DIRECTORS' REPORT

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2009

The directors present their report and financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2009.

Principal activities and review of the business

The principal activity of the company continued to be that of road transport hauliers.

The continuing economic uncertainty has created a difficult trading environment for the company. Customers, themselves affected by the recession, have curtailed orders and this has reduced the level of activity expected.

The company follows strict quality control procedures to sustain its high standards and to support its risk management policies, which cover continued risk assessments for the health & safety of its employees, vehicle safety and quality, supplier performance, credit risk, liquidity and interest rates.

Results and dividends

The results for the year are set out on page 3.

The directors do not recommend payment of an ordinary dividend.

Future developments

The directors expect that the uncertain global economy will continue and that the company's business will be affected for the upcoming business period. The company's organisation and costs will be adjusted to the expected market demands.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2009

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention.

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis. Whilst the balance sheet shows an excess of liabilities over assets, the directors believe this basis to be appropriate because:

- (a) Whilst further losses have been incurred since the balance sheet date, and company liabilities exceed the assets, subsequent forecasts indicate a return to profitability.
- (b) The company is currently in negotiations with the bank for the continuation of facilities.
- (c) The parent company has undertaken to provide sufficient financial support to enable creditors to be paid as they fall due and for it to continue trading for a period of not less than 12 months.

The financial statements do not include any adjustments that would be necessary if the company were unable to continue as a going concern.

1.2 Turnover

Turnover represents amounts receivable for goods and services net of VAT and trade discounts.

1.3 Goodwill

Acquired goodwill is written off in equal annual instalments over its estimated useful economic life.

1.4 Leasing

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged against income on a straight line basis over the lease term.

1.5 Stock

Stock is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

1.6 Pensions

The company operates a defined contribution scheme for the benefit of its employees. Contributions payable are charged to the profit and loss account in the year they are payable.

1.7 Deferred taxation

Deferred taxation is provided in full in respect of taxation deferred by timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes. The deferred tax balance has not been discounted.

1.8 Foreign currency translation

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate ruling at the date of the transaction. All differences are taken to profit and loss account.

2 Turnover

The total turnover of the company for the year has been derived from its principal activity wholly undertaken in the United Kingdom.
