

1 Accounting policies

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2005).

The company has taken advantage of the exemptions in Financial Reporting Standard No. 1 from the requirement to produce a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is a small company.

Turnover

Turnover comprises rent and service charges receivable.

Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Depreciation has been provided at the following rates in order to write down the cost or valuation, less estimated residual value, of all tangible fixed assets, by reducing balance method over their expected useful lives:

Leasehold properties	Over remaining lease term
Furniture and equipment	25 % on reducing balance
Computer equipment	25 % on reducing balance

Investment properties

In accordance with paragraph 5.37 of Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2005) , no depreciation is provided in respect of freehold investment property.

This policy represents a departure from statutory accounting principles, which require depreciation to be provided on all fixed assets. However, such properties are not held for consumption but for investment and the directors consider that systematic annual depreciation would be inappropriate in order that the Financial Statements may give a true and fair view. The effect of the overriding this requirement to depreciate is not considered to be material.

Investment property is included in the balance sheet at its historical cost and not at its open market value as required by paragraph 5.38 of Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2005). The directors are unable to quantify the effect of the departure from this Standard as no formal valuation has been obtained.

Stock

Stock consists of library material which is valued at cost less a wear and tear provision of 25% per annum on a reducing balance basis. The resulting stock values are further written down to net realisable values, where these are lower.

Deferred taxation

The charge for taxation takes into account taxation deferred as a result of timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes. In general, deferred taxation is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date. However, deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that the directors consider that it is more likely than not that they will be recovered against the reversal of deferred tax liabilities or other future taxable profits. In accordance with FRS19, deferred tax is not recognised on revaluation gains. Deferred taxation is measured on a non-discounted basis at the average tax rates that would apply when the timing differences are expected to reverse, based on tax rates and law that have been enacted by the balance sheet date.
