DIRECTORS' REPORT

The directors present their annual report and financial statements for the period from 2 April 2011 to 30 March 2012

ACTIVITY

The company's principal activity through the period of these financial statements up to the first quarter and prior has been to interview visa applicants in Jamaica and prepare and submit the necessary documentation to the UK Borders Agency to support these applications. From the end of the first quarter of the financial period onwards the company's sole activity focused to act as a labour pool to supply personnel to other group companies.

RESULTS OF BUSINESS

The profit after tax of the company for the period amounted to £41,497 (2011 – Retained Profit of £57,398) As a result of this and translation exchange movements, the company's profit and loss account carried forward is a deficit of £8,061,177 (2011 - £8,102,674 deficit) No dividend is proposed (2011 - £nil)

REVIEW OF DEVELOPMENTS AND FUTURE PROSPECTS

The company ceased offering visa application services in Jamaica as of May 2011 via an office. The company's lease has ended and the majority of staff made redundant. Going forward the company will operate solely to provide labour resources to other group companies. The company shall be reimbursed by another group company for the resources it provides.

The Directors' Report has been prepared in accordance with the provisions applicable to companies subject to the small companies regime

PRINCIPAL RISKS AND UNCERTAINITIES

In relation to the period for which these accounts have been prepared, the company traded solely with another group company under a subcontract arrangement in relation to a sole customer contract up until May 2011. The company continue to trade solely with the same group company for provision of labour resources. Further details are given in note 1 to the financial statements with regards to the going concern assumption.

GOING CONCERN

The directors have a reasonable expectation that the company and the group have adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements. Further details regarding the adoption of the going concern basis can be found in the statement of accounting policies in note 1.

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The particular accounting policies adopted are described below and have been applied consistently in the current and preceding period

Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards

Going concern basis

The company's business activities, together with the factors likely to affect its future development, principal risks and uncertainties, performance and position are set out under the Director's Report

The company meets its day to day working capital requirements through a combination of intercompany loans from parent and other group companies

The company's revenues mainly arise from a transfer pricing subcontract services agreement with another group company. The current agreement continues until May 2012. The company has net current liabilities at the period end of £156,407, which arise as a result of amounts owed to group companies of £370,935. Assurance has been given by the parent company in the form of a letter of support that it will continue to support the operations going forward by way of intercompany funding.

The directors have a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.

Turnover

Turnover represents costs recharged to another company in the same group, CSC Computer Sciences Limited, for subcontract services in relation to a customer contract

Fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost, net of depreciation and any provision for impairment

Cash flow statement

Foreign currency translation and balances

The company has a branch in Jamaica The net investment method for translating the assets and liabilities of the branch has been used Exchange differences from the translation are taken to the statement of total recognised gains and losses

Foreign currency transactions have been translated at the average rates ruling at the dates of the transactions except where the transactions were covered by a forward contract in which case the transactions have been translated at the rates ruling under that contract. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies at the balance sheet date have been translated at the exchange rates ruling at that date. Any exchange differences are taken to profit and loss

Current taxation

Current tax, including UK corporation tax and foreign tax, is provided at amounts expected to be paid (or recovered) using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Deferred taxation

Deferred taxation is provided in full on timing differences that result in an obligation at the balance sheet date to pay more tax, or a right to pay less tax, at a future date, at rates expected to apply when they crystallise based on current tax rates and law. Timing differences arise from the inclusion of items of income and expenditure in taxation computations in periods different from those in which they are included in financial statements. Deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is regarded as more likely than not that they will be recovered. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are not discounted.

In the opinion of the directors, the company's activities, as described in the Directors' Report, can be regarded as a single business segment
