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Directors' report

The directors present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2012

Principal activity

The principal activity of the company is the marketing, sale and support of x-ray analytical equipment in the United Kingdom and Ireland

Business review

The result for the year before taxation amounted to a profit of £1,094,818 (2011) profit of £696,574)

In 2012, the business levels in the UK were subdued but not severely. Spending in most sectors was reasonable given the apparent state of the economy and the order income in the XRF product lines was about average over the past 10 year period. Continued growth in the benchtop EDXRF market was seen with the Epsilon 3 range being particularly effective.

The Academic sector (mostly XRD product lines) was quiet in the early part of the year until the Government confirmed its Science spending plans. The final quarter of 2012 saw a resurgence in this sector with a sudden release of funding for capital purchases. PANalytical is benefiting significantly from this round of funding.

The continuance of normal profitability was driven by the sustained activity levels in the Customer Support operations and careful attention to cost management. Also sales of customer training and accessory items were up on 2011, again adding to the return in investment.

The calibration standards production activity located in Nottingham also performed well in the year. A large contract from BGS underpinned a solid return from the combination of internal standards production and third party contract analysis.

Overall the UK and Ireland activity returned a higher than anticipated Trading Profit for the year. The portents for 2013 are currently looking strong driven by Academic funding still flowing through and the dominance of the EDXRF range in the market is bringing significant business.

The company undertakes long term research concentrating on future opportunities in the field of expertise and core competences of the PANalytical Group worldwide. Activities include innovations associated with X-ray scattering equipment, the physics thereof and the applicability to solving problems

Risk management – the key business risks and uncertainties affecting the company are considered to relate to international competition, key employee retention and product availability. The company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Spectris plc, its management of financial risks are controlled at group level. The group's financial risk management objectives and policies are fully disclosed in the accounts of Spectris plc.

No interim dividend was paid during the year (2011 £nil) The directors do not recommend a final dividend (2011 £nil)

Notes

1 Principal accounting policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the company's financial statements

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis in accordance with applicable accounting standards, and under the historical cost accounting rules

Under FRS 1 the company is exempt from the requirement to prepare a cash flow statement on the grounds that a parent undertaking includes the company in its own published consolidated financial statements

As the Company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Spectris plc, the Company has taken advantage of the exemption contained in FRS 8 and has therefore not disclosed transactions or balances with wholly owned subsidiaries which form part of the group

The consolidated financial statements of Spectris plc, within which this company is included, can be obtained from the address given in note 21

Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Depreciation is provided to write off the cost, less estimated residual values, of all tangible fixed assets over their expected useful lives. It is calculated at the following rates

Fixtures and fittings

Life of lease

IT equipment

33% straight line method

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost is based on the cost of purchase on a first in, first out basis. Net realisable value is based on estimated selling price less additional costs to completion and disposal

Operating lease agreements

Costs in respect of operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight-line basis over the lease term

Taxation

The charge for taxation is based on the profit or loss for the year, and takes into account taxation deferred or accelerated because of timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes

Deferred tax is recognised, without discounting, in respect of all timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes which have arisen but not reversed by the balance sheet date, except as otherwise required by FRS 19

1 Principal accounting policies (continued)

Post retirement benefits

Spectris plc operates a defined contribution pension scheme in which the Company participates. The amount charged to the profit and loss account represents the contributions payable to the scheme in respect of the accounting period.

Goodwill

Purchased goodwill (representing the excess of the fair value of the consideration given over the fair value of the separable net assets acquired) arising on business combinations in respect of acquisitions since 1 January 1998 is capitalised. Positive goodwill is amortised to nil by equal annual instalments over its estimated useful life. The estimated useful life of goodwill is 20 years, which is equivalent to the life cycle of PANalytical X-ray analysis equipment.

Basis of translating Foreign Currencies

Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded using the rate of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction Monetary assets in liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated using the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date and the gains or losses on translation are included in the profit and loss account

Turnover

Turnover represents the amounts (excluding value added tax) derived from the provision of goods and services to customers

System sales are recognised when the customer has accepted ownership of the system. Service contract income is recognised at equal monthly instalments over the term of the service contract. All other sales are recognised upon delivery to the customer.

The total turnover of the company for the year has been derived from its principal activity wholly undertaken in the United Kingdom and Ireland

The 2012 Budget on 21 March 2012 announced that the main rate of UK corporation tax would reduce to 24% from 1 April 2012. This was substantively enacted on 26 March 2012.

The 2013 Budget on 20 March 2013 announced that the main rate of UK corporation tax will reduce to 20% by 1 April 2015. This has not been substantively enacted at 21 December 2012 and so has not been reflected in the above figures. The overall effect of the further reductions from 24% to 20%, if these were applied to the deferred tax balances at 31 December 2012, would be to reduce the deferred tax asset by approximately £9,500.
