and there have been many high points during the last twelve months. The committee as always have been a joy to work with, and always incredibly helpful and supportive. I would like to take this opportunity to express my thanks to them, and to extend my grateful thanks to Matthew our Music Director, for his faithful attendance at committee meetings. It has made such a difference having his input at committee meetings, and also all his hard work at Monday rehearsals and his commitment to helping with the tedious but necessary jobs of setting up for each concert. Let us not forget that Matthew travels every Monday from Sheffield and back to conduct at rehearsals and concerts.

The choir now has a presence on Facebook, something we would not have thought of only four or five years ago. It has helped to raise the choir's profile in the local community which is important in keeping our audiences coming in, plus attracting new members.

ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2017

Our first concert covered by this review, 'The Creation' by Josef Haydn, on Saturday 13th May, was a triumph for the choir, and I would like to echo Matthew's praise for the choir's performance. I have rarely heard the choir sounding better. The only problem was the throat infection suffered by the soprano soloist Jennifer Rust, who bravely continued through the concert in spite of partially losing her voice, though she did decide to drop a couple of solos. We all commended her time on her bravery and determination in continuing with the performance.

The concert on Saturday 11th November, was more of a challenge, although the programme contained some better-known short sacred choral pieces and a fine performance of Mozart's First Violin Concerto which gave the choir a break. The main choir item, 'Lux Aeterna' by Morten Lauridsen proved a challenge, though there were a few choir members who had sung it before with Tameside Festival Chorus. The workshop organised for the first Saturday of September, proved very useful and though we had hoped for better attendance, particularly in the male voice parts, it was a very useful introduction to this little known work. It certainly showed us we would need dedication and hard work to achieve the choir's aim of a public performance to a high standard. The practice tracks which Matthew found proved incredibly useful and have been a great help to many in the choir who were struggling initially.

Our Christmas Concert with Tintwistle Band on Saturday 9th December, was also a great success with the Parish Church full to the rafters again. Everyone greatly enjoyed it and it was a really good way to start off everyone's Christmas celebrations.

Matthew has continued to inspire and encourage us, turning out in all weathers and driving across the Pennines. We all thank him hugely for adopting the 'carrot' approach rather than using the 'big stick'! His patience has been exemplary and he deserves all our thanks and support for the new season. Glenys our accompanist has also continued to turn out in all circumstances. She has in the main recovered from her previous accident when she broke her hip. She has been cheerful and positive in the face of difficulties, and we would also like to thank her for her support and encouragement.

Our finances are as always kept under strict control by our treasurer Lesley, who along with her partner Nick, has also done sterling work helping to transport and set up the staging at our concerts with great help from Michael Hulley and other choir members.

We have also started distributing recruitment flyers in various locations around the area. It may be word of mouth or it may be the recruitment flyers, but we've been pleased to welcome several new members this year, some of whom have actually stayed. Do please keep telling your friends about Glossop Choral Society and encouraging anyone you know who can sing, to take the plunge - come along to a practice and see how they get on.
