1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

These financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis. The company is dependent on the support of its parent undertaking, Bryanston School Incorporated, which has a loan account of £284,573 included within creditors due within one year and has given written confirmation that it does not intend to withdraw existing funds within the next twelve months. The going concern basis is therefore considered to be appropriate and the financial statements do not contain any adjustments that might be necessary if the support were withdrawn.

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective June 2002).

Turnover

Turnover represents net invoiced sales of goods and services, excluding value added tax.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Buildings

- 4% on cost

Plant, furniture and equipment

- 10% to 25% on cost

Deferred taxation

Provision is made at current rates for taxation deferred in respect of all material timing differences except to the extent that, in the opinion of the directors, there is reasonable probability that the liability will not arise in the foreseeable future.
