DIRECTORS' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2009

The directors present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2009.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES AND REVIEW OF BUSINESS

The principal activity of the company during the year was that of engineering project management.

The Directors use a range of performance measures to monitor and manage the business. Certain of these are particularly important in the generation of shareholder value and are considered key performance indicators (KPIs). Our KPIs measure past performance and also provide information to allow us to manage the business in the future. Loss before tax and operating cash flow indicate the activity of the company, and the efficiency with which we have turned operating performance into cash. KPIs for 2009 are shown in the table below, along with prior year comparatives.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2009

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 BASIS OF PREPARATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

At the balance sheet date the company's net liabilities exceeded its assets. The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis as in the opinion of the directors the company will receive continued support from the other Pell Frischmann Group companies for the foreseeble future.

1.2 CASH FLOW

The company, being a subsidiary undertaking where 90% or more of the voting rights are controlled within the group whose consolidated financial statements are publicly available, is exempt from the requirement to draw up a cash flow statement in accordance with FRS 1.

1.3 TURNOVER

Turnover comprises revenue recognised by the company in respect of goods and services supplied, exclusive of Value Added Tax and trade discounts.

1.4 DEFERRED TAXATION

Full provision is made for deferred tax assets and liabilities arising from all timing differences between the recognition of gains and losses in the financial statements and recognition in the tax computation.

A net deferred tax asset is recognised only if it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are calculated at the tax rates expected to be effective at the time the timing differences are expected to reverse.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are not discounted.

2. TURNOVER

All turnover arose within the United Kingdom.
