#### THE DIRECTORS' REPORT

#### YEAR ENDED 31st MARCH 2012

The directors have pleasure in presenting their report and the financial statements of the company for the year ended 31st March 2012

#### PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES AND BUSINESS REVIEW

The principal activity of the company during the year was that of general engineering

This year has been a stronger year for the group with some large contracts being won and levels of production increasing above that of the previous year Turnover has increased due to winning new customers and some large contracts from existing customers. A small increase in staff were able to cope with the added workload through increased productivity and availability of overtime.

Gross profit has increased to 24 91% from 15 12% in the previous year which is more in line with previous years figures

Towards the year end there was a reduction in contracts in place but this reflects the nature of the business and is not expected to be an issue in the longer term

#### RESULTS AND DIVIDENDS

The profit for the year amounted to £277,988 The directors have not recommended a dividend

# FINANCIAL RISK MANAGEMENT AND OBJECTIVES

The company has an established, structured approach to risk management. The company's activities expose it to a variety of financial risks, including the effects of credit, liquidity and cash flow, and interest rate risks. The company has adopted risk management policies that seek to mitigate these risks in a cost effective manner. Financial assets that expose the company to financial risk consist primarily of trade debtors and cash. Financial liabilities that expose the company to financial risk consist principally of trade creditors, and hire purchase agreements.

Credit risk is the risk of loss in the value of financial assets due to counterparties failing to meet all or part of their obligations. The company performs ongoing credit evaluation of its customers' financial condition.

Liquidity risk is the risk that the company does not have sufficient liquid assets to meet its obligations as they fall due Liquidity is maintained at a prudent level and the company ensures there is an adequate liquidity buffer to cover contingencies. The company maintains sufficient cash and open committed credit lines from its bankers to meet its funding requirements.

Interest rate risk with regards unfavourable movements in interest rates is not perceived as being material to the accounts due to the amount of interest being received on deposits

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### **Basis of accounting**

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention

#### Cash flow statement

The directors have taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (Revised 1996) from including a cash flow statement in the financial statements on the grounds that the company is wholly owned and its parent publishes a consolidated cash flow statement

#### Turnover

Turnover represents the value of sales made during the year net of discounts, returns and Value Added Tax For goods sold, turnover is recognised when the goods are physically delivered to the customer and for services

In respect of long-term contracts and contracts for on-going services, turnover represents the value of work done in the year, including estimates of amounts not invoiced. Turnover in respect of long-term contracts and contracts for on-going services is recognised by reference to the stage of completion and includes profit in accordance with UITF40

The adjustment in respect of UITF 40 is included within turnover and other debtors

#### Fixed assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost

#### Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows

Alterations to Premises - 2% Reducing Balance
Plant & Machinery - 10% Reducing Balance
Office Equipment - 10% Reducing Balance
Motor Vehicles - 25% Reducing Balance
Loose Tools - 20% Reducing Balance
Renewable Energy Installations - 25% Reducing Balance

#### Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items

#### Hire purchase agreements

Assets held under hire purchase agreements are capitalised and disclosed under tangible fixed assets at their fair value. The capital element of the future payments is treated as a liability and the interest is charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis.

#### Pension costs

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme for employees. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the company. The annual contributions payable are charged to the profit and loss account.

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

#### **Deferred taxation**

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events have occurred at that date that will result in an obligation to pay more, or a right to pay less or to receive more tax, with the following exceptions

Provision is made for tax on gains arising from the revaluation (and similar fair value adjustments) of fixed assets, and gains on disposal of fixed assets that have been rolled over into replacement assets, only to the extent that, at the balance sheet date, there is a binding agreement to dispose of the assets concerned. However, no provision is made where, on the basis of all available evidence at the balance sheet date, it is more likely than not that the taxable gain will be rolled over into replacement assets and charged to tax only where the replacement assets are sold.

Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that the directors consider that it is more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted

Deferred tax is measured on an undiscounted basis at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which timing differences reverse, based on tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date

#### Financial instruments

Financial liabilities and equity instruments are classified according to the substance of the contractual arrangements entered into. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the entity after deducting all of its financial liabilities.

Where the contractual obligations of financial instruments (including share capital) are equivalent to a similar debt instrument, those financial instruments are classed as financial liabilities. Financial liabilities are presented as such in the balance sheet. Finance costs and gains or losses relating to financial liabilities are included in the profit and loss account. Finance costs are calculated so as to produce a constant rate of return on the outstanding liability.

Where the contractual terms of share capital do not have any terms meeting the definition of a financial liability then this is classed as an equity instrument. Dividends and distributions relating to equity instruments are debited direct to equity

#### Grants received

Grants of a revenue nature are credited to income so as to match them with the expenditure to which they relate
