The directors present their report with the financial statements of the company for the year ended 31st December 2011

Principal activity

The principal activity of the company in the year under review was to give young people throughout the United Kingdom the opportunity to participate in all aspects of music theatre to the highest standard, including the creation of new music repertoire

Company status

The Children's Music Theatre Limited, trading as National Youth Music Theatre, company registration No 1508781, registered office, 4 Goodwins Court, London WC2N 4LL The company is limited by guarantee having no share capital and is a Registered Charity, number 281159

Review of business

The results for the year and financial position of the company are as shown in the annexed financial statements

Finances

The company recorded a profit for the year of £5,734 (2010 loss £11,318)

As set out in the Articles of Association, the Chair is elected by the Board Directors are appointed by the Board and from 2002, serve a term of three years, with a maximum of two consecutive terms of office, after which there must be a break of service of at least 12 months

Governance

New directors undergo induction with the Chair and orientation to brief them on their legal obligations under charity and company law, the content of the Memorandum and Articles of Association, the committee and decision making processes, the Vision, Mission and Strategic Aims of the Board and recent financial performance of the organisation. During the induction, they meet key employees and other directors. Away days are set in place to facilitate directors' input into strategic planning. Directors are encouraged to attend appropriate external training events as appropriate to their role.

Risk management

During 2011, attention has focused on all practices and procedures, as noted in the Directors' Report.

Trustees' Report on activity during the year and planning

The opportunity to restage *Sweeney Todd* at the International Youth Arts Festival in Kingston in July 2011 allowed the company to present its outstanding work to a wider audience without major financial risk or sacrifice

The company website was significantly overhauled and modernised and full advantage was taken of social media in order to network and promote NYMT's work and attract new members. A revitalised Workshop Programme was put in place and news of the company's activities was disseminated via emails and newsletters to thousands of UK schools and to a membership of over 3,000 young people. High profile alumni joined a creative team of industry professionals to lead workshops and master classes, which proved extremely popular, and new board members were recruited. Internships were offered in the production office and a part-time Fundraising Officer was sought whilst efforts were made to reconnect with Trusts and Foundations, and others who might support NYMT's work.

A former associate musical director of the company, now a board member, took over as a voluntary artistic director/producer and strategies were put in place to enable the company to continue its vital educational work whilst rebuilding its finances

Plans were also put in place to develop one the NYMT's most exciting seasons to date for 2012. The American composer, playwright and lyricist, Jason Robert Brown, was approached with regard to plans to showcase his work in the NYMT's 2012 season. Brown, who has been hailed as "one of Broadway's smartest and most sophisticated songwriters since Stephen Sondheim" (Philadelphia Inquirer) and is especially popular with young musical theatre students, responded by offering to direct NYMT himself in his most recent work, 13 The Musical, and to lead casting auditions and residential rehearsals. A West End theatre – the Apollo – was secured for the performances and news of these plans was quickly promoted in the theatre press.

Meanwhile, an invitation was received from Buckingham Palace for the company to perform at A Celebration of Young People in the Performing Arts on the occasion of a reception given by HM The Queen on 9 May 2011

Auditions were held to recast a small number of parts in *Sweeney Todd* for which original company members were unable to commit A decision was also taken to expand the cast numbers and the original orchestra also increased. Sarah Redmond, who had assisted Martin Constantine in the previous production, took over as director and, since this version would be in a state-of-the-art theatre in Kingston rather than a Victorian warehouse, a new approach was taken, offering the opportunity for the company members to re-examine their characters and present an entirely different realisation. The resulting performances were very well attended and received glowing reviews.

Four Youth Ambassadors were appointed from the 2011 Company to promote the work of the NYMT and to add their younger voices to discussions and decision-making processes. One was chosen to represent the youth of the organisation at board meetings. Amongst their suggestions was the desire to promote open access workshops in underprivileged areas. With the support of NYMT patron, Jude Law, plans to put such ideas into practice are now well advanced.

Over the course of the year the National Youth Music Theatre has done much to re-establish its reputation and to continue its pursuit of excellence in helping young people realise their potential

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 2011

1 Accounting policies

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. The accounting policies have been applied consistently throughout the period.

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis under the historical cost convention and in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities – Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP 2005) issued in March 2005 as revised in May 2008, the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008) and the provisions applicable to smaller companies subject to the small companies regime under the Companies Act 2006

Fund accounting

- Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the directors in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity
- Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the directors for particular purposes
- Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor or through the terms of an appeal

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activates when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income

- Voluntary income is received by way of grants, donations and gifts and is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable. Grants, where entitlement is not conditional on the delivery of a specific performance by the charity, are recognised when the charity becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant.
- Donated services and facilities are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included in these accounts.
- Investment income is included when receivable
- Incoming resources from charitable trading activity are accounted for when earned
- Incoming resources from grants, where related to performance and specific deliverables, are accounted for as the charity earns the right to consideration by its performance

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 2011 - CONTINUED

1 Accounting policies - continued

Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates.

- Costs of generating funds comprise the costs associated with attracting voluntary income
- Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.
- Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity and include the accountancy fees and costs linked to the strategic management of the charity
- All costs are allocated between the expenditure categories of the SoFA on a basis designed to reflect the use of the resource
