1 Introduction and Statutory Information

- Giles Frampton and Hamish Adam, both of Richard J Smith & Co, 53 Fore Street, lvybridge, Devon PL21 9AE, were appointed Joint Liquidators of 01102881 Limited (the **Company**) on 17 July 2013 by an Order of the Secretary of State. The winding-up order was made on 12 November 2012 in the High Court no. 6562 of 2012
- The trading address of the Company was Normandy Way, Bodmin, Cornwall PL31 1HH. The company traded under the name Fitzgerald Lighting.
- 1.3 The registered office of the Company has been changed to 53 Fore Street, Ivybridge, Devon PL21 9AE and its registered number is 01102881.
- 1.4 Please note that this report relates to the company that was placed into Administration in December 2008 and not to the successor company that has traded since that time.
- 1.5 The winding up of the Company is for practical purposes complete and this is the Liquidators' final account of the liquidation, which covers the period since the last progress report (the Period)

2 Receipts and Payments

2.1 At Appendix A, I have provided an account of my Receipts and Payments for the Period with a comparison to the Official Receiver's Report. Appendix A also sets out a cumulative account since our appointment, which provides details of the remuneration charged and expenses incurred and paid during the period of the liquidation

3 Work undertaken by the Liquidator

- 3.1 This section of the report provides creditors with an overview of the work undertaken in the liquidation since the last annual report, together with information on the overall outcome of the liquidation.
- 3.2 In the period since the last progress report we have concluded our investigations into potential claims that might be brought. It has not been possible to advance the claims to a stage where proceedings can be issued. The company had a number of potential claims, but for a variety of reasons, and after reviewing information obtained during the liquidation, none of these can be pursued. Our lawyers have assisted and advised us in reaching this conclusion.

Administration (including statutory compliance & reporting)

3.3 As you may be aware, the Liquidators must comply with certain statutory obligations under the Insolvency Act 1986 and other related legislation. The time accrued in meeting this requirement is recorded in the time analyses at Appendix B.

Realisation of Assets

Appendix A shows the receipts and payments made in the Liquidation. The only funds received have been from the creditor that initiated the liquidation, and this amounts to £8,600. £5,000 was received at the outset and £3,600 was received in April 2014.

Creditors (claims and distributions)

- Further information on the outcome for creditors in this case can be found at section 4 of this report. A liquidator is not only required to deal with correspondence and claims from unsecured creditors, but also those of any secured and preferential creditors of the Company. This may involve separate reporting to any secured creditor and dealing with distributions from asset realisations caught under their security, most typically a debenture as well as dealing with the general handling of communications with stakeholders, such as customers and suppliers.
- 3.6 Claims from preferential creditors typically involve employee claims and payments made on behalf of the Company by the Redundancy Payments Service following dismissal. We have not had to deal with such claims in the liquidation.
- 3.7 The above work will not necessarily bring any financial benefit to creditors generally and the more creditors there are on an assignment, the higher the resultant cost will usually be, however a liquidator is required by statute to undertake this work. In this case no significant work has been conducted is respect of dealing with creditor claims, save for dealing with general enquiries

Investigations

- 3.8 As you may be aware, in a compulsory liquidation the duty to investigate the Company's affairs is the responsibility of the Official Receiver. There is no requirement on the Liquidator to submit a report or return on the directors' conduct to the Department for Business, Energy & Industrial Strategy, however where matters are brought to the Liquidators' attention these are reported as appropriate to the Official Receiver for further consideration.
- 3.9 The Joint Liquidators' investigations have not revealed any issues requiring further report but, as noted in 2.1 above, enquiries into potential claims have been conducted and have now concluded

4 Outcome for Creditors

Secured Creditors

4.1 The Administrators of the company paid the principal debt of the two secured creditors. Interest and charges were not paid, but in light of there being no funds available for distribution there will be no further distribution in this respect.

Preferential Creditors

4.2 Preferential creditors were paid in full by the Administrators.

Unsecured Creditors

There are unsecured claims of £8,989,190 as set out in the Administrators' final report. There will be no distribution to unsecured creditors due to the lack of available funds.

Notice of no dividend payable

4.4 In accordance with rule 14.37 Insolvency Rules 2016, I can confirm that the funds realised in the liquidation have been used for paying the expenses of the liquidation and therefore the liquidators are unable to declare any dividend to any class of creditor.

5 Liquidators' Remuneration

- 5.1 The creditors approved that the basis of the Joint Liquidators' remuneration be fixed by reference to the time properly spent by them and their staff in managing the Liquidation.
- 5.2 The Liquidators' time costs for the period from 17 July 2013 to 3 April 2018 are £39,544.50. This represents 245.18 hours at an average rate of £161.29 per hour.
- 5.3 The Liquidators' time costs or the period since the last progress report are £3,079 being 21.9 hours at an average rate of £140,59.
- 5.4 Attached as Appendix B is a time analysis which provides details of the activity costs incurred by staff grade. To date, £6,293 has been drawn on account and no further remuneration will be drawn. Expenses and disbursements of £4,337.2 have been incurred as set out in Appendix B. The funds were provided by a creditor of the company in order to fund the investigation.

- 5.6 A narrative explanation of the work undertaken by the Liquidators during the Period can be found at section 3 of this report.

6.1 This final account will conclude my administration of this case. The Notice accompanying this account explains creditors' rights on receipt of this information and also when the liquidators will vacate office and obtain our release as liquidators.
