REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2004

The directors present their report with the financial statements of the company for the year ended 31 December 2004.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The principal activity of the company is the manufacture of metal roofing and cladding systems.

REVIEW OF BUSINESS

The results for the year and financial position of the company are as shown in the annexed financial statements.

The directors envisage that the company is in a position to take advantage of any new opportunities which may arise in the future. The company continues to invest in research and development in order to maintain and develop its position in the market for its products.

A reconstruction took effect on 27 April 2004 in order to separate the manufacturing and non-manufacturing element of the group. Prior to the reconstruction Euro Clad Limited was the parent of Euro Clad (Developments) Limited, Euro Clad (Holdings) Limited and Euro Clad (Investments) Limited. As part of the reconstruction, Euro Clad (Holdings) Limited became the parent of Euro Clad Limited and Euro Clad (Investments) Limited became the parent of Euro Clad (Developments) Limited.

The non-manufacturing business assets, bank loan and investment in Euro Clad (Developments) Limited were transferred to Euro Clad (Investments) Limited from Euro Clad Limited. The net value of the assets transferred was £2,192,285, which reflected the carrying values at 1 January 2004. The transfer was made by means of a special dividend as shown in Note 7.

DIVIDENDS

The dividend relates to the transfer of certain assets and liabilities on the reconstruction of the group as referred to above

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

Turnover

The turnover shown in the profit and loss account represents amounts invoiced during the year, exclusive of Value Added Tax.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life or, if held under a finance lease, over the lease term, whichever is the shorter.

Freehold property

2% & 10% straight line (excluding land)

Plant & machinery

Various rates based on the expected life of the assets (10 - 40%

straight line)

Motor vehicles

25% & 33.33% straight line

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost.

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Deferred tax

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events have occurred at that date that will result in an obligation to pay more, or a right to pay less or to receive more tax, with the following exceptions:

Provision is made for tax on gains arising from the revaluation (and similar fair value adjustments) of fixed assets, and gains on disposal of fixed assets that have been rolled over into replacement assets, only to the extent that, at the balance sheet date, there is a binding agreement to dispose of the assets concerned. However, no provision is made where, on the basis of all available evidence at the balance sheet date, it is more likely than not that the taxable gain will be rolled over into replacement assets and charged to tax only where the replacement assets are sold;

Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that the directors consider that it is more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted.

Deferred tax is measured on an un-discounted basis at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which timing differences reverse, based on tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date.

Research and development

Expenditure on research and development is written off in the year in which it is incurred.

Foreign currencies

Assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of transaction. Exchange differences are taken into account in arriving at the operating result.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS - continued FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2004

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

Hire purchase agreements

Assets obtained under hire purchase contracts or finance leases are capitalised in the balance sheet. Those held under hire purchase contracts are depreciated over their estimated useful lives. Those held under finance leases are depreciated over their estimated useful lives or the lease term, whichever is the shorter.

The interest element of these obligations is charged to the profit and loss account over the relevant period. The capital element of the future payments is treated as a liability.

Operating lease agreements

Rentals applicable to operating leases where substantially all of the benefits and risks of the ownership remain with the lessor are charged against profits on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Pensions

The company participated in a defined benefit pension scheme for eligible employees. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the company. The fund has been valued every three years by a professionally qualified independent actuary, the rates of contributions payable being determined by the actuary. In the intervening years the actuary has reviewed the continuing appropriateness of the rates. Pension costs have been accounted for on the basis of charging the expected cost of providing pensions over the period during which the company benefits from the employees' services. The effects of variation from regular cost have been spread over the expected average remaining service lives of the members of the scheme.

In addition, the company contributes to defined contribution pension schemes. The assets of the schemes are held separately form those of the company in independently administered funds. The pension cost charge represents contributions payable by the company to the funds.

Investments

Fixed asset investments are stated at cost. Provision is made, where necessary, for any permanent diminution in value.

2. TURNOVER

The turnover and profit before tax are attributable to the one principal activity of the company.

In accordance with Section 55(5) of Schedule 4 of the Companies Act 1985, the directors do not propose to disclose an analysis of turnover by geographical markets as they consider that this would be seriously prejudicial to the interests of the company.

27. PENSIONS

Up until 1 August 2001 the company participated in a multi-employer pension scheme operated by Legal & General Assurance Society Limited providing benefits based on final pensionable salary. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the company. The winding up of this scheme commenced on 1 August 2001 and no contributions have been made to this scheme since that date. Contributions have been made to the defined contribution pension plans of employees since 1 August 2001.

The total pension cost for the company in respect of the Legal & General Scheme was £Nil (2003 - £Nil). The pension cost was assessed in accordance with the advice of an independent qualified actuary using the projected unit method. The latest actuarial valuation of the Legal & General Scheme was at 1 August 1998. The assumptions that had the most significant effect on the valuation were those relating to the rate of return on investments and the rates of increase in salaries and pensions. It was assumed that the investment return would be 8% per annum, that salary increases would average 6.25% per annum and that, as prescribed by the Pensions Act 1995, pensions earned after 5 April 1997 would increase in line with the Retail Price Index, subject to a maximum of 5% per annum.

At the date of the latest actuarial valuation, the market value of the assets of the multi-employer scheme was £2,474,000 and the actuarial value of the assets was sufficient to cover 93% of the benefits which has accrued to members, after allowing for expected future increases in earnings. The valuation is currently being updated and any resulting deficit is not expected to be material. An amount of £30,000 (2003 - £50,000) is included in other creditors which represent the excess of the accumulated pension cost over the payment of contributions to the pension fund. Due to the nature of this scheme, i.e multi employer, the company is unable to identify its share of this scheme's underlying assets and liabilities and consequently has taken advantage of the disclosure exemption allowed by the Financial Reporting Standard No. 17 ("Accounting for Pension Costs").

The company made contributions of £48,718 (2003 - £51,494) to the defined contribution plans of employees and directors during the year. At the year end £5,229 (2003 - £3,532) of contributions were outstanding.
