#### 1. Accounting policies

#### Basis of preparation

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008)

The group has strong financial resources and the company is continuing in its role within the wider group. As a consequence, the directors believe that the company is well placed to manage its business risks successfully

The directors have a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus they continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the annual financial statements.

#### Fixed assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost

#### Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets, at rates calculated to write off the cost, less estimated residual value based on prices prevailing at the date of acquisition of each asset evenly over its expected useful life, as follows

Plant and equipment

10 years

Motor vehicles

4 years

#### Stocks

Stocks are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost includes all costs incurred in bringing each product to its present location and condition

Net realisable value is based on estimated selling price less any further costs expected to be incurred to completion and disposal

#### Deferred taxation

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events have occurred at that date that will result in an obligation to pay more, or a right to pay less or to receive more, tax, with the following exceptions

- provision is made for tax on gains arising from the revaluation (and similar fair value adjustments) of fixed assets, and gains on disposal of fixed assets that have been rolled over into replacement assets, only to the extent that, at the balance sheet date, there is a binding agreement to dispose of the assets concerned. However, no provision is made where, on the basis of all available evidence at the balance sheet date, it is more likely than not that the taxable gain will be rolled over into replacement assets and charged to tax only where the replacement assets are sold,
- deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that the directors consider that it is more likely
  than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying
  timing differences can be deducted

Deferred tax is measured on an undiscounted basis at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which timing differences reverse, based on tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date

#### Leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to income on a straight line basis over the term of the lease

#### 1. Accounting policies (continued)

#### Pension costs

The C F Booth Limited group operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions are charged to the profit and loss account as they become payable in accordance with the rules of the scheme

#### 2. Turnover

Turnover comprises the invoice value of goods and services supplied by the company exclusive of VAT and is attributable to one continuing activity. All turnover is derived from customers within the EU

Factors affecting future tax charges

On 22 June 2010, the UK government announced proposals to reduce the main rate of corporation tax from 28% to 24% over 4 years with effect from 1 April 2011 As of 31 March 2010, the tax rate change was not substantially enacted

In addition, changes to the capital allowances regime were proposed including a reduction in the rate of capital allowances on plant and machinery additions from 20% to 18% and a reduction in the rate of the special rate pool from 10% to 8% with effect from 1 April 2012 As of 31 March 2010, this proposal was not substantially enacted
