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1 Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared on the historical cost basis of accounting and in accordance with applicable UK accounting standards. The Company is exempt from producing group financial statements, under s400 of the Companies Act 2006, as its ultimate parent undertaking prior to the transaction on 3 November 2014, United Biscuits Luxco SCA, has produced group financial statements as at 3 January 2015. These financial statements solely relate to UB Humber Limited.

Taxation

Current taxation for the current and prior periods is provided at the amount expected to be paid (or recovered) using the tax rates and tax laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

Deferred taxation is provided in full on temporary differences which result in an obligation at the balance sheet date to pay more tax, or the right to pay less tax, at a future date, at tax rates expected to apply when the timing differences reverse based on tax rates and tax laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date. Temporary differences arise from the inclusion of items of income and expenditure in taxation computations in periods different from those in which they are included in the financial statements.

Deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is regarded as more likely than not that they will be recovered. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are not discounted.

Interest income

Interest income is recognised as it accrues.

Cash flow statement

The Company has not produced a cash flow statement as its ultimate parent undertaking prior to the transaction on 3 November 2014, United Biscuits Luxco SCA has prepared a consolidated cash flow statement as at 3 January 2015.

9 Inter-group cross-guarantee

The Company, together with other subsidiary undertakings in the United Biscuits Group, has cross-guaranteed the Group's Senior facility, which is held by UMV Global Foods Company Limited. The amount outstanding under the facility as at 3 January 2015 was £908.4 million.
