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## Directors' Report For The Year Ended 31 December 2005

The directors present their report and the audited financial statements of the Company for the year ended 31 December 2005.

#### **Principal activity**

The Company's principal activity during the year was to act as an intermediate parent Company.

#### Review of business and future developments

No change is anticipated to the principal activity in the foreseeable future.

#### Results and dividends

The profit for the year after taxation amounted to £265,000 (2004: £395,000). The Directors do not recommend the payment of a dividend (2004: £1,000,000).

The directors had no interest in the shares of the Company at any point during the year. The interest of Mr D Lavelle, who is also a director of the ultimate parent company, Alfred McAlpine plc, is shown in the annual report of that company. The other directors did not hold any interest in Alfred McAlpine plc at any point during the year.

#### Statement of Directors' responsibilities

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year that give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the profit or loss of the company for that period. The directors are required to prepare financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.

The directors confirm that suitable accounting policies have been used and applied consistently in the year as explained under note 1 'Principal accounting policies'. They also confirm that reasonable and prudent judgements and estimates have been made in preparing the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2005 and that applicable accounting standards have been followed.

The directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

#### Financial risk management

The company's main financial risk relates to debtor and creditor balances with fellow subsidiaries of the ultimate parent, Alfred McAlpine plc, which has confirmed its continued financial support to all its subsidiaries.

#### 1 Accounting Policies

#### (a) Accounting convention

The accounts are prepared on the going concern basis under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Companies Act 1985 and applicable accounting standards. The principal accounting policies are set out below.

#### (b) Statement of cash flows

A group statement of cash flows is contained in the accounts of the ultimate parent undertaking, Alfred McAlpine plc. Consequently, under the terms of FRS1 (revised) the Company is exempt from the requirement to prepare a cash flow statement.

#### (c) Investment in foreign subsidiary undertaking

Fixed asset investments in subsidiaries and associates are shown at cost less provision for impairment.

Differences arising in the retranslation of the investment in a foreign subsidiary undertaking and related net foreign currency borrowings are taken to reserves. When movements in the borrowings exceed the movement in the investment, the net difference is taken to the profit and loss account.

#### (d) Deferred taxation

Full provision is made at anticipated rates for taxation deferred as a result of accelerated capital allowances and short term timing differences.
