NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

- 1 The decrease in donations to General/Designated Funds in 2017 was 15.3% (2016 1.8% Increase)
 However, we received a very generous legacy from a former senior voluntary helper in 2017.
- 2 Depreciation on machinery and equipment has been made at an average of 9.2% (2016 9.4%) by calculating the estimated worth.
- 3 The mission expends no funds in payment of personnel, directors fees etc, other than re-imbursement of expenses as shown on page 4, note 4.
- 4 The mission is totally supported by voluntary donations. There is no 'Trading' or 'Profit & Loss Account', but purely an account for 'Income & Expenditure'.
 Any surplus funds are carried forward to fund future expenditure.
 General Cash reserves at the year end represent approximately 59 months expenditure (2016 4.38 months)
- 5 For the purposes and requirements of both the GOSPEL PRINTING MISSION and the CHARITY COMMISSION, together with public accountability, the accounts have been independently examined by R I Smith ACA as under:

ACHIEVEMENTS & PERFORMANCE

Whatever has been achieved during 2017 has been done by the grace of God, the active team being channels through which God has worked. All praise must be given to God.

The public benefit cannot be easily quantified, here on page 2 we have a sample of many quotations from letters, and on page 3 we have detailed statistics of the various types of publications — i.e. easy to read basic literature to somewhat larger publications which move to basic teaching. The vocabulary used in publications ranges between 1,000 - 3,000 words approximately to suit the literacy level of the reader, thereby encouraging the development of reading ability in addition to the Christian message. When a person comes to personal faith in Christ, there are practical benefits as well. For example, if the person was an alcoholic, a drug addict etc, it is expected that this will change for the better. Families who are in poverty because of these situations start to feel the benefit, as money squandered on drink and drugs is spent on food, clothing etc. The whole community benefits.

Quotes from letters received from missionaries and national workers during 2017, appreciating the literature received in various languages, and one missionary comments on the adaptability for African readers, young and adult.

MADAGASCAR Brother Xavier writes:

"Greetings, Good morning Gospel Printing Mission. We are so excited while writing because we received a precious parcel from you in **ENGLISH & FRENCH**. Thank you for the form of the tracts that is really adapted for African readers, young and adults. All the different topics and mostly the short insight will encourage many to enjoy reading it. ... We would be glad to receive more. God bless you for your gift. In Him, Xavier NKEMBE."

ZAMBIADerrick Zulu writes: "I greet you in the Name of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ. I would like to let you know that we received the NYANJA, ENGLISH & BEMBA tracts you sent. Thank you for considering our request and they came at the right time we were reaching part of Northern Province. The material is of rich importance and encouragement to the people, especially in places where people have not received much of the true Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ to those who eagerly want to receive the Gospel and new believers. And also in empowering / equipping of the believers / disciples to be able to share the Good News to other people in their localities / communities..."

BRAZIL Walter & Elizabeth Alexander write: "The monthly Bible School recommenced on Saturday 18th, February and we were delighted to see almost 100 in attendance. Young folks are by far the greatest group in attendance. ... We have found that to maintain and increase interest on the part of members there is no substitute for sound, consecutive teaching of the Word. ... Elizabeth and I want to thank you for your kindness in providing a substantial amount of good literature, in PORTUGUESE. This is distributed faithfully among the churches here in Uberlândia. ... Brother José distributes your leaflets every month at a local market and rides local buses to distribute to those who travel. We gratefully acknowledge the receipt of parcels 1272 / 7013, 7026, 7038, & 7043. We register our deep appreciation and thanks."

RWANDA Omar Ndamutsa shares: "Greetings ... I am writing to acknowledge reception of two parcels of printed literature in ENGLISH & FRENCH. In fact these printed copies will help us witnessing as we had no literature. When I was reading the languages that you print in and the main areas of use, I was so sad to see all our neighbouring countries except mine, Rwanda. Then I asked myself what I can contribute so that KINYARWANDA will be in the list."

INDIA Ruel Pakrin shares: "I thank you for sending the parcel of Gospel tracts in NEPALI, HINDI & ENGLISH recently which I received safely and in time. ... It is a great tool for evangelism. The tracts are very good and are printed very well. May God bless your work."

Pappy Daniel writes: "This is a quick note to thank you for one package of HINDI tracts received this morning (July \mathcal{I} ; sent July 15, 2017). Please be assured we shall use these tracts prayerfully and carefully. It will be wonderful if you can provide us with a qantity of tracts in Malayalam language. Over 32 million people speak this language here in INDIA. We can translate any ENGLISH tracts you send us. Thank you. Heavy Monsoon rains and wind were here. There was some flooding in the streets and one of our big tress (Ebony) fell down, but thank God there was no damage for the buildings or to the crops to feed the children. His goodness and mercy indeed! Pray for the protection of our children from a flu virus going on after the arrival of heavy rains and winds. With loving greetings from all here, Pappy - P.S. We would love to have further supplies of tracts in HINDI."

PRODUCTION OF LITERATURE

To simply quote the quantity of tracts and booklets printed during 2017 would be meaningless. The sizes of publications, the number of impressions (passes through the press) per copy, all need to be taken into account. A somewhat detailed analysis follows covering EIGHT aspects of production; each aspect has been given a 'performance mark', the eight aspects then being averaged to give an overall performance mark to reflect relative progress.
