DIRECTORS' REPORT

The directors present their annual report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2011

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The principal activity of the company continued to be the design and manufacture of telecommunication antenna systems and associated equipment

REVIEW OF THE BUSINESS AND FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

During the year the company's gross margins decreased to 23 % (2010 33%) due to strategic changes in operational strategies and also due to fierce price competition. Turnover increased to £10,120,637 (2010 £8,154 706) from growth in export markets and also expansions in the home market. Profit after tax increased to £886,233 (2010 loss of £333,438) due to a conscious effort to reduce costs and overheads. The company expects revenue to grow in coming years due to developments in the markets and price pressure will continue to drive cost reductions to maintain gross margins.

PRINCIPAL RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The key business and uncertainties affecting the company are considered to relate to competition from both national and international competitors, fluctuations in demand of the wireless industry, commodity price increases and employee retention

KEY PERFORMANCE INDICATORS

Given the straight forward nature of the business, the companies directors are of the opinion that the KPI's necessary for an understanding of the development, performance or position of the business are turnover, gross margin and profit after tax which are commented on above

RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT

The existing product range continues with its prudent policy of expensing research and development in the year in which it is incurred

GOING CONCERN

The company's business activities, together with the factors likely to affect its future development, performance and financial position are set out above. The financial position of the company and its liquidity position are outlined in the profit and loss account and balance sheet.

The company has sufficient financial resources for its operations and as a consequence, the directors believe that the company is well placed to manage its business risks despite the current uncertain economic outlook. The directors have a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus, they continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the annual financial statements.

The directors do not recommend payment of a dividend (2010 £Nil)

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS Year ended 31 December 2011

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention, as modified by the revaluation of certain fixed assets

The company has taken advantage of the exemption for Financial Reporting Standard Number 1 from the requirement to produce a cashflow statement on the grounds that consolidated financial statements are prepared by the parent company

Group financial statements

The financial statements present information about the company as an individual undertaking and not about its group. The company has not prepared group financial statements as it is exempt from the requirements to do so by section 401 of the Companies Act 206 as it is a subsidiary undertaking of Amphenol Corporation, a company incorporated in the USA, and is included in the consolidated financial statements of that company Information relating to the parent company can be found in note 19

Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets other than freehold land are sated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write each asset down to its estimated residual value over its expected useful life as follows.

Freehold buildings 25 years straight line

Plant & machinery 4 to 7 years straight line

Fixtures, fittings and equipment 3 to 7 years straight line

Land Not depreciated

Assets acquired from group companies are depreciated over their remaining useful life

Intangible assets

Patents are capitalised and stated at cost less amortisation. Amortisation is provided at rates calculated to write each asset down over its expected useful life of 4 years.

Investments

Fixed asset investments are stated at cost or valuation less any provision for impairment. All upward movements are taken to the revaluation reserve, with all downward movements being taken to the profit and loss account, or the revaluation reserve to the extent that it reverses a previous revaluation

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowances for obsolete and slow moving items, and include an element of direct labour costs

Leasing

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged against income on a straight line basis over the lease term

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS Year ended 31 December 2011

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Taxation

Current tax is provided at amounts expected to be paid (or recovered) using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events have occurred at that date that will result in an obligation to pay more, or right to pay less

Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that the directors consider that it is more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted

Deferred tax is measured on an undiscounted basis at the tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date

Research and development

Monetary and development expenditure is written off to the profit and loss account in the period in which it is incurred

Foreign currencies

Transactions denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates ruling at the dates of the transactions. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies at the balance sheet date are translated at the rates ruling at that date. These translation differences are dealt with in the profit and loss account.

The results of overseas operations are translated at the average rates of exchange during the period and their balance sheets at the rates ruling at the balance sheet date. Exchange differences arising on the opening net assets and the results of overseas operations are reported in the statement of total recognised gains and losses. All other exchange differences are included in the profit and loss account.

Pensions

In respect of the defined contribution scheme, the pension costs charged against operating profits are the contributions payable to the scheme in respect of the accounting period

The UK Government announced a reduction in the standard rate of UK corporation tax from 28% to 26% effective 1 April 2011 and to 24% effective 1 April 2012. These rate reductions became substantively enacted in March 2011 and March 2012, respectively. Accordingly, the company's profits for this financial year are taxed at an effective rate of 26.5%

The UK Government also proposed changes to further reduce the standard rate of the UK corporation tax by 1% per annum to 22% by 1 April 2014. As these rates were not substantively enacted at the balance sheet date, the rate reduction is not yet reflected in these financial statements in accordance with FRS 19, as it is a non-adjusting event occurring after the reporting period. The effect of these tax rate reductions on the deferred tax balance will be accounted for in the period in which the tax rate reductions are substantively enacted.
